League Moves Toward Telephone Match

John Greczek has received pretty good assurances from the Amoco Research Center that their beautiful cafeteria in Naperville will be available for use in staging a telephone match between the C.I.C.L. and the Commercial Chess League of New York. The latter was organized in 1923 and now has 69 4-man teams divided into sections by strength. Among its alumni are such chess celebrities as I.G.M.'s Sammy Reshevsky and Arthur Bisguier and Senior Master Walter Shipman. Its President, Matt Pavitt, who proposed this match will be remembered by U.S.C.F. members as the Editor of "Industrial Chess" in Chess Life & Review.

The plan is as follows:

1. Each team will consist of 20 players.
2. The match will be held on a Saturday in February or March.
3. A telephone "teller" of one team will call the "teller" of the other team on a New York-Chicago tie line. These two will introduce their respective teams and then relay moves and replies for all the games.
4. Four "runners" will carry the written moves between the boards they cover and the "teller." They will also punch the New Yorkers' clocks as they reveal their moves to our players.
5. Two Referees will oversee the 20 boards to enforce "Touch Move" and to detect time forfeitures.
6. In order to make a reasonably respectable showing, we will invite only our 30 top rated players to represent the League.

Accordingly, Team Captains are urged to check with players who have ratings of at least 1780 (C.I.C.L. or U.S.C.F.) in their clubs to find out:

1. If the player is interested in playing on one of the following dates:
 February 16 February 23 March 2 March 9 March 30
2. His choice of dates (1st choice and alternate).
3. His choice of time (8:00 AM or 12:30 PM).

This information should be relayed through the proper Division Chairman to the President by January 7. We can then offer our best dates to our New York comrades and fix a date for the match.

If a player rated under 1780 wishes to play on our team, he should express his desire to the appropriate Division Chairman through his Team Captain and should give some reason why he belongs in this select team. We certainly recognize that the rating system is not perfect and that not all of our 1800+ players will take part in this program.

This telephone match does offer a unique opportunity to share in a pioneering venture and to help our respective Industrial Chess Leagues as well.

Did to Shackled Chessnuts?

From time to time your Editor has heard about some of the chess organizations behind prison walls - the Gambiteers of Indiana, the Walled Knights of Pennsylvania, and the Rooks & Crooks of Arizona - come to mind.

Do these chess-playing prisoners deserve our assistance?

A recently-received bulletin from the Cleveland Chess Foundation indicates that they have organized a clearing house for chess donations to prisons. Testimonials support the beneficial effect of chess in raising prisoner morale, aiding in rehabilitation, and reducing prisoner demonstrations. The C.C.F. is asking for old chess books, chess equipment (damaged sets are welcome; the prisoners will repair them), or funds. Money will be used for supporting postal chess, financing the limited program of allowing some convict chess players to compete in tournaments "on the outside," and helping to create a National Chess Program for prisoners with its own bulletin. Persons donating \$5 or more will receive "the super Elite" Chess Bulletin.

The writer suspects that preference will be given to Ohio penitentiaries. Normally, special-interest chess groups are not supported in this Bulletin, but this appeal is unique and could hardly go unnoticed at Christmas time. Checkmate: Self-Inflicted Torture For Those Who Don't Know the Word "Resigns"

A Captain (who prefers not to be identified) has commented about the grim determination of some players to "hang-in there" until they are mated, long after they should have resigned and allowed their opponents to go home. I once witnessed a game in which a player was in time trouble, he was in check, his opponent had two Queens (three if he had wished) to his none, it was very late and he still would not concede. Nothing in the Rules says you must resign and indeed many times it's best to try and salvage a bad position. On the other hand, often it's just not smart to prolong the agony especially when it's late and your opponent wants to get home and get some sleep.

Games Played

Here are a couple of interesting games. I asked Frank Tegel if he would annotate and comment on his game with Art Wang, which he kindly did, and his notes are given here as I received them. Looking at this game it seems like move 16 was fatal for black - it was downhill from that point.

Notes from Frank Tegel:

My 7th move 7. Q-B2 is not covered anywhere in the books. As it happened in our game it clearly leads to a loss of a RP. Whether this is all bad I am not sure. White has compensated for the pawn lost - considerable lead in development. In one of my recent correspondence games, Tegel: Ring (Bell System Tourney) I played 7. PxP, NxP 8. Q-Q2, B-N5 9. R-B1, P-B3 10. B-R4; O-O with great complications.

- A) The move 16...R-K1 leads to serious difficulties for black. White is ready to apply pressure to the queenside with the two rooks and the bishop at K4. I believe black wants to prevent ... B-K4 with P-K4.
- B) The threat is winning the QNP.
- C) Black is in real trouble now.
- D) The move catches me by surprise. There is considerable analysis here but the move gets black out of trouble with a loss of only two pawns and a fair chance of gaining a draw.
- E) It completes the idea of 18 ... P-KN4.
- F) Endgame offered best chances of winning.
- G) I felt taking the QNP versus KNP was better because it offered black less counterplay.
- H) First black is forced to place his rook in front of his queening pawn. White will then go after the KP.

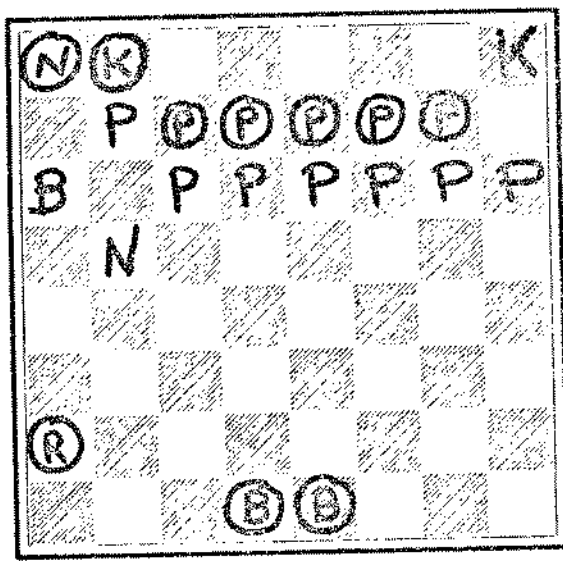

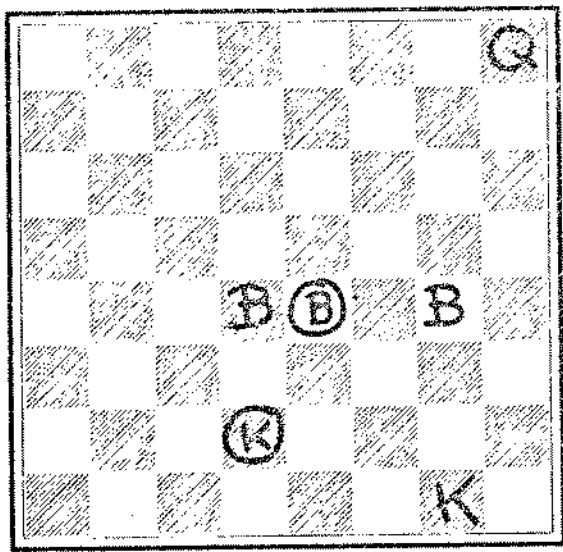

New problems: #6 - mate in 2 moves. It seems that one of the white pawns makes the key move. Which?

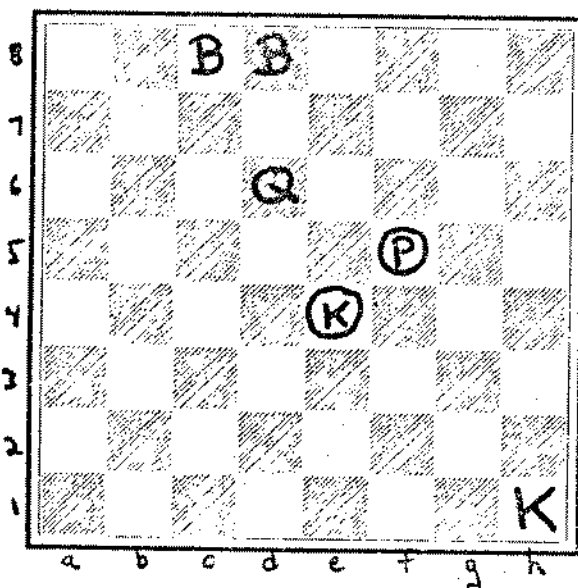

#7 - mate in 3 moves. Solvers need send in only the key move. The force in this problem is nearly minimal, so interest probably lies in "model mates" as described next in "D." I count two models here. Agree?

"D" - mate in 3. This problem is by the master of the model-mate ~~form~~, M. Havel. A model mate is one in which the mating picture shows single guards over each square in the black-king field. All white officers except the white king must participate. In this case, the main variations are:
 1. Qd2 Pf4 2. Bb6 Pf3 3. Qd4 model mate
 .. Ke5 2. Bb7 Pf4 3. Qd5 model mate
 Compare the two mating pictures: they are identical except for vertical displacement by one square. This relationship is called a "chameleon echo."
