In this year's Industrial Tornado, Frank Tegel won the trophy for best performance by a CICL player. Tegel, who plays for Teletype, also joined the Century Club this year, as did Mark Peterson of Argonne and Vern Stamm of Western Electric. The Century Club consists of those players who have played in at least 100 league games. Nik Goncharoff of Motorola became the first player to participate in 200 games.

Business Meeting

April 18, 1978

The meeting was called to order at the Standard Oil Research Center by President Greg Berry.

The minutes of the previous meeting of August, 1977 were accepted as written and as published in the CICL Bulletin.

Doug Anderson presented a Treasurer's report showing that the League's current balance is a surplus of \$797.52, although this is not the year-end balance, and many major expenses are still to come in, particularly those from the banquet. In response to a question, Doug stated that he did not know how to compare this status directly with last year, although last year's total expenditures were some \$915, to be compared with \$1006 of income already received this year.

It was also announced that the annual banquet cost will be \$7.20 per person, less than in some previous years. The banquet will be held at Nielsen's Restaurant, 7330 W. North Ave., Elmwood Park. The guest speaker will be Dick Verber, past president of the Chicago Chess Club and one of the highest rated players in the Chicago area.

This amount would later be applied as a credit for the purchase of banquet tickets by that team at the end of the season. The motion was approved by a vote of 8-3.

As there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

Notes by the winner.

In CIGL Bulletin, Vol. 21, No. 2, the famous game in appeared in which U.S. Champion Frank Marshall unveiled his attack against the Ruy Lopez. It has often been said that chess develops patience, but Marshall discovered his sacrificial attack and then waited eight years just to unveil it against Jose Raoul Capablanca -- this has to be the ultimate in patience. I have long been a fan of the Marshall Attack and fortunately get to play it more often than once in eight years.

Sometimes a game chess moves along at a quick pace, and when the battle is over only an hour or so has slipped by. There can be several reasons for this -- a favorite television show later in the evening, a winter storm brewing or perhaps both players are just in a hurry to get the games over, win or lose. Sometimes, however, the reason is that each player's moves quickly and confidently because he believes he is winning. This is apparently what happened in the following game: I used 16 minutes, while my opponent consumed only 13. Fortunately, I was right this time, and my opponent was wrong.
