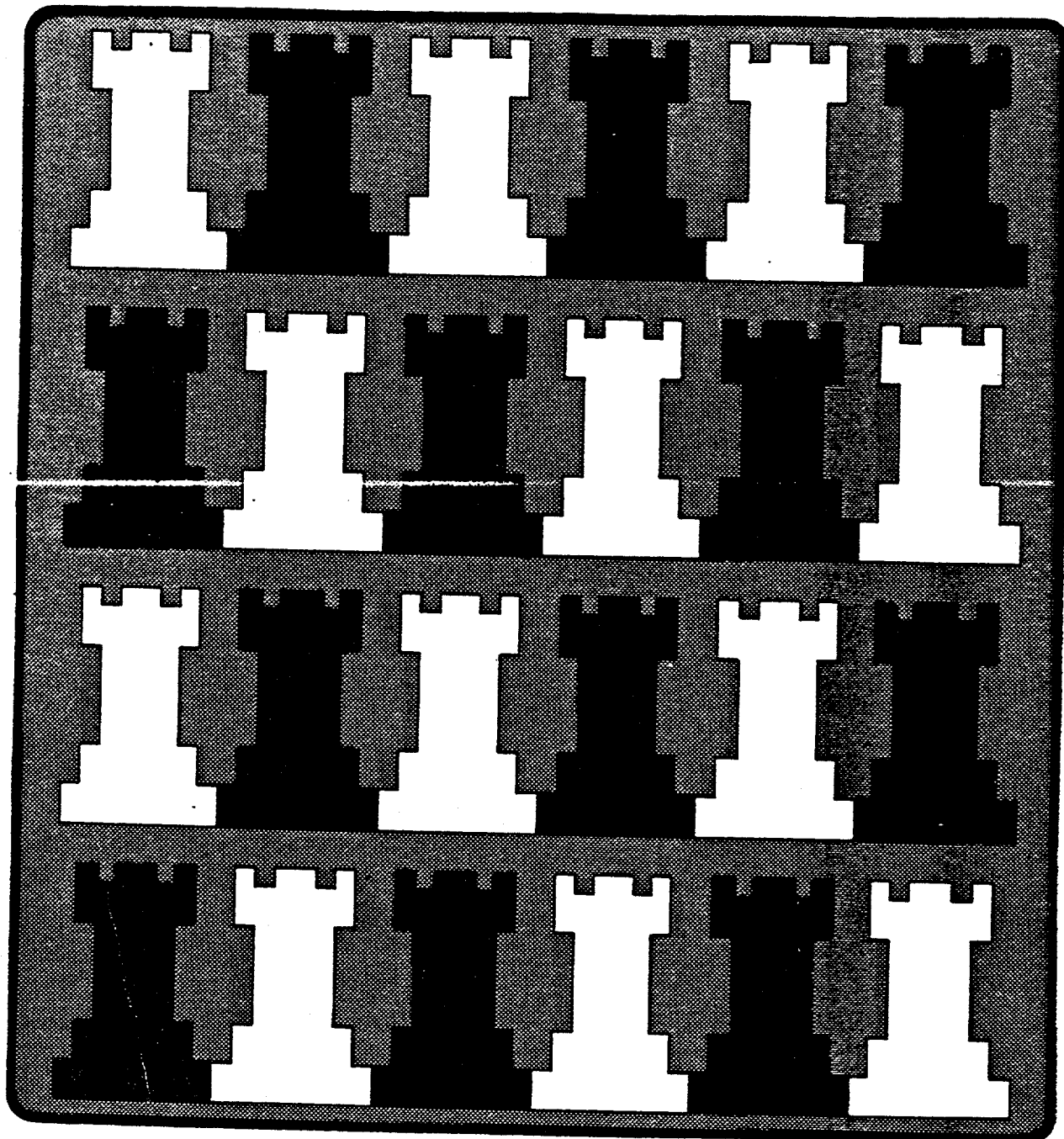

Here is an unusual problem from the June Interface Age. Place WK-e2;WR-f1,c7;WB-b1,e7;WN-a3,g5;WP-a7,c3,c6,d2,d6,f3,g2,h3;BK-h8. Negotiate the Black King from h8 to a1 with as many moves as you like (White does not move). Of course, you may make captures and may not move into check. Try to do it in a minimum number of moves. I'll give the answer in the next issue.

chess news & views

CORRESPONDENCE CHESS, by Hanon Russell, Thinkers' Press, 1980, 183 pp, index of players and openings, introduction diagrams, \$9.50 (PB)

In recent years I cannot recall awaiting the publication of a chess book with greater anticipation. All of which should prove that Peggy Lee was right on target when she mused after the parade had passed, "But is that ALL there is?" Hanon Russell has an established name in chess publication; former works include "The Chessplayers' Guide to Russian" and some notable translation attempts: "Tal-Botvinnik, 1960" and "My Best Games" by Karpov. His correspondence chess credentials rest on his column in The Chess Correspondent coupled with some years in playing the game by mail. It is unfortunate that Russell was not able to couple rigorous scholarship with his obvious enthusiasm for his subject. Let's look closer.

The reader need reach only page 2 before he is confronted with the often repeated fairy tale that Catherine the Great of Russia and Frederick the Great of Prussia played a correspondence chess game between the years 1759 and 1786. The allusion here has been confused with a match mentioned in Dr. Bruno Bassi's brilliant manuscript, cited by Meissenburg, between--not Catherine the Great and Frederick--but between Voltaire and the Prussian monarch! It is inconceivable that Russell would not have availed himself of the deep scholarship of the Bassi manuscript as a primary source, especially since it enjoys quite universal recognition as the single definitive work on the subject of correspondence chess, and rightly so. Yet not a single reference to Bruno Bassi or his work is made in Russell's discussion, though he does mention Meissenburg. The reference in this early chapter to a postal match between Henry I and Louis VI in 1119 from Europa Echechs, 1962, is nowhere documented and must be considered spurious. (That Russell could assume accuracy for an event which allegedly occurred in 1119 from a 1962 reference is much like documenting the contents of Troy's tenth layer by reference to a Victorian drawing of a vase depicting a sulking Achilles.) Indeed, frequent allusions to chess occur in the extant correspondence of Voltaire and Frederick, but nowhere is there any hint that such a game was ever played between them. The cause of Russell's miscue is easy to track, but no less serious for that: he merely repeats an anecdote of St. Amant published in his column in a Paris newspaper in 1858. Why are we so intent that famous people must have played correspondence chess anyway?

There are not, as Russell states, "numerous references to correspondence chess in the 17th and 18th centuries". There are only occasional such mentions during this pre-historic period of correspondence chess up to 1800. What, in fact, Russell may have intended to say is that the few references that DO exist suggest widespread chess by post during this era.

There is little doubt that the "Hague-Breda" match was played between two individuals rather than between two clubs as Russell states. Dyckhoff is Russell's source--a much too late reference to be taken as more valid than the written notes of one of the player's himself, known in fact by name! The culprit was F W von Mauvillon and he was a soldier stationed at the Hague. He actually published the games in question (three of them) some twenty-three years after their completion--a remarkable

display of an over-extended ego considering the quality (?) of the games.

Russell devotes a great deal of space to the Tchigorin-Steinitz match (October, 1890-April, 1891). He calls this a correspondence match as if conducted through the mails. A glance at the dates shows that this was not a postal match at all. Russell fails to mention, or perhaps does not in fact realize, that this was a CABLE match. That little attention has been paid to this match by earlier writers on the subject of correspondence chess is a testimony to their good sense.

The most reliable and entertaining portions of this book are those chapters devoted to the World Championship series and the great Dyckhoff Memorial tournaments. They do not merely make the book worth its price; they rescue it from an otherwise deserved oblivion.

The final chapter of CORRESPONDENCE CHESS cannot be taken seriously. It is a vapid attempt to summarize the history of postal chess in this country and worldwide through FIDE and the founding of the ICCF, postal adjunct of FIDE. Yet Russell fails to trace the stormy and colorful evolution of the very organization for which he writes a column--the Correspondence Chess League of America, the oldest continuing postal entity in this land. Nor does he mention some of the more significant aspects of Horowitz' Chess Review operation which put postal chess into the "big time" four decades ago. Especially unrestful is Russell's failure to mention the work of FIDE president Dr. Rueb, who almost single handedly shaped the FIDE sponsorship of international play. Alekhine merely lent his name to the fledgling project; it was Rueb's all the way.

This reader had hoped for some discussion of postal chess journalism, the role of Horowitz in making this venerable hobby a successful business enterprise by producing good journalism in the field, and the golden years of The Chess Correspondent under the solid, steady editorship of William Spackman.

If Russell is to be taken seriously in the arena of postal chess literature, surely he must try a revision soon. He should start by immersing himself in the scholarship available to him, i.e., a serious reading of the Bassi manuscript, a studied investigation of the bibliography used by Bassi, and at least from the standpoint of domestic correspondence chess, a thorough digestion of the early years of his own publication, The Chess Correspondent. A trip to the White Collection at the Cleveland Public Library, preferably with pencil and pad, would pay astonishing dividends.

Let us learn from the parable of the tenor who performed off-key, forgot his lines, and insulted Puccini with a bad, bad performance. Yet the audience kept bringing him back with applause, "Bis! Bis!" "Again, sing it again!". A third, even a fourth time, they brought him out for the encore aria. A startled tourist asked with amazement why the audience insisted on such repeated cacophony. The old Neapolitan answered with determined honesty, "My friend, he must sing it until he gets it right!"

"Bis," Hanon, "Bis!"

OPEN LETTER TO CICL OFFICERS, CAPTAINS AND PLAYERS



I propose a change in the traditional scheduling of the CICL playoffs; namely, that they be scheduled to take place as a three-round team tournament to be held on a single day at a single place to be agreed upon and scheduled before the league season begins. I believe this system has no disadvantages that the present system does not also have, and that it has a few significant advantages the present system lacks.

First the disadvantages.

1. Where can we hold a tournament that size? You're talking about eight teams. That means at least 48 people.

Western Electric's Albright Gym would be an ideal place. The CICL Tornado has been held there a number of times. There is plenty of room, good lighting, no fee for its use, and it is centrally located.

2. How can we possibly get everyone together on the same day?

By scheduling the day and announcing it a year in advance. Players can write the date on their calendars and keep the date free until their team is eliminated from the playoffs.

3. What can we do if somebody gets sick or has a wedding or funeral to go to?

I don't see an easy solution. If they are sick, they will probably have to miss the playoffs. There is no guarantee that emergencies will not arise no matter when a match is scheduled. If they have a wedding or funeral, they will have to make a choice. These things happen.

4. But that means we may not be able to get out our best line-up.

True. But you can't always get out your best line-up under the current system either.

5. Some players don't want to play on the weekends. They want to spend the time with their families.

We would only ask for one weekend day a year, and that day would be scheduled far enough in advance that family activities could be planned around it. We are not talking about regular season games, but about the playoffs. One weekend day a year should be a small sacrifice for a player whose team has a chance to win the league championship.

6. What about adjournments? We could be there until one o'clock in the morning.

Games could be adjourned if they did not affect pairings for the next round. I have played in a few tournaments with 50/2 time controls, and it is rare for a game to last more than five hours. We could safely schedule rounds to start at 8 AM, 1 PM and 6 PM. If the last round were to start an hour late, we would still be starting at the league's customary time.

The advantages.

1. From the standpoint of strengthening the league, the main advantage is that we will have an event we can sell to the media. Press coverage of the playoffs could get more teams into the league. Of course, there is no guarantee of press coverage, but under the present system we know we won't get any.
2. The playoffs won't stretch into June. They can be finished in late April or early May.
3. The banquet can be held in May. An earlier date for the banquet could improve attendance, because fewer people will be gone on vacation.
4. It will avoid the haggling and split matches that arise during the playoffs because each team captain naturally wants to get out his best line-up. - Because different teams have different preferred nights, negotiating for the match date can be more important than the actual playing of the match. Choosing a playoff date and announcing it up to a year ahead of time will put the focus more clearly on the playing.

All things considered, I believe the advantages of a one-day playoff outweigh the disadvantages, and that we should adopt this system, which, incidentally, was first proposed by Paul Weston several years ago. What do you think?

Meeting of April 23, 1981
Minutes



1. The meeting was called to order at Albright Gymnasium of Western Electric by president Gee Leong. The minutes of the August 1980 business meeting were approved as published in the CICL Bulletin.
2. A report on the League finances was presented by treasurer Jim Brotsos. All teams have paid their annual dues, although several teams were very slow. A complete financial picture was not available at the time of the meeting, since many major expenditures had not yet been made, but the league appeared to be in sound financial condition.
3. There was a discussion of the MVP awards to be made at the annual league banquet. Since the four division chairmen had not gotten together to develop a uniform MVP rating technique as previously arranged, in view of the shortness of time remaining until the banquet the choice of an MVP for each division would be made by that division's chairman, using whatever equitable criterion he found suitable.
4. There was a discussion of the playoff format, in view of the fact that the East Division now had many fewer teams than the North Division, yet each division sent two teams to the playoffs. It was decided that the playoff arrangements for this season should not be changed, but that this problem should be discussed at the summer business meeting, with the view toward possibly making changes for the 1981-82 season.
5. P. Weston presented a sample match score sheet which he proposed to have printed as a multiple-part form and distributed to all teams for use in future seasons. This met with the general approval of the meeting. Paul proposed that these score sheets be part of a standard package of materials to be provided to each team at the start of each season. This package would also include a copy of the current CICL rules. C. Ward agreed to work with Paul over the summer to draft an improved version of the CICL Rules of Match Competition, which form part of the CICL rules, and which would be available for distribution at the August meeting.
6. During the discussion of playing rules it was pointed out that the official Rules of Chess, as published by the U.S. Chess Federation, form part of the CICL playing rules, yet relatively few teams own copies and many captains are not completely familiar with them. It was agreed to require each team to obtain a copy of these rules and to have them available at home matches in the event of a rules dispute.
7. It was announced that the annual banquet would be held on June 19, at the Holiday Inn in Rolling Meadows, on Algonquin Road. The guest speaker will be Tim Redman, USCF Vice-President and international arbiter.

8. Dave Baurac announced that the annual CIGL Tornado would be held on May 9 at Albright Gym.
9. The election of officers for the 1981-82 season then took place. The newly elected officers will take office following the annual awards banquet on June 19. Results of the elections were as follows:

President: Gee Leong (Kemper Ins.)

All votes were unanimous. Gee Leong announced that he had once again accepted renomination, but that he would not agree to serve again following the new season.

10. There was a discussion of the timeliness of the CIGL Bulletin. Part of the problem has been the delays in returning match results from team captains to division chairmen, from division chairmen to ratings chairmen, and from the ratings chairman to the bulletin editor. It was suggested that to help decrease the communications time lag that the team captains should send a copy of the match results directly to the ratings chairman, thus removing one link in this chain.
11. Art Oelhafen agreed to attempt to organize a "bottom eight" tournament at the end of the season, in which the two teams at the bottom of the regular season standings in each division would meet to play off, in a similar fashion to the league championship playoffs.
12. As there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

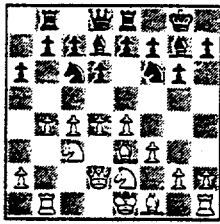

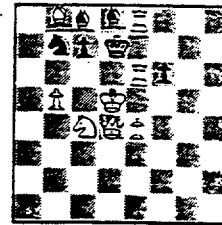

GAMES

By Dave Baurac



Please send games to Dave Baurac, 7517 Country Lane South, Darien, Illinois 60559. If you give notes, you are entitled to a diagram, so be sure to indicate where you want it.

Endgame study -- rook and pawn vs. rook: R. Harringer, Western Electric Kingsmen-D. Green, Argonne Pawns, CIGL, 1981.

This position occurred at adjournment (See diagram 1.), with White to seal. The win is straightforward: get rid of the queens, wins the Pc6, and the remaining rook-and-pawn ending is won. Unfortunately for White, he sealed 1. Qh3??, and resigned without resuming play. The game might have continued 1. ... Qd6+ 2. Rc5 Qd4+ 3. Rc4 Qb6+ 4. Ka3 Qa5+ 5. Ra4 Qc5+ 6. b4 (6. Rb4 Qc1+ 7. Ka4 Ra2 mate.) Qc1+ 7. Kb3 Rb2+ 8. Ka3. Rb1 mate; or 4. Kc3 Qa5+ 5. Kd3 (5. Rb4 Qe5+ 6. Rd4 -- K-moves lose the Q outright -- Rg3+ 7. Qg3 Qg3+, and Black should win, though it may take some time.) Rd2+ 6. Ke4 Qd5+ 7. Kf4 Rf2+ 8. Ke3 Qd2+ 9. Kd4 Re2+ and Black wins the Q after 10. Kf5 Qd7+ or 10. Kf3 Re3+ 11. Kg4 Qd7+.

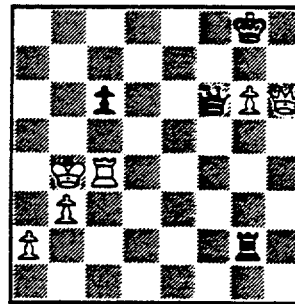

That's why White resigned. Now, here's how he should have won: First, get rid of the queens -- 1. Qh7+ Kf8 2. Qf7+ Qf7 3. gf Ra2 (The f-pawn isn't going anywhere.) 4. Rc6. (See diagram 2.) Black now has three attempts to stop the pawn -- he can put his rook in front of it, behind it or he can try to check from the side. None of them works. The rule that White needs to know is this -- If the white pawn can advance to the fifth rank, with its king near it, and the black king is cut off from the queening file, White wins.

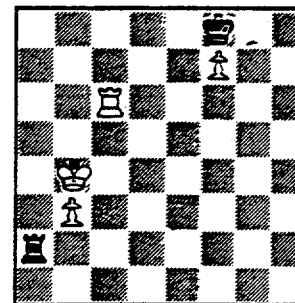


Diagram 2.

For the few exceptions to this rule, see Reuben Fine's Basic Chess Endings, page 292. In most positions, the rule points the most direct path to the win. In diagram 2, the black king is already cut off, so all White has to do is get the b-pawn to the fifth.

First, assume Black tries stopping the pawn from in front: from diagram 2, 4. ... Ra8 5. Kc5 Rb8 (Or 5. ... Kf7 6. b4 Ke7 7. b5 Kd7 8. Kb6 Rb8+ 9. Ka6 Ra8+ 10. Kb7, etc.) 6. b4 Kf7 7. b5 Ke7 8. b6 Kd7 9. Kb5 Ra8 (9. ... Rc8? 10. Rc8 Kc8 11. Kc6 and White wins.) 10. Rc1 Rb8 11. Ka6 Ra8+ 12. Kb7 Ra2 13. Kb8 Rb2 14. b7. (See diagram 3.) Now the black rook must occupy the a-file or White will play 15. Ra1, followed by Ka8 and b8/Q; for example 14. ... Rb3 15. Ra1 Kc6 16. Ra7 Rh3 17. Ka8 Rh8+ 18. b8/Q Rb8 19. Kb8, etc.. So Black must play 14. ... Ra2, after which White wins by 15. Rd1+ Kc6 16. Kb8, etc.

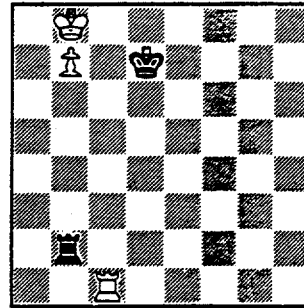

Suppose Black tries stopping the the pawn by going behind it. From diagram 2: 4. ... Kf7 5. Kb5 Rb2 6. b4 Ke7 7. Rc1 Kd7 8. Ka5 Ra2+ 9. Kb6 Rb2 10. b5 Rb3 11. Ka6 Ra3+ 12. Kb7 Rb3 13. b6 Rb2 14. Ka7 Ra2+ 15. Kb8 Rb2 16. b7, and we have reached diagram 3.

Finally, what happens if Black tries to check from the side? Once again from diagram 2, 4. ... Rh2 5. Kb5 Rh5+ 6. Rc5 Rh6 7. b4 Kf7 8. Rc6 Rh5+ 9. Kb6 Ke8 10. b5 Rh7 11. Rc7 Rh6+ 12. Kb7 Kd8 13. b6 and the Black rook must go behind the pawn: 13. ... Rh1 14. Kb8 Rb1 15. b7 Rb2 16. Rc1 Ra2. Black's last move is forced for the same reason it is forced in position 3. We have now reached the Lucena position (See diagram 4.), the single most important position in rook and pawn endings.

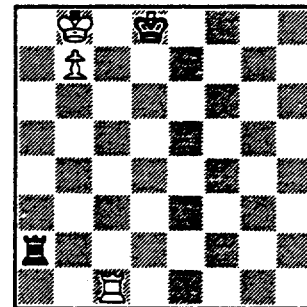


Diagram 4 -- the Lucena position.

White's problem is to get his king out from in front of the pawn and to find shelter from checks by the black rook. He does it by "building a bridge": 17. Rd1+ Ke7 18. Rd4! Ra1 (Black must still guard against White taking the a-file.) 19. Kc7 Rc1+ 20. Kb6 Rb1+ 21. Kc6 Rc1+ 22. Kb5 Rb1+ 23. Rb4 and White wins.

World Champion Anatoly Karpov of the Soviet Union has been awarded the 1980 Chess Oscar, according to the USCF. The award is presented annually by AIPE, the international association of chess journalists, to the person chosen by its members as the year's most outstanding player. This is Karpov's second consecutive Chess Oscar and his seventh in the last eight years.

Editor's note--Due to the delay in publication of this issue explained in Graffiti, we are publishing two reports from Jim Brotsos, one dated 4-21-81 and the other 5-23-81.

The regular season has ended with few surprises in the North Division. The Teletype Knights lost a close last-round match to the Excaliburs but still earned undisputed first place. Art has shown super enthusiasm for chess and the CICL and has demonstrated great energy and many good ideas. I know the North Division Team Captains will join me in congratulating him and will cooperate to make his assignment enjoyable and successful.
