0-0 (Contributed by Lee Sheridan - Amoco)

"Touch-move" has created some confusion with regard to castling. To be theoretically correct, you must move the King two square and then place the Rook on the other side of the King. Recent rulings within the United States Chess Federation state that when a player castles by touching the Rook first he must be warned. On subsequent violations, various penalties can be assessed, but "In no case should a player ... be forced to move his Rook only."

Please note that this is not currently the case in the CIGL. An existing written rule in the CIGL states that a player must move the King first in castling. Touching a Rook first means the Rook must move, and castling is forfeited for that move. Castling on the side of the touched Rook is, of course, forfeited for the entire game. This could many times mean the loss of the game.

Argonne Visits Stateville Prison

On January 27 Argonne ventured inside the forbidding walls of Stateville Prison to take on the Stateville "Rooks." Under the title "Inmates Maul Scientists" Greg Berry of Argonne has sent in the following report.

Argonne National Laboratory was defeated 6½-4½ by Illinois State Penitentiary. Although some of us entered the prison with trepidation, our concerns were minimized by the cordial hospitality of the prison officials and the friendliness of the inmates. Lured into a feeling of security we became easy victims for their tenacious and fierce play.

They had a large number of players (22) anxiously waiting their turn to play us. According

Nominations

On another subject, from the vantage point of the Chairman a few words about teams choosing captains for 1974-75 may be useful. Most cpatins do an excellent job. It's not easy. Telephone calls, cancellations, rounding-up their own team, providing facilities and refreshments, officiating, keeping records, etc., etc. They are the backbone of the League and good men are hard to find. For those teams lucky enough to have a choice remember the successful captain will need to have a good knowledge of the Rules and be good at human relations. Otherwise, problems will arise, friction and bad feelings will be generated. Some other captains go all out for their teams and the rest be hanged. That attitude is counter-productive. It is quite possible to be polite without giving anything away. The Rules are clear on what is and is not allowed.

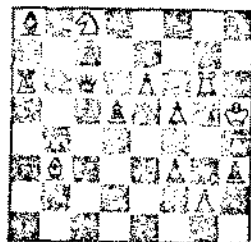

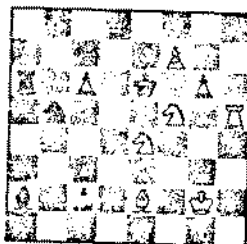
