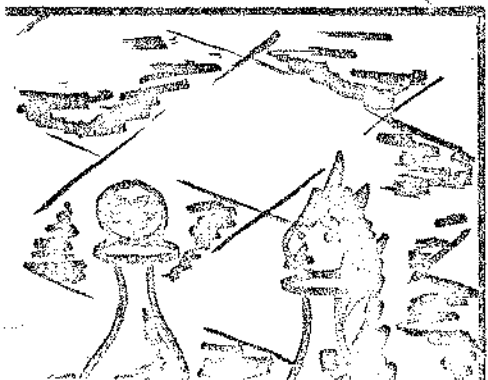

## *senior division report...by rick shaff*

I would like to mention the policy on board forfeitures as stated in the CIGL rules (II B). "A team's privilege of starting games in the absence of a player...will be withdrawn...if two such occurrences of such forfeits are reported." This rule stands in conjunction with (II C): "Forfeit losses will occur from the bottom board upwards." Several teams have already had an occurrence in the first round. Team captains should be aware that the rules can work for you or against you. After the second occurrence of upper board forfeits by an opposing team a captain may insist that only those opposing players actually present at the end of the grace period be listed on the lineup, absentees and forfeits at the bottom.

Please remember to include the player number (see CIGL Bulletin #9, 1975) on the result sheets. This saves your division chairman or rating chairman some time and speeds up the whole procedure.

It's too early to pick odds, but the Dragons and Rooks in the "A" Section, and the Chargers and Bishops in the "B" Section have shown good form at the starting gate. IBT squeaked by the King's Indians as the Western team now wants to be called.

A poll of Senior Division team captains has resulted in a different procedure for listing lineups on result sheets. Previously, the home team captain listed his players first, allowing the visiting team captain to adjust his players board positions according to judgement. A team captain mildly protested this practice and proposed an alternative which passed 7-1; a majority of teams (which could be reached). Effective upon receipt of this CICL Bulletin, captains are asked to prepare a separate sheet of paper with the lineup to be used. Captains will then exchange lineups and transfer names to the result sheet.

Note the discussion on upper board forfeits elsewhere in this bulletin. If a team's forfeit privilege has been withdrawn, role may be called as names are put on the result sheet and absentees dropped to the bottom. Failure to comply could result in all boards below an absentee's board forfeit if protested. Latecomers should play the highest board available if the forfeit privilege has been withdrawn.

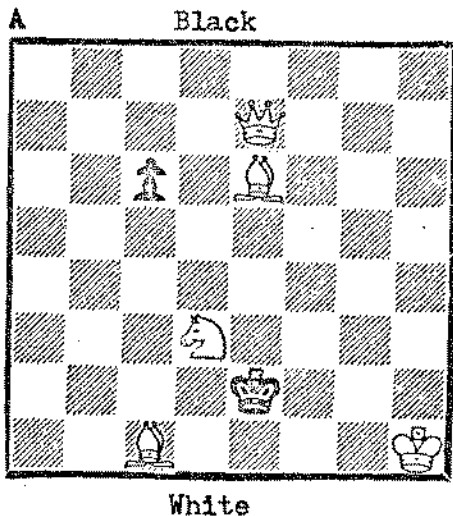

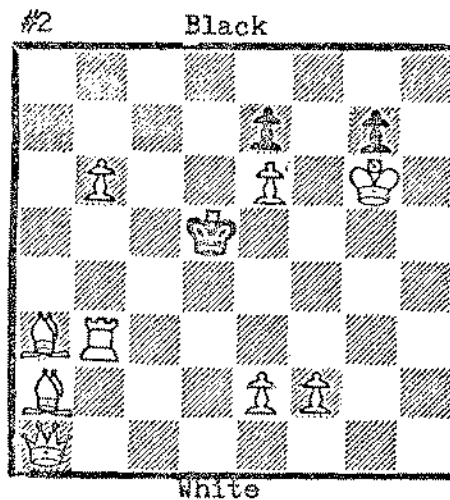
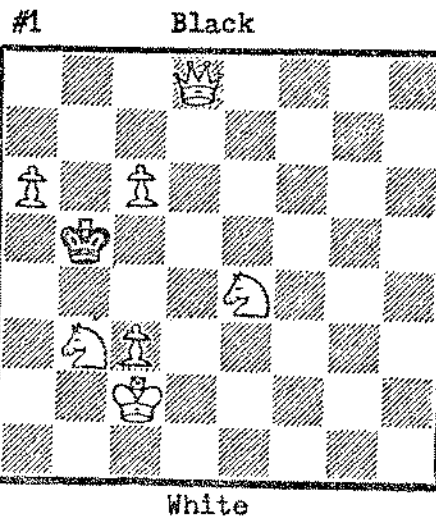
After a truncated solving year 1974-1975, we are back for 1975-1976. I hope to hear from our old-timers as well as newcomers. Our prizes last year were meant to be non-competitive - we awarded certificates to those who scored 75% or better. This year, our treasurer says we can be more generous - we can award three trophies as well as the certificates. The trophies (probably relatively modest) will go to the three top scorers, and certificates proclaiming "Distinguished Chess Problem Solver" will go to those making the 75% cutoff. I may have to resort to a tie-breaking mechanism for the trophies.

The certificate winners last year were: D. Wilson (100% correct), C. Buckner, B. Olson, J. Warren, and W. Sloan. I was able to present three at the June Banquet, but I am still holding certificates for Olson and Sloan, whose addresses I don't have. Will they please let me know where they are.

What are the ground rules? Unless otherwise told, solvers need send only the first move of the solution, i.e., the "key". All problems are "direct mates", i.e., white moves first and mates in the prescribed number of moves against black resistance. White moves up the diagram. Since the editor expects to publish in the first week of a month, I will normally set the deadline accordingly. But if there are publishing delays, I will not stick to the deadline. The main thing is that I should get your solution before you read it.

Here are some suggestions to solvers, especially new ones. Double check (no pun) your solution before sending it in. Verify that white can meet every black move. If your tentative solution checks black or captures a black officer, you are almost certainly making a mistake. It is possible, of course, that a problem is invalid, perhaps by a mistake in the diagram. Invalid problems will not count in the competition.

To help newcomers, I am giving "A" as an illustration. Notice that as the pieces lie, if

black has the move, the king has four "flight squares". For two of them, white is ready to pounce: 1...K-Q8; 2.B-N3 mate, and if 1...K-B8; 2.B-R3 mate. The solution is 1.Q-B5! Now all of black's moves are covered; notice, though, that the mates after ...K-Q8 and ...K-B8 differ from those "ready made" ones. Further study of the position will reveal that 1.Q-N4 is almost a solution. What black move defeats it? Even if Q-N4 is not a true solution, notice that the mates after ...K-Q8 and ...K-B8 are different yet again.

The problems for solving show the same "theme": a "star" pattern of four flight squares for the black king. Deadline - November 5.
