Problem No. 11 by W. K. Wimsatt, from Chess Review, December, 1937.

- 1 P-B3 B-N4, K6, Q7 or B8, 2 N-Q3, any 3 N-K1, K5 or B4
 B-R7, N6, Q3, B2 or N1, 2 NxP, any 3 N/3-Q2 or Q4
 B-K4 2 N-K6 K-N5 3 N-N5ch; 2--- K-R6, 3 N-B4ch
 P-R4 3 N-N5; 2--- B any 3 N-Q4 or B4
 P-R4 2 N-K4 any 3 N/1-Q2 or R2

Problem No. 12 by M. Towbin and H.J. Herzfeld, from Dresdener Anzeiger, 1929.

The main idea 1. K-R8? (2. P-N8/Q mate) fails on 1...B-N8ch if White Executes this main idea immediately. Although the preliminary manoeuvre 1.Q-R8ch, QxQ will eliminate this obstacle, it creates a new obstacle in the main idea 2.K-R8, namely 2...Q-QR8. This can be eliminated by another preliminary idea: 1. Q-R7!, R-QN7 2 Q-R8ch, QxQ 3 K-R8, etc.
