ANL KNIGHTS & PROCON TAKE TOP TROPHIES

The tumult and struggles are over for another season. The top spots have been taken over by the "Johnny-Come-Lately" team (Procon) and the "Always-A-Bridesmaid- Never-A-Bride" team (ANL Knights). But neither team breezed through to victory. The Knights seemed to be playing in the shadow of the defending champs, the Gambiteers, as the last round was reached. The teams were tied in match points but the latter were  $3\frac{1}{2}$  game points ahead. In years gone by, this would have been enough to assure the Gambiteers the championship, but today a tie calls for a play-off match. The resultant match was a smashing  $6\frac{1}{2}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$  triumph for the Knights and so, after a few years, the traveling trophy is ambling back to the brain bank of Argonne.

In the Junior Division sectional play-offs were required. The two first-place teams, R. R. Donnelley "A" and Procon beat their respective semi-finalist opponents, Rauland and Chicato Title & Trust. In the "final" match a few days before the banquet, R.R.D. "A" managed to draw with Procon. This was quite an upset because Procon had only given up a half match point all season while R.R.D. had 3 points against them. On June 29th the two foes met again, and this time Procon wiped out its opposition, 3-0. (One game was unplayed). Below is a summary of the top finishers.

Frank is known to all local U.S.C.F. members as the tireless promoter, organizer and Tournament Director of many chess activities around Chicago for the past decade. He spoke of his experiences as Team Captain of the U.S. Student Team in International Team Matches.

Also present as the guest of the League was Mrs. Toni Walker of R. R. Donnelley who did such a diligent, professional job of typing this bulletin all season. Thanks again, Toni!

In addition to the formal program two special appeals were made:

1. Walter Elliott asked for volunteers to help in teaching chess to disabled military veterans at Hines Veterans Hospital. Several members signed up.
2. Nikolai Goncharoff made a survey on behalf of Newman Guttman as to how many non-contestants tried to solve the problems published in the bulletin. A dozen or so members responded.

Frank Tegel also made an impromptu speech thanking the retiring President for his efforts this season.

On the whole, the awards presentation went smoothly, the speeches were brief (speed chess got started ahead of schedule) and the tournament proceeded without insoluble problems. Most of the wives were entertained with games or chit chat in the private bar room.

Our Banquet Committee did a professional job of planning the place, menu, decorations, speed tourney, photography, P.A. system, time schedule, results compilation and cash distribution.
