Goncharoff Wins Industrial Tornado 4-0

With a perfect score, Nik Goncharoff, human dynamo and chess competitor extraordinaire, chalked up another triumph in winning the 2nd Annual Industrial Tornado. Nik topped ten other C.I.C.L. members and 53 other contestants in winning the 1st Place trophy and \$20. His older son, Walter, also demonstrated the Goncharoff chess expertise by scoring 3 out of 4 points and earning the Class C Championship. Other League members who shared in the spoils were Ernie Hollering of VA Data Processing and Lee Stensaker of Signode. Ernie broke into U.S.C.F. competition by scoring 3 points, finishing 11th, and winning the Class E - Unrated Class trophy. Lee Stensaker bettered his result of last year slightly and shared in the prize money for Class D 2nd place. Trophies will be given to the above winners at the Awards Banquet.

All participants carried away a souvenir of the event - a free ball point pen with "Chicago Industrial Chess League" inscribed on it.

This year's tournament moved into the luxurious atmosphere of the new wing of the O'Hare Inn. The roomy, attractive surroundings and smooth proceedings made for a successful tournament with good attendance considering it was a holiday weekend and in spite of unexpected competition in the form of a major chess tournament in downtown Chicago by our friends in the Loop.

Two of our League members participated in the Tornado despite painful injuries. Ainis Mengelis played even though suffering from numerous facial abrasions and a broken nose with 26 stitches. His large nose shield and bandage must surely have obscured Ainis' view of the center of the board and may account for his mediocre result. Jim Warren did his usual competent job as Co - T.D. while suffering with a fractured rib caused by an injury the previous week. (No one would have noticed Jim's problem had his wife, Helen, not mentioned it.)

The detailed results of the tournament are shown on the enclosed crosstable. As suggested for the past year, your President believes that the initial success of the Industrial Tornado warrants serious consideration by the League of replacing the foundering 30-30 Tourney with a second annual U.S.C.F. rated event in the Fall.

Many thanks are due to Jim Warren, Charlie Ward, and Irv Rosenfeld who were the basic committee for this event. Rick Shaff and Lee Stensaker also deserve mention for their help in registering entrants and bringing score sheets, respectively. Perhaps the greatest appreciation should be expressed to our Publicity Chairman, Ken Kellogg. His many mailings of advertising to area chess clubs and individuals certainly must be credited with generating an excellent turnout and keeping the event in the black. The Chief Tournament Director was Jim Brotsos.

Speed Chess Tournament

The names and ratings of all contestants should be submitted to Terry Andresen, the Tournament Director by June 19. Send names to Terry Andresen, Dept. 704-3, Sears Roebuck & Co., Sears Tower Chicago, Illinois 60684 or call him at 875-7973. Names can also be submitted to Bob Micek of Quasar (formerly Motorola) at 451-1200 (X 3006).

Any dinner guest is eligible to play in the tournament, but only employees of current League-affiliated companies will be eligible for cash prizes. The tournament will be organized as follows:

Flights:

This tournament will be split into several flights with 8 individuals per flight. The flights will be determined according to the CIGL ratings. If you do not have a rating and if your captain cannot give you an approximate rating, you will play in the Unrated Member Flight with late comers.

Flight Cards will be color coded for easy recognition for flight groups. These cards should be displayed and will have your name on it. Each individual is to play each member of his particular flight and record the results on the Flight Master Sheet which will be at the Registration Table.

Rules:

1. Each player shall have seven minutes for the entire game.
2. Games shall be played only with clocks equipped with flags.
3. Clocks shall be set with the hands at 5:53, 6:53, 7:53, etc.
4. Players shall stop their clocks with the same hand which was used to make their move.
5. Player's color assignments will be indicated on the Cross Table Master Sheet.
6. Black will choose on which side of the board the clock will be placed.
7. Moves need not be recorded.
8. A player loses if:
  - a) He is checkmated.
  - b) He resigns.
  - c) He makes an illegal move, including leaving his King in check or moving into check.
  - d) His flag falls first, at any time before the game is otherwise ended.
9. The winning player must claim his win by notifying the Tournament Director in cases 8. c) and d) he must immediately stop both clocks and then claim his win.
10. A draw is declared if:
  - a) Stalemate occurs.
  - b) Agreed to by both players during the game (not before and not after the game).
  - c) The flag of one player falls after the flag of the other has already fallen unclaimed.
  - d) A player demonstrates to the Tournament Director that he can check his opponent perpetually (the player's clock must continue to run while he demonstrates the perpetual check. If the claim is found to be correct, the game shall be declared drawn even if the claimant, in the interval, has overstepped the time limit. If the claim is found to be incorrect, the game will continue, unless the claimant

- e) King and Bishop vs. King alone, King and Knight vs. King alone.)
- f) Only one of the players has sufficient material for a possible mate and his flag falls first.
- White shall notify the Tournament Director of a drawn game.
- Draws cannot be claimed by repetition of position since, in the absence of recorded moves, the claims cannot be demonstrated.
- The decisions of the Tournament Directors are final.

### The James E. Warren Award

The Warren Award was inaugurated last year to honor those individuals showing unusual achievement in playing strength or improvement in ability. It also gives recognition to Jim Warren who founded our rating system and served as the Rating Chairman for the first four years of the program.

The award consists of one plaque for the highest ranked player in each division and a League-wide award for the player gaining the most rating points during the season.

To be eligible for either award, a player must have completed at least 60% of his team's scheduled games for the season, including play-off matches. A candidate must have an established rating based on the equivalent of 25 games in the CICL rating system (USCF rated results brought into the League system also count) by the time the last rated match of the season is played.

For the Highest Ranked Player Award, the Rating Chairman will determine the arithmetic mean of each contestant's ratings after each and every official match of the season. In case of a tie, the highest final rating (even if unpublished) will prevail.

For the Most Improved Player Award, the Rating Chairman will determine the difference of rating points between the contestants' ratings after the last match of the season and their ratings prior to the start of the season. The candidate with the greatest gain in points will be considered the winner of the award.

The rating program allows for an upward adjustment if a member's USCF Rating is published at a higher level than his current CICL rating, but this would only be made to a contestant's rating at the end of the season after the Warren Award winners are determined. Also, the upward adjustment would only apply to members with less than 21 rated games at the time that the higher USCF Rating is published.

The Division Chairmen are responsible for reviewing the Rating Chairman's calculations and approving the selection of winners.

This year the top contenders for Warren Awards are Jim Warren, Jim Jackson, Don Wilson (Senior Division), Bill Kenny (Junior Division), and R. and D. Wilson, "Most Improved."

### Century Club Status

The general concept of the Century Club was described in Bulletin No. 8. To further define the program the following guidelines are presented:

1. Only currently active members are eligible.
2. In counting toward the 100 games-played requirement, the following are included:
  - a) All team matches in the regular round robin schedule.
  - b) All play-off team matches.
  - c) All rated team or individual matches sanctioned by the administration.
  - d) All matches in which the League is represented against external teams.

Century Club Status - Cont'd.

- 3 b) Games played at rates faster than 1½ minutes per move.  
 c) Practice matches played with teams showing interest in League membership.
4. Players can apply for membership to the Century Club by presenting evidence of 100 games played such as dated score sheets or old Club or League Bulletins.

The 16th member selected to join the Charter Members listed in Bulletin No. 8 is Jim Brotsos (R. R. Donnelley, Sherwin-Williams, DeSoto, Alumni, and Curtiss Candy).

The functioning committee establishing this program consists of Dan Kumro and Chas. Ward.

U. S. Championship in Chicago July 13th

The leadership of the Chicago Chess Club has succeeded in gaining the right to hold the U.S. (Closed) Championship in Chicago. It will be held at the Chicago Chess Club in the LaSalle Hotel from July 13 to August 2.

The CICL has paid \$100 toward the pre-subscription fund and therefore is entitled to four series passes. These will be raffled off to teams completing the '73-'74 season. Senior Division teams will be given two chances; Junior Division teams, one.

Since no contributions were received from member clubs, the entire \$100 came from the League treasury. This unbudgeted expenditure will naturally leave a relatively puny balance in our account by season's end.
