FISCHER VICTORY CELEBRATION

I would appreciate a response from all Team Captains, after taking a poll of their club members, as to the number of people who would be interested in attending the proposed Victory Celebration this summer. Jim Brotsos is the Chairman of this event, and his discription of the event appears below.

The planned celebration is based on Bobby Fischer winning the World's Chess Championship this summer. All C.I.C.L. members and their families are invited. In order to foster goodwill and gain some publicity for our League, the following will also be invited:

Bobby Fischer.
Top 2 or 3 Masters of Chicagoland.
Presidents of the 3 or 4 largest chess clubs in Chicago .
Editors of Chess Columns or Chess Bulletins in Chicago.
ALL USCF officials in Illinois (13 of the 19 are in the metropolitan area).
Any adult who can identify himself as Robert J. Fischer (this is for publicity release purposes; there are no R.J. Fischer's in the Chicago Telephone Directory).

Two dates have been selected (and reserved for us by Irv Rosenfeld). If Fischer wins early, the celebration would be held on August 26 at La Bagh Woods East Shelter at Kolmar just north of Foster Avenue. If the match goes the distance, the picnic would be held on Sept. 16 at La Bagh Woods Shelter No. 1 (north). The latter is equipped with two large fireplaces. These woods can be reached by taking CTA buses to approximately Foster (5200 North) and Cicero (4800 West), a few blocks north of the Elston-Cicero intersection. The event would go on from 10:30 AM until nightfall. Those in attendance would be expected to bring their own food and athletic gear. The League treasury will cover beer, soda pop, ice, and decorations.

The only formal chess event planned at this time would be a Kriegspiel and/or Bughouse (put-back) Chess Tournament. Advanced registration would be required for these variants of chess and nominal prizes would be offered to winners. Team games, relay races, tree golf, and the distribution of name tags will help people to "mix" and get better acquainted. If skittles chess is your preference, bring your own chess set and clock; there are bound to be plenty of takers around.

This type of an event could easily draw a crowd of over 200. It could be a grand social event and a unique opportunity to publicize the C.I.C.L. To be a success, however, a committee of willing workers is required. Some of the jobs to be handled are:

Decorations - purchase & installation.
Advance Publicity and invitations to non-League members.
Registration - name tags, official greeters.
Chess tourney director.
Team game co-ordination.
Beverage supply.
Fireplace duty - if cool weather, need wood and fireplace attendants.
Photography - for the historian's archives.

RULES COMMITTEE

At the Business Meeting this year, a heated argument arose during the discussion of an all 4-Man League. Strong feelings were voiced by both the 4-Man and 8-Man Divisions. Therefore, a Rules Committee was appointed to study the situation and make a proposal to the League. Frank Tegel, Jim Brotsos, and Charlie Ward studied means to improve competition and submitted the report that follows. Each Team Captain should cast his vote for or against the proposals and mail it to your President by June 2, 1972. If either proposal is accepted, it will be placed in effect for the 1972-'73 season, after which a vote will be taken to see if it should become an amendment to the CIGL's Policies & Procedures. Please vote on Proposal I and on Proposal II.

CHICAGO INDUSTRIAL CHESS LEAGUE

Report of the Committee studying means to improve the degress of competition in the CIGL:

The Committee has studied the problems that have been affecting the League's ability to fulfill its objectives of fostering interest in chess and promoting friendly rivalry among member clubs. It was recognized that the interests and objectives of the member clubs necessarily differ, and that any proposals to be made by the Committee must be such that no member club would be coerced into a form of competition distasteful to it. In particular, it was noted that some clubs strongly preferred competing with four-man teams, while others were as strongly committed to the traditional eight-man teams. Therefore, proposals requiring certain teams to compete in eight-man team play, or of requiring others to compete as four-man teams, were dismissed as unsuitable. Also, dismissed on these grounds were any proposals to artificially limit the strength of teams representing multiple-team clubs. It was decided instead to seek solutions to problems within the existing League structure.

The Committee then turned its attention to the Senior Division. The disparity of strength between teams has been apparent for a long time, and it has led to some sentiment on the part of teams perennially low in the standings to leave the Division or the League altogether, due to the improbability of ever challenging for the Division championship. (In the past ten years, only rarely has a team other than ones from Western Electric or Argonne won one of the three top positions in the Division standings.) The Committee has found

PROPOSAL I

The first method is the one we strongly prefer. We propose that:

- (a) The Senior Division teams be divided into two six-team sections, denoted in this report as A and B, based on strength as determined by the Division standings at the end of the present season;
- (b) Each section would compete among itself with a home-and-home double round robin schedule (games between teams in different sections could also be added if this seems desirable);
- (c) Trophies would be awarded to the highest finishers in each section;
- (d) At the end of each season, the highest finisher in section B and the lowest finisher in section A would exchange sections, thus allowing a continuing updating of the strengths of teams in the two sections;
- (e) In the case of catastrophic changes in a team's strength, or for other good and sufficient reasons, a team would be allowed to move to the other section between seasons, in addition to the normal post-season exchange of teams described above. This would require the consent of the League President, the Senior Division Chairman, and any other team which would also have to switch sections in order to preserve the proper number of teams in the two sections.

We recommend that this proposal be adopted on a trial basis for the 1972-73 season. At the end of the trial season, the Senior Division would then decide whether to make this system permanent, or to revert to the old single-division set-up.

The Committee feels that the above proposal is a good one which will re-invigorate the competitive spirit in the Senior Division without a drastic reorganization of the present League structure. We strongly urge its adoption.

PROPOSAL II

Although we favor the above proposal, we have also considered a second proposal which we consider to be feasible and which should achieve most of the goals outlined above. In this scheme, each team would be assigned a handicap, based on the previous year's results, which would be used to determine the outcome of team matches. The handicap would equal 70% of the average number of game points scored by a team during the previous year of competition, rounded to the nearest one-tenth of a point. A team's match score would then equal its actual game score plus the opponent's handicap. Tie-breaking in the final standings would be done using the actual game points scored, as at present.

We feel that this proposal does have the virtue of allowing a much more spirited competition for the championship by all teams in the Division. It does not, however, prevent the extreme mismatches of actual playing strength which occur all too frequently in present play and which has led to some of the current unrest.

PROPOSAL II - Continued

Finally, the Committee considered the Junior Division. It was agreed that the notion of section assignment on the basis of strength is inconsistent with the geographical spread of participating clubs and that the present organization on the basis of geography seems well justified. There does not seem to be any well-established problem of organization that needs alteration at this time, and therefore we have no changes to recommend.

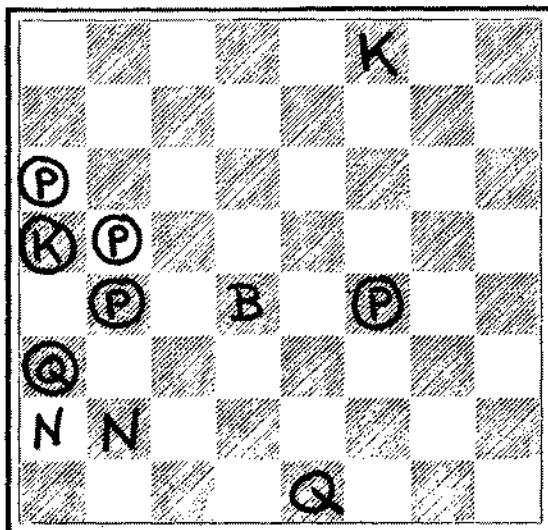

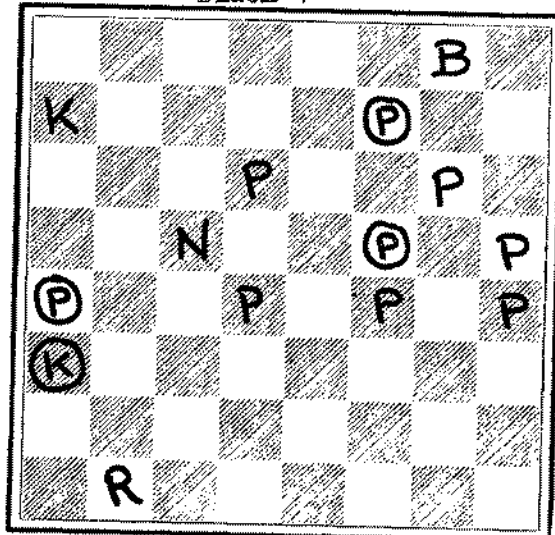

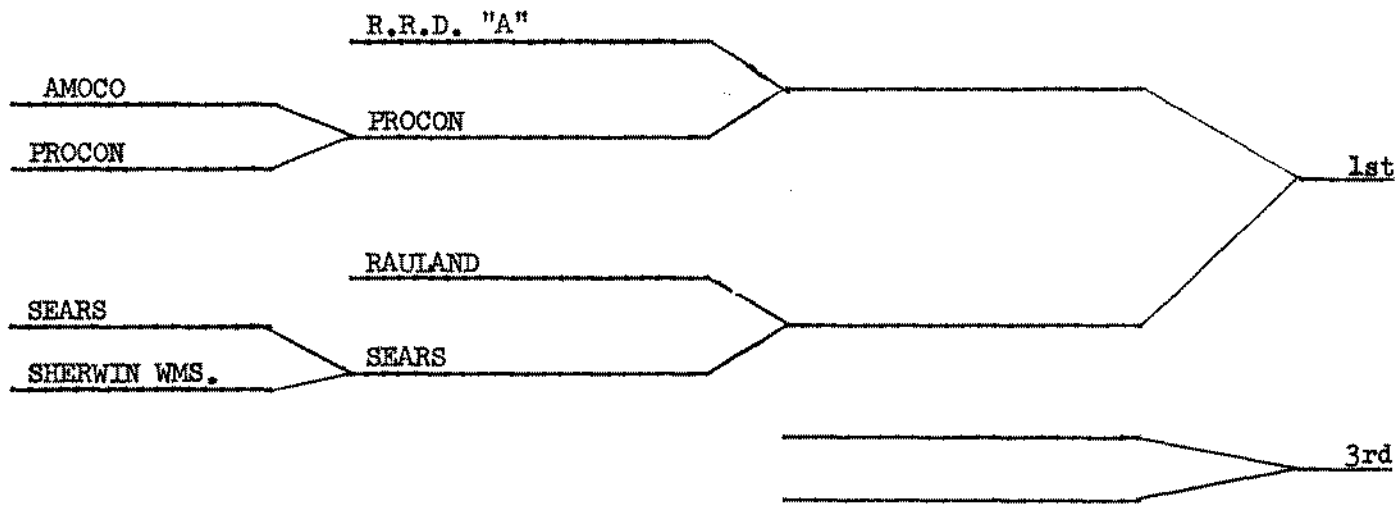
