Registration will be held between 8:20 and 8:45 A.M. The tournament will be a Swiss Style 5-round event which should end by 6:00 P.M. (Determining prize winners and passing out cash awards will take a little longer.) Players must bring their own chess sets and clocks.

This is an ideal opportunity to experiment with your new opening variations, brush up on end-game technique, or get a few chess lessons from our better players.

Results Sheets

Each Team Captain has been furnished with a set of Results Sheets to be used in summarizing the team match results. Captains are reminded that names of players should be accurately & clearly printed on these forms. First names are preferred to initials. Also, the Junior Division Team Captains should be sure to insert the name of the visiting team. The caption for this was inadvertently omitted in the re-typing of the form.

Submit Game Scores

Team Captains are also encouraged to submit scores (records) of interesting games played by their teammates. These should be forwarded to your Division Chairman for publication in our Bulletin.

1974 Junior Division Playoff & Championship System

Each Sectional first place team and runner-up is guaranteed a Sectional trophy. If a 1st or 2nd place team wins a Division 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place trophy, it cannot be awarded an additional Sectional trophy.

The 1st and 2nd place teams in each Section will participate in a 3-round Swiss Style Team Tournament to determine the Division Champion and Runners-up. If more than two teams are tied at these top positions, the following will be used to break ties:

1. Game points record.
2. Results of regular season matches between the tied teams - match basis.
3. Results of regular season matches between the tied teams - individual game basis.
4. Record of matches won - ties excluded.

1974 Junior Division Playoff & Championship System - Continued

The Swiss Style Tournament will be under the direction of the either Junior Division Co-Chairman whose team is not involved in the playoffs. If both have a part in the playoffs, the League President will conduct the event. If his team is involved, the Senior Division Chairman will be in charge.

The Tournament Director will be responsible for determining playing sites, making pairings, and assuring that the playoff matches are completed on schedule.

The tie-breaking system used for this tournament will be as follows:

1. Solkoff System - add up match points of opponents in Swiss Tournament.
2. Match results of regular season (if tied teams have played each other earlier in the season).
3. Solkoff System - add up game points scored by opponents in Swiss Tournament.
4. Add up end-of-season match points of opposing teams in Swiss Tournament.
5. Add up end-of-season game points of opposing teams in Swiss Tournament.

During the playoffs, only the top four board results will count, but all playoff games will be rated.

Eight trophies will be allocated for the Junior Division Team Competition. In addition, the traveling trophy goes to the Playoff Tournament winner.

Difficulties With C.I.C.L. Rules

All players and especially Captains are strongly encouraged to become thoroughly familiar with the C.I.C.L. Rules. If this is not done, problems and disputes will continue to arise. Two sensitive areas appear to be adjournments and time control. Generally, an adjourned game should be completed within 10 days. Since an expense is usually involved, adjudication of an adjourned game should only be necessary as a last resort (e.g., sickness, transfer, etc.).

As far as time control goes, the player who fails to make the allotted number of moves within the time limit, loses immediately providing his opponent claims the time forfeit and can submit a complete record of the game.

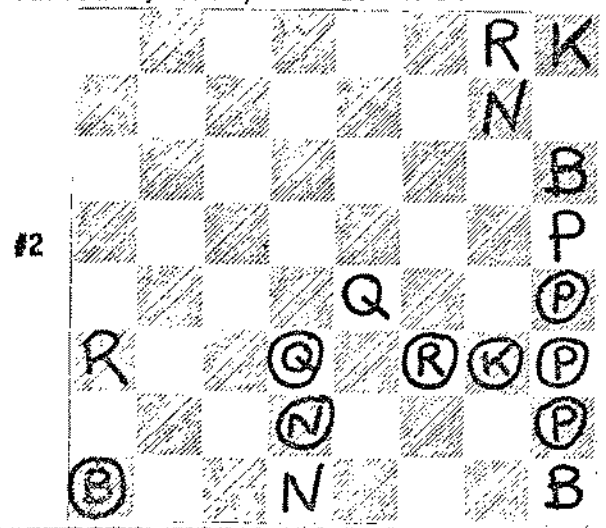

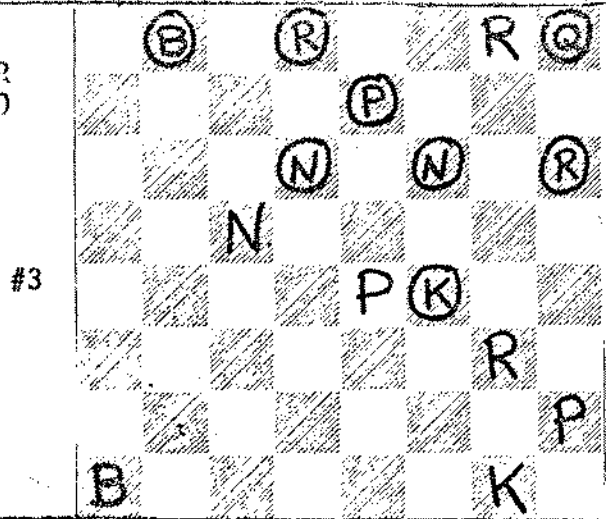
PROBLEMS:
White mates in 2 moves.



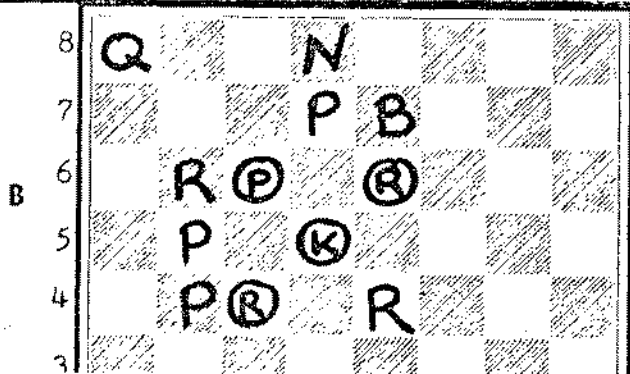
The key does not threaten mate. The point of the problem is that white threatens six mates after the BB is lifted from the board. Each real BB move permits just one of the six to operate.

In discussion sections, I will use the "algebraic" notation which has been described recently in "Chess Life and Review." Each issue of CL&R now prints a fully marked algebraic diagram. To review briefly: each square is defined by letters along the horizontal, and numbers on the vertical. Square a1 is always white's QR1. To illustrate, in problem B, the key is 1.Nxc6 (NxP). If 1...Rxb4+ (RxP+), then 2.Nxb4 (NxR); if 1...Rc3 (R-B6), 2.Rd4 (R-Q4).

DEADLINE FOR SOLUTIONS TO #2 & 3: NOVEMBER 51



B is one of my problems, published in the Danish "Arbejder-Skak" in 1956 (first prize). It is easy to solve, for white is constricted to defeating the unprovided check Rxb4. The key 1.Nxc6 is esthetically poor on that ground. It sets up a dual threat 2.Rd4 and Re5 mate, but consider the action of Rc4. Rc3 forces 2.Rd4 only. Rxb4+ defeats both and allows 2.Nxb4. 1...Rxe4 defeats both and by pinning itself, apparently allows either 2.Qa2 or 2.Pc4. But since support on c4 has been destroyed, only 2.Qa2 works. Lastly, the repeated self-pin 1...Rxc6 allows only 2.Pc4 since 2.Qa2 would release Rc6. No duals actually take place. Play of Re6 strategically mirrors the play of Re4.



* B.4.d. should read as follows:

"Treasurer - The Treasurer will be responsible to the President. He will bill each member club for dues, deposit League funds in a suitable checking account, or if circumstances permit in a savings account, or both; disburse these funds as required, and submit to the President an annual financial statement for publication.
