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BELL & HOWELL BOWS OUT

Regrettably, we must announce that Bell & Howell is withdrawing from League competition because of inability to round up a full team regularly. This team, like Perma Power, has had a checkered career in both the Senior and Junior Divisions. Unlike Perma Power, however, Bell & Howell still has a good number of chess players on the payroll, so we hope that interest can be built up again and the team can re-enter in the future. In the meantime Bell & Howell team members are encouraged to apply for membership in the Alumni-North team.

According to our rules, the results of Bell & Howell's two matches will stand, and the rest of their opponents will receive forfeit-win match points.

AMOCO AND PROCON ARRIVE

As a result of Bell & Howell's demise, Steve Schwartz contacted Pete Gawron of Universal Oil Products' subsidiary, Procon, and arranged for his team to enter the north section competition of the Junior Division. Pete's phone number (Des Plaines) is 827-7777 Ext. 381.

Meanwhile John Greczek of Amoco in Naperville called Frank Tegel and entered a team in the Senior Division. John's number is 420-5602.

In each case the Chairman polled his team captains and received a majority acceptance of the applying teams. The new team captains have been informed of the dues requirement and will submit their checks to the Treasurer in the near future. Rules and sample bulletins have been sent to both companies and revised schedules will be published by the respective Chairmen.

MIHAILOVICH MAKES THE NEWS

Stan Ockers submitted a clipping from the November 4th issue of the Joliet Herald-News covering one of our most illustrious members, Slavko Mihailovich. The article included a large picture of Slavko and his wife and was entitled, "He Likes Thinking Challenge of Chess". An attempt was made to get extra copies of this article for distribution, but none were available at the newspaper office. Since the item is printed on green paper, it is difficult to reproduce.

At any rate, here are some excerpts from this interesting article:

"Mihailovich of ... Lockport held a simultaneous chess demonstration at the Romeoville Chess Club ... when he played 10 opponents at once. Mihailovich won eight games and lost two ... 'I started playing chess about 30 years ago when I was in Belgrade Law School ... Then the war between Germany and Yugoslavia started. I went into guerilla fighting in General Mihailovich's army (no relation) against the Nazis and Tito. In 1944 I was captured by Germans and transferred to a German prisoner of war camp ...' Mihailovich lived in German displaced persons camps until he came to the United States in 1950 ..."

"More young people should play chess, especially those of high school age. It helps in mind-exercising and in improving concentration. It's good for thinking.' ... Mihailovich is employed as a scientific technician at Argonne National Laboratory. His family includes his wife, Katherine, a son, Robert, 21, and a daughter, Katherine, 17. He's a member of the Romeoville Lions Club, likes to do carpenter work around his home, enjoys movies and reading. 'Political reading is my favorite' he says. 'My wife and I never missed an election. I like to have the chance to express my opinion about things.'"

We are pleased to hear of such special news of our members and play to cover similar news sent in whenever possible.

PLAY-OFF RULES

As prescribed in the League rules, the Junior Division Chairman is responsible for determining a play-off system. After consulting all 14 team captains, Steve Schwartz has developed the following procedure for determining trophy-winners:

A. Determining Play-Off Contenders

- (1) The ArgonneX alumni team and the lower ranked R. R. Donnelley team are ineligible for play-off competition.
- (2) Standings shall be based on match points. If there is a tie in match points between two or more teams for first or second place in a section, game points will decide.
- (3) If a tie still exists between two teams, the team with the majority number of games won ( $4\frac{1}{2}$  points or more) in the two matches between these teams is ranked first.
- (4) If a tie still exists, the team with the larger number of matches won is ranked first.
- (5) If a tie still exists, a weighted match point total will be calculated based on the result of each match and the final ranking of each team. The weights used will be 1 (for a win),

$\frac{1}{2}$  (for a tie) and 0 (for a loss). The ranking of the top team will be 7 and of the bottom team will be 1. If two teams are tied for first, they will each have a ranking of  $6\frac{1}{2}$  for purposes of this calculation. For example, a win over the seventh place team is worth one weighted point, while a win over the sixth place team is worth two weighted points. A tie against the fifth place team is worth  $1\frac{1}{2}$  (product of 3 and  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) weighted points.

If three or more teams are tied in matches won and games won, the same ordering of tie-break rules is used.

B. Determining Play-Off Winners (Semi-Final Matches to be played by May 15th)

- (1) If a semi-final or final round match ends in a tie, a second match of four games is played switching colors on all boards.
- (2) If this second match also ends in a tie, the team with the larger number of match points is declared the winner.
- (3) If a tie still exists, game points are used.
- (4) If a tie still exists, a weighted match point total is used.
- (5) If the consolation match between the two unsuccessful semi-finalists results in a tie, two third place trophies will be awarded.

Although there were some thorny problems in formulating an equitable play-off procedure, it appears that Steve has done a thorough job and has a workable scheme. If ArgonneX lives up to its expected performance, we visualize an interesting post-season Super Bowl between the champion team and ArgonneX (which is not eligible for trophy play-offs). To help accomodate this, we are planning the awards banquet for June 18, 1971.

RATING SYSTEM EXPLAINED

Ever since the Junior Division entered the C.I.C.L., there have been many questions about the way ratings are calculated and why some players are receiving firm ratings faster than others. At the President's request, Jim Warren has prepared a detailed explanation of the rating procedure. This is attached for your information.

INDIVIDUAL STATISTICS COMMITTEE MEETS

Recently Jerry Kasang of Chas. Bruning held the first meeting of his committee established to summarize historical data on individual performance. The other members present were Alex Pehas, Bob Brauneker, Elaine Long, and Jim Brotsos. Jerry has obtained League bulletins from 1959 onward from Dan Kumro and additional results data from Jim Warren.

Jim Brotsos indicated he was most interested in obtaining the names of players with unusual records of games played or points earned in League competition. He suggested we bypass names of players no longer in the League or at least those

with less than 20 games played. The rest of the group was interested in compiling a complete listing of all players who have participated in the League and their records including board position. This is a mighty task, but we have the data required to summarize the complete history of individual performance since 1959. Jerry still needs additional members for this committee to help transfer reported results onto data collection sheets he is designing. Once these data are posted, they will be key-punched and a computer program Jerry is preparing will allow results by individual, team, board number, or what-have-you to be printed out.

Any volunteers willing to spend a couple of nights on this project should call Jerry at 255-1900 Ext. 298. Also, anyone from Illinois Bell Telephone, Chicago Title & Trust, Western Electric, First National Bank, or Motorola, who has his team's match results for the first two seasons ('57-'58 or '58-'59) should send copies of these to Jerry.

Yefim Geller of the Soviet Union is in second place with a record of 12-6. The top six contestants in this tournament and the two seeded entrants, Viktor Korchnoi and Tigran Petrosian of the Soviet Union, will play a series of three elimination matches in 1971 to determine a challenger for the world title. The winner will then play Boris Spassky of the Soviet Union a 24-game match in 1972 for the world championship.

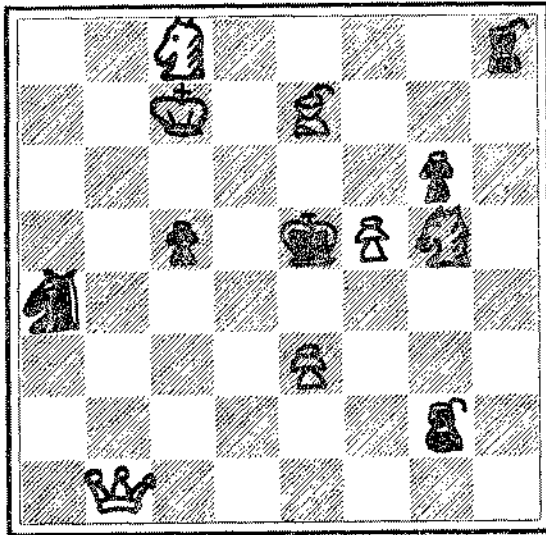

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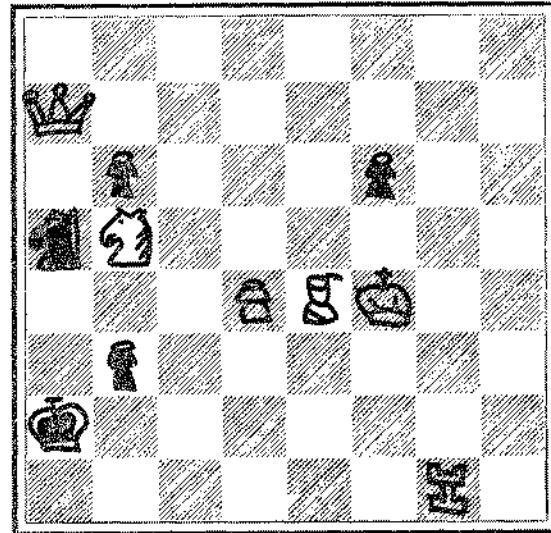

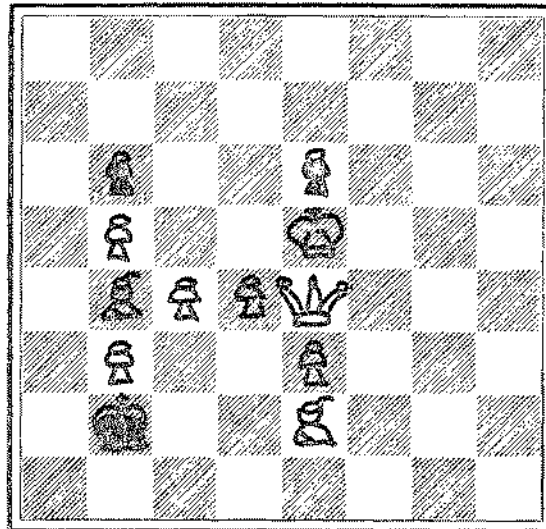
