MEET THE OFFICERS:

For those of you who do not know the newly-elected officers the following thumbnail sketches are presented:

Frank Tegel - Chairman, Senior Division

Frank was born in Yugoslavia 26 years ago. Prior to joining Teletype as a lab technician he worked for Sandia Corp. in New Mexico for 13 months. Frank has served as president of the Teletype C.C. for two years. He began playing serious chess in January, 1967 by entering postal as well as over-the-board tournaments. His finest success came in reaching the finals of the Golden Knights postal tournament. He also won the top unrated prize in the Albuquerque Open '67 and tied for the Class B prize in the New Mexico Open '67, Forest City Open '69, and Greater Chicago Open '70.

Steve Schwartz .- Chairman, Junior Division

Brocklyn-born Steve has been a Statistician at Sears, Roebuck for five years. He has been playing chess for 20 years. He lives in Northbrook and is a member of the Gompers Park C.C. and the Glenview Park District C.C. He played in his first U.S.C.F. tournament in January finishing with a 3-2 result.

Ron Dargis - Secretary

Ron has been a Plant Layout Engineer at R. R. Donnelley & Sons Co. for six years. He is President of the Lakeside Press Chess Club and Captain of the runner-up Donnelley team. Ron has played chess for five years. He resides in Tinley Park.


Stan Ockers - Treasurer

Stan started working at Argonne National Laboratory in June, 1968 and started playing competitive chess about six months later. He was Captain of the 3rd place Argonne Knights last year. As Vice-President of the Argonne C.C. he will be responsible for conducting chess tournaments at Argonne. He has already directed two 7-round Swiss style tourneys there. Stan lives in Lemont; he is a member of the U.S.C.F.

Newman Guttman - Problem Contest Chairman

Although Newman is not an elected officer of the League, he will assume an important responsibility in offering a successful C.I.C.L. competitive event. Since he has not played in League competition, he is not well known among the players and deserves a special introduction. Newman Guttman has composed and published more than 130 chess problems, mostly of the type "mate in two moves". Several of his compositions have won awards in problem composing tourneys. Newman is an International Judge recognized by the F.I.D.E. (International Chess Federation). He is a U.S. delegate to the Committee on Composition for the F.I.D.E. and has met with the Committee a number of times in Europe. He is currently co-judge of the 1970 two-move section of the Chess Life & Review problem composing tourney. Newman works for Bell Telephone Laboratories where he is currently offering a problem solving contest. On the following page is a sample of his compositions. It appeared in Die Schwalbe in 1948.
