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Activities Committee

As a result of the recent survey sent to all clubs, the Activities Committee has decided upon three events for the year 1962 - 1963.

1. Chess instructions by former U. S. Open Champion, Mr. Albert Sandrin. The first session will be held on Monday, October 15, 1962, from 7:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M. at Stewart-Warner Electronics, 1300 North Kostner Avenue, and if the response is large enough to warrant a continuance, an additional five sessions will be arranged at a fee of \$4.00 for the six sessions. At the first session the group will decide if an earlier starting time, such as 6:30 P.M., will be more convenient for everyone concerned. Mr. Sandrin holds a master's rating and has been the most successful chess instructor in the Chicago Area in recent years. These classes will be a good opportunity for anyone wishing to improve on his game rapidly. All representatives in the Chicago Industrial Chess League are asked to submit the names of their respective club members who wish to participate to Mr. Hugh Williamson (Albany 2-1000, Ext. 223) by October 12, 1962.
2. A simultaneous exhibition with a U. S. Master, to be co-sponsored with Western Electric Company. Mr. George Koltonowski is the first choice and has already been contacted.
3. A Swiss Tournament on two week ends probably in April. This event will be worked out in greater detail at a later date.

1. P-K4	P-QB4	(a)	In this position Black can choose between exchanging the Queens himself or letting White do the exchanging after 13....P-QN3. Black should not evade the exchange with 13...Q-N3? because of 14 N-R4. After 13...P-QN3; 14 QxQ, PxB White may play 15 P-QR3 together with 16 R-Q2. In this way White protects his NP from the side, while he keeps Black's KB off his QN square.
