The Argonne Pawns beat Fermilabs in round ten to advance into a playoff for second place with the Argonne Rooks. The playoff match was a tie but the ANL Pawns advanced to the championship playoff on tiebreak points. It is interesting to note that the same thing happened in the North Division with a tie for second place at the end of the season followed by a tie in the playoff match. In the North Division, Kemper advanced to the championship playoff using a different tie break system. If the North Division used the same tiebreak system used by the Far West (the one used in this year's championship playoff), Teletype would have won on tiebreak points. Therefore, I would like to take this opportunity to suggest that we adopt a new CICL rule which provides for a tie break system to be used when two teams tied for first or second place in any division end up in a tie in their playoff match. The current CICL rules state that teams tied for a trophy must playoff but there are no provisions for ties in that playoff match. I don't know what kind of tiebreak system should be used but I think we should arrive at one uniform method of breaking ties before we have the same situation occur again.

After reviewing all of the game scores for the entire 1978-79 season, I have compiled a list of the most valuable players in the Far West Division. The list is shown below:

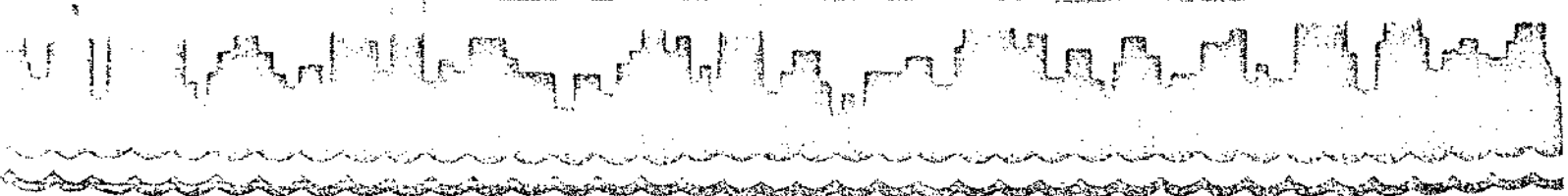

1. The meeting was called to order by President Jim Sobun. In the absence of Treasurer Doug Anderson, Jim presented a preliminary financial statement for 1978-79. (A final statement would be presented at the annual organizational meeting in August.) The group agreed that Jim should be sure that the financial statement was in good order by the time that the treasurer's duties were handed over to the newly elected treasurer in June.
2. Vern Stamm announced that the annual awards banquet would be held at Richard's Banquet Hall and Ballroom, 3253 South Harlem Ave., Berwyn, on June 22, 1979. (This is not to be confused with Richard's Restaurant, which is located two blocks north.) Banquet tickets are \$9.00 per person. The bar will open at 5:30, with dinner service beginning at 6:30. The League has guaranteed a minimum bar patronage of \$200; if this amount is not received, there will be a \$40 extra charge for the bartender's services.
3. It was announced that the semifinal playoff teams are: Sears Number One, Wheaton College, Motorola, and either Harza or the Western Electric Chargers, depending on the outcome of two adjourned games.
4. The election of officers for the 1979-1980 season then took place. The newly elected officers will take office following the awards banquet on June 22. Results of the election were as follows:

President: Gee Leong (I.T.T.)

Secretary: Charles Ward (Argonne)

Treasurer: Jim Brotsos (EXcaliburs)

Division Chairmen:

North - Lee Stensaker (Signode)

Far West - Joe Brozovich (Western Electric)

Near West - Dan Kumro (Western Electric)

East - Tom Gaffigan (First Nat'l Bank)

All votes were unanimous.

5. Jim Sobun announced that Beryl Price of Wheaton College had agreed to be bulletin editor next season, and Paul Weston had agreed to serve as ratings chairman.
6. The question of publishing a 25th anniversary commemorative book was discussed once more. Response from League members seemed very sparse, and it was agreed that the project would be dropped since it was economically unfeasible.
7. There was a discussion of whether there should be a charge for advertising in the League bulletin. Although opinions were divided as to the legal implications of this, it was agreed that there should be a charge. The new bulletin editor was to check into the legality of charging for advertisements.

8. Next was a discussion of Lee Stensaker's proposal made last fall that every team (as opposed to every company) be required to purchase one subscription to the bulletin each season. It was pointed out that the present policy of charging the actual cost of producing the bulletin ensured that such a policy would not change the cost of a bulletin subscription for a single-company team, since the costs involved did not produce any economies due to numbers of copies produced. This proposal was unanimously defeated.
9. The question of another proposal of Lee Stensaker's regarding residual eligibility was raised, but since Lee was not present and no one else was certain of the exact nature of the proposal, it was agreed to table discussion until the next meeting.
10. Jim Sobun requested volunteers to run the speed chess tournament at the awards banquet. Jim Brotsos, Ken Kellogg, and Bob Motycka volunteered, and it was agreed in addition to ask Frank Conway (Zenith-Glenview) and Ray Lauth (Illinois Bell) to help. Jim will follow up on this.
11. The question of a uniform tie-break system for drawn matches in the championship playoffs and in trophy playoffs was discussed. The consensus of the group was that this was needed, and a committee composed of the four incoming Division Chairmen was to formulate a proposal which would be presented to the summer League meeting. Tom Gaffigan was appointed to act as chairman of this ad-hoc committee.
12. Jim Brotsos proposed that the League should become an affiliate of the Illinois Chess League, at an annual cost of no more than \$15 per year. The bulletin of the ICA would be circulated to CICL team captains, who would share it with their team members. This proposal was agreed to unanimously.
13. In response to a question, it was agreed that Most Valuable Player trophies would be awarded on the same basis as last year. Frank Tegel, who is acting as awards chairman, was to be contacted to ensure that suitable trophies would be obtained, and the Division Chairmen were to be reminded that they should forward the name of their MVP to Frank.
14. It was pointed out that some teams were failing to comply with the requirement that they provide an adequate number of chess sets for their home matches. It was agreed that a notice should be placed in the bulletin reminding team captains of their responsibility in this matter. It was also suggested that if this continued to be a problem that visiting team captains be permitted to claim a forfeit on any board not provided with a set. This proposal was to be discussed more thoroughly at the next meeting.
15. It was suggested that at the August meeting it should be decided that the time and place of the championship match be publicized well in advance so that League members and the general public could attend. It was pointed out that there was still time to implement this this year on a trial basis, if convenient to the home team captain. This was agreed to.

16. It was suggested that performance ratings be added to the rating system, in order that players who had not played enough games to obtain an established rating could nevertheless have a rating that was published in the bulletin. Joe Brozovich stated that he was working with Paul Weston on a ratings program that contained just such a feature.
17. Inasmuch as there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned. (Not mentioned above in these minutes was that the site of this meeting was Albright Gym at Western Electric, in Cicero.)

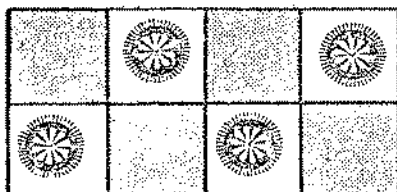

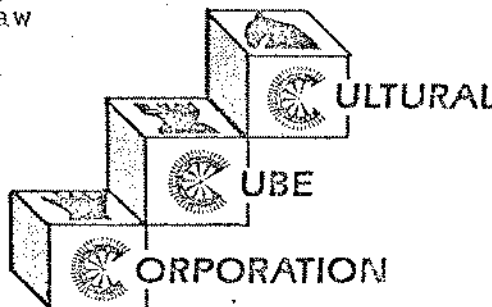
