LEAGUE BANQUET - JUNE 9, 1967

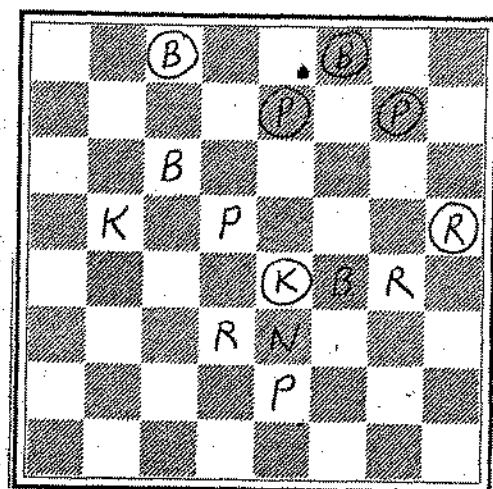
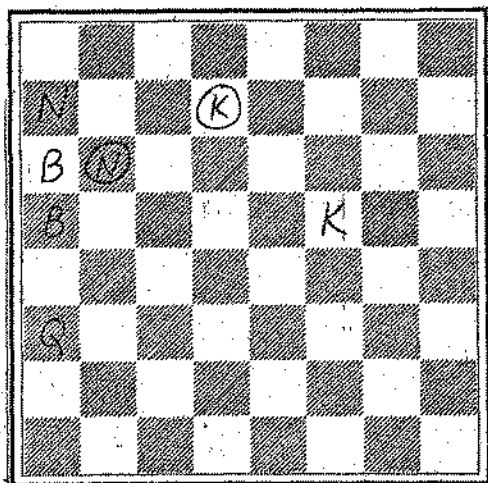
