League Banquet Details. The restaurant chosen for the June 27th banquet is the Old Prague at 5700 W. 22nd Street in Cicero. The cost of the meal including tax and tip is \$3.00 per person. The meal will be served family style and will include fruit cocktail, beef, chicken, or fish, vegetable, potato, coffee, and Koláckis. Wine or cocktails will increase the cost per person (by 50¢ at most). The banquet committee has not yet decided if it will include either of these extras; those of you who are attending and prefer a drink should call me and indicate your preference.

The banquet program will include the presentation of 4 trophies to team and club winners and runners-up and a showing of chess movies. The movies are as follows: "Chess Fever" Russia, 1925 (silent) - 15 minutes. A comedy about a chess addict during the 1925 International Chess Tournament in Moscow with scenes of tournament play and Jose R. Capablanca, world's chess champion at that time. "The Passionate Pastime" U.S.A., 1957 (color, sound) - 28 minutes. An art film tracing the history of the game of kings narrated by Vincent Price.

Chess Movie. The Chicago premiere of the film, "8 x 8", will be shown at the Roosevelt University Film Society at 6:15 and 8:30 on May 14. This is an 80 minute color film produced by artist Hans Richter. It is described as a "poetic drama, a bizarre comedy", "an uninhibited chess sonata in which living chess pieces, played by famous artists, enact lives of their own."
