



senior division report...by rick shaff



Recently, a game was protested on an alleged "touch-move" violation and I was asked to rule on the game result. Upon investigation, the accused player denied quitting the piece until its final square, while the protesting player said the piece was quit momentarily on two other squares. I consulted the rule books and a USCF tournament director on the matter and ruled that the game stood as played, since there was no third party witness to the protested move. In the future, a player claiming such a violation with a denial by his opponent should ask for witnesses. If none saw the move, he may ask a third party to act as an observer or move his board nearer to another game in progress, so that witnesses would be available for the remainder of the game. Even in the chess rulebooks a player is "innocent 'till proved guilty". Perhaps a protesting player should preface his claim with "You have the right to remain silent. Anything you say may be used against you in a protest!"

All kidding aside, it is unfortunate that these situations sometimes arise in the CICL. I assure you that the protest was not treated lightly by any of the parties concerned and that future problems (if any) will be dealt with similarly. Let us all treat chess as a gentlemen's game and continue to enjoy it.

In the "A" section the Dragons continue to lead (the Indian Hill group having a third round victory over IBT). The Bishops and Chargers look like the teams to upset in the "B" section.





(These games are not intended to teach or set an example for anyone. They are presented here for pure enjoyment. Therefore, there is no analysis given nor was there any intended.)

A legal quartum was obtained when 176 Delegates appeared, about twice as many as ever before. Counsel was present to insure that Bylaws changes complied with Illinois law. On Saturday August 16, Delegates met for 10 hours, until 12:30 AM the next morning and then returned for 7 more hours on Sunday, Other meetings included workshops on tournament direction and states and regions, a demonstration of computer pairings, regional meetings, the members meeting, a chess journalists meeting, and an informal bylaws discussion which I chaired.

A. Announcements

- l ELECTIONS: The returns were counted in public during the sixth round of the US Open. George Koltanowski is the new President, having received 244 out of 326 votes. For National VP: Townsend 192, Verber 129. For Secretary: Hyder 213, Dubeck 112. For Eastern Regional Representative: Goichberg 117, Dudley 109, Denker 95. For Western Rep.: Thackrey 229. Mann 89.
- Newly elected Regional Vice Presidents are: I George Mirijanian, II Roland Benoit, III Peter Hopkins, IV James Gates, V Larry Paxton, VI Harold Winston, VII Michael Rice, and VIII Russell Miller. This was one of the highest turnouts in USCF elections since 326 out of 339 eligible voted.
- 2 1976 US OPEN: will be held in Fairfax, Virginia. The Virginians have been working over a year on their bid and their enthusiasm is shown by their having all 8 of their Delegates present at Lincoln (Michigan also deserves credit for getting 10 of their 11 Delegates to Lincoln).
- 3 MEMBERSHIP: On June 30 USCF had 53,588 members, a drop of over 10% from 59,777 a year ago.
- 4 FINANCES: USCF's total income for the last fiscal year was \$ 739,626.26 and its net gain \$ 2,252.93. Financial breakdowns on a series of national tournaments were distributed, as a result of a motion by Paul Shannon (MN) at last year's meetings. The audit contained an unreserved verification of its figures. It costs about \$5 to send CL&R to each member.
- 5 COMMITTEES: All committees expired as the old Policy Board left office. The new Policy Board is expected to appoint its committees in early autumn.
- 6 COMPUTERIZATION: is proceeding on schedule. Eric Bone reported that all USCF members will receive numbers and tournament crosstables with new ratings will be made available. January 1, 1976 is the expected date for full implementation. With computerization, "Operation Feedback" will go into effect to prevent deflation of established players' ratings.
- 7 NATIONAL OPEN: does not have to always be in Nevada. Col. Edmondson announced bids from other states are welcome.

de Sylavo Unanges

As expected, this took most of the time of the Delegates. After a discussion of the principle of member election of Delegates, the idea of direct elections was defeated (47 favored it) and plan #5 adopted as the basis for action. This provides for a three level structure: Policy Board, Delegates (who remain the board of Directors), and Voting Members.

1 PULTCY BUARD: will consist of 8 members: President, National VP, Secretary, Treasurer, Immediate Past President, and three at large members. All serve staggered 3 year terms. The following implementation procedure will be used. The current six members will serve out their terms. In 1976, a Treasurer and one at large member will be elected, in 1977 one at large member, and in 1978 the President, National VP, Secretary, and one at large member. Between the 1977 and 1978 elections the size of the Policy Board will temporarily increase to 9.

The new size was determined by a series of straw votes, after Col. Edmondson announced costs would increase \$1400 per each Policy Board member added. A board of 10 narrowly failed, 72-78, while 8 passed, 80-67. A very close vote determined the additional members would be elected at large rather than by a regional grouping.

- 2 BOARD OF DELEGATES: will consist of 100 members apportioned among the states, 24 Regional Vice Presidents, and the Policy Board members. Thus it will total 130 for next year and increase to 132 after the 1976 elections. Former Life Delegates no longer have automatic votes at the meetings. Delegates will make policy and amend the Bylaws. No proxies are permitted at Delegates meetings and a one third quorum is required for all action. Bylaws may be amended by a majority of Delegates present and voting.
- 3 VOTING MEMBERS: will consist of 300 apportioned among the states, 24 Regional Vice Presidents, the Policy Board members, and Life Voting Members (the former Life Delegates). This will total about 342 for the coming year. The state voting members are alternate Delegates—if they are present and their state's Delegates are absent at the annual meeting they replace the absent Delegates. States also name alternate voting members who serve as additional alternate Delegates. State affiliates must name Delegates. Voting Members, and Alternate Voting Members by November 1, otherwise the Senior Regional VP appoints them.
- 4 FISCAL YEAR: will now end March 31 so that financial reports can be sent out in advance of the annual meetings and, hopefully, a budget be presented at the meetings.
- 5 PARTICIPATING JUNIOR MEMBERSHIPS: On motion of Nike Zacate (IL), effective December 1 Juniors can be USCF members without CL&R subscriptions for only \$2.50 per year (50ϕ affiliate commission).
- 6 COLLEGE CLUB DUES: were raised to \$15 per year, at the request of the Intercollegiate Chess League of America. All other affiliate dues remain the same.

C. Resolutions

- 1 30-30 EVENTS: can now be rated. This passed, 57-50-9, after the members meeting forwarded it to the Delegates.
- 2 NO SMOKING: at the US Open, National Open, US Amateur, and US Junior Open. Proposed by Andrew Margrave (VA), this first passed without a count. Believing opponents of the measure deserved a vote count (which they requested), I moved to reconsider the vote. Finally the no smoking resolution was affirmed by 58-49-6.
- 3 SENIOR MEMBERSHIPS: The members meeting recommended that Senior rates be established. Family memberships will be studied.
- 4 FIDE: Delegates passed resolutions that USA should have more Interzonals representatives and that all players in the Interzonals qualify from tournaments or previous candidates matches (both had been passed by the members last year). A proposal to withdraw from FIDE was overwhelmingly defeated at the members meeting with only one vote cast in its favor.
- 5 FOLICY BOARD MEMBERS AS TDs: A resolution of Fred Townsend (CT) was adopted limiting Policy Board members in directing national and international events.
- 6 CERTIFIED TOURNAMENT DIRECTORS: at all levels must be USCF members.
- 7 RULES CHANGES: Defeated, 53-60, was a motion by kobert Erkes(MD) that all rules changes must be ratified by the Delegates.

D Discussions

I CHESS LIFE & REVIEW: Tim Redman (IL), on behalf of a Region VI meeting, proposed an Editorial Board be appointed by the Policy Board which could include Policy Board members. Delegates differed on whether CL&R appealed to the general chess audience. The plan was tabled on motion of Col. Edmondson and it was stated that the new Policy Board would probably establish a committee on CL&R.

Editor Burt Hochberg suggested "purely local" events be dropped from the Here & There section and more coverage go to events of national and regional importance. Denis Barry (NJ) insisted all state championships get coverage. Wesley Koehler (KS) wanted Here & There on successive pages.

2 INDEMNIFICATION OF OFFICERS & DELEGATES: A resolution was distributed but on motion of Lackland Bloom (MO) action was postponed for a year to permit further study.

A NOTE ON PROCEDURES: A statement was circulated providing for 3 minutes per speaker, alternating speakers on different sides of issues, and limiting persons from speaking more than once on a motion. I think these guidelines were helpful but I hope certain other procedures will not be used again. Apparently the financial workshop was not held; I feel it should be scheduled before the Delegates meeting if possible, and, in no case more than one day after the Delegates meetings. A "no debate" rule was adopted at one point which led to many important items being tabled such as the report of the States and Regions Committee. Limiting debate is far preferable to cutting it off altogether. A "no amendment" rule, adopted at another point, prevented compromise on some key issues.
