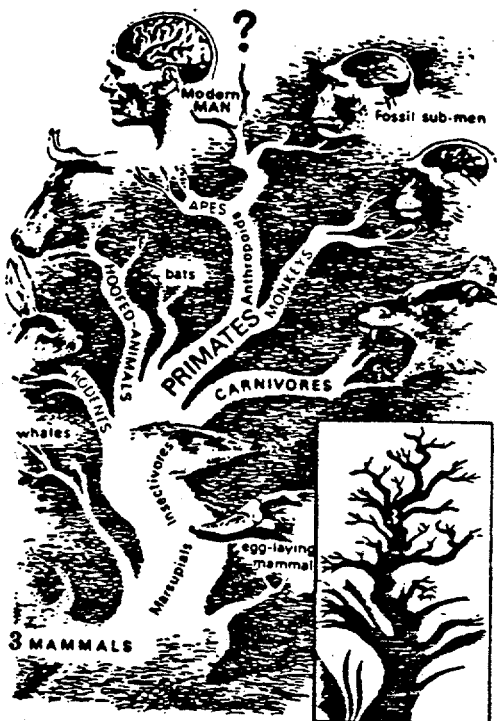

GRAFFITI

I have always liked the Budapest Defense to the Queen's Gambit (1.P-Q4 N-KB3 2.P-QB4 P-K4). It is a bizarre opening that suits my temperament (as certain readers will testify). Although it can be refuted in several ways, I have found that most players, and sometimes even fairly strong players, tend not to play the best line against it. It is a useful psychological ploy in that the player of a Queen's Gambit generally is aiming for a quiet, positional game. My best result with the Budapest so far is a draw against a 2000+ player.

Given this preamble, it should not be difficult to imagine my surprise when my chess automaton (Sensory Chess Challenger) played a totally new and seemingly absurd line that seems to hold the black gambit pawn while preventing black from developing any counterplay to speak of. The line is 1.P-Q4 N-KB3 2.P-QB4 P-K4 3.PxP N-N5 4.Q-Q4. Amazing! This move is given in no opening book that I can find yet it simultaneously protects the pawn on K5 and attacks the knight on N5. This effectively prevents black from regaining the pawn. A long analysis aided by Roy Benedek failed to turn up any significant play for black. If 4.Q-Q4 is indeed a playable, even good, move, then how much credit can be given to Sensory Chess Challenger for finding it? I am inclined to say not much, because the move is fairly obvious if we forget about the general principle that the queen should not be developed early. Nevertheless, it looks like Sensory Chess Challenger has caused me to abandon the Budapest, unless some clever reader sends me a good line for black against 4.Q-Q4. (Next month's issue will contain a review of Sensory Chess Challenger.)

THOSE INCREDIBLE TIEBREAK POINTS

Winning by a whisker isn't nearly as close as losing by a single tiebreaker. Ask the Hungarian team at the Malta Olympiad completed last month. Just when it looked as if Hungary would edge the USSR and repeat its stunning showing of two years ago at Buenos Aires, what happens? A curious run of circumstances and luck forced the Magyars to content themselves with the silver.

Here's how it happened...The last round of the Olympiad paired Hungary with Iceland and the USSR with Denmark, and the top spots were right on the line: Hungary and USSR went into the final encounter with equal scores. Should each match end in the same score, the tie would be broken by totals of the teams faced by each. Yes, that's what happened: The USSR mustered 3½ vs Denmark and Hungary did the same against Iceland--so the outcome ironically depended on two teams going nowhere, teams playing each other in the last round: Scotland vs Greece! The USSR had previously faced Greece and Hungary had played Scotland, so with all other tiebreakers counted, it came to this: should Scotland manage 1½ of the 4 vs Greece, the gold medal would go to Hungary; the USSR could clinch the gold if it took the match 3-1.

Scotland's foursome had been led by IM Pritchett. As the fates would have it, he was absent for the final match, sorely weakening the Scottish team. You guessed it! Greece trounced Scotland and gave the Soviets the gold medal on 449½ - 448 tie-break points--and Buenos Aires had been avenged.

The bronze was won by Yugoslavia with the USA a respectable fourth, and Czechoslovakia a point behind in fifth. Yasser Seirawan took the silver medal for Board 2 play with his fine 8-3 performance including a spectacular win over Tal. Others playing for the U.S. included Alburt, Christiansen, Tarjan, Shamkovitch, and deFirmian. All except deFirmian finished with a plus score.

Well, for the Hungarians all that might have been tolerable enough had there not been a repeat performance in the ladies' room... If I told you that the Hungarian women took 14 of 18 points in their finals rounds, you say, "That's looks like enough to win it!" You'd be wrong...the Soviet females racked up 14½ of their last 18. Women's World

Champion Maya Chiburdanidze scored a remarkable 11½/13 on Board 1 to lead the Soviets, and the USSR also captured board prizes for Board 2 with former World Champion Nona Gaprindashvili contributing 9½/11 and young Ioseliani earning 7½/9 on Board 4. The Polish women edged into third place overall for the bronze. Where did our girls come in? Not bad, really. We finished about where we started--in 16th.

Brilliancy prizes are generally ill-conceived attempts to reward flashy play, almost always accompanied by moves from a cooperative opponent. Not so this time. The women's brilliancy prize was won by Veroci of Hungary in the following stupendous game:

It wasn't all fun and games at Malta, however. Some business was conducted--and some titles were awarded. Three GM titles went to American players: Edmar Mednis, Yasser Seirawan, and Andy Soltis. Six new nations were welcomed in the FIDE family: Antigua, Brunei, Egypt, Kenya, Senegal, and Zimbabwe. The site for the 1982 Olympiad was discussed without a firm decision made since Switzerland's original bid was revised and met with opposition. Final site choice will be announced in April when the FIDE Executive Council meets. 1984 will be a big year for Puerto Rico! They hold the 1984 first option for the Olympiad.

So Malta was able to pull it off after all, despite early misgivings. The Maltese deserve applause, indeed. But if I were an Hungarian, I'd consult a gypsy before 1982.



BOOK REVIEW

CHESS IS MY LIFE, Anatoly Karpov and Aleksander Roshal, Pergamon Press, 359 pages, index, photographs, List \$30 (HB) available from APCT for \$25.25; List \$14 (PB), APCT price \$12.85.

This book purports to be a biography of world champion Anatoly Karpov with autobiographical fragments and games. It is nothing of the sort. It is a work of propaganda in which the real life Karpov is only a subsidiary figure. The real hero is the Soviet state on which the book closes. Karpov's role is to be the perfect citizen of that state, different in degree but not in kind from any other citizen of that state--a sort of super soviet boy scout.

It goes without saying that this boy scout can do no wrong--even when his actions are diametrically opposed. If Karpov doesn't need a win and plays for a draw, his "realism" is praised; if, in an identical situation, he plays for a win, his fighting spirit is praised. If he refuses a chance for revenge, his equanimity is praised; when he takes a chance for revenge his personal pride is lauded.

If this was the extent of Roshal's silliness it would be relatively benign. Unfortunately, for Roshal at least, the existence of a hero presupposes a villain, and he didn't have to look very far to find one. Why else would the Soviets insist on the same English title for this book as for the previously published Korchnoi autobiography? Occasionally Roshal's need to expunge every mention of Korchnoi's name is unintentionally humorous. In an interview, Robert Byrne listed "Karpov, Tal, and Larsen" as favorites for the qualifying spots from the 1973 Leningrad Interzonal. In the next paragraph, however, he is quoted as saying "...I merely singled out these four." Any bets on whose name was dropped?

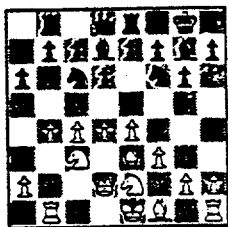
There is little humorous, however, about the long diatribe against Korchnoi. Roshal denigrates his ability,

attacks his manners at and away from the board and subjects his personality to the most self-serving pseudo "psychological" analysis. Were these Karpov's opinions there might be some justification for their inclusion. As it is they are merely one more attempt by the Soviet state to exact its revenge upon Viktor Korchnoi--the same state, it must be recalled, which attempted to strip Korchnoi of all FIDE titles, introduce a FIDE organized boycott of him and now boycotts every organizer who dares invite him, while preventing his wife's emigration and imprisoning his son.

These are not the only lies the book propounds. There is a consistent, subtle attempt to rewrite history--much as Kotov does in his biography of Alexander Alekhine. Salo Flohr is given a patronymic, just as though he is originally Russian and not an emigre from Czechoslovakia in the 1930s. The sections on Fischer and FIDE are masterpieces of innuendo; any FIDE vote Roshal dislikes is a result of the Machiavelian machinations of Ed Edmondson; any vote he likes is a triumph of the democratic process that he otherwise deplores.

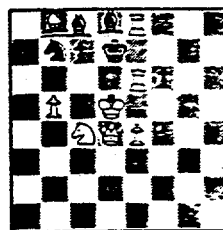
The prime virtue of the book is that in it Karpov annotates his own games. In the last two decades only Fischer, Tal, Karpov, Reshevsky, and Larsen have done so among the great players. Since many of the games annotated here are also annotated in RHM's volume of Karpov's best games, the large number of unannotated games appended to the text by the English publishers should give it the edge. While I don't really like Karpov's often dry style or believe that his annotations are the equal of Fischer's or Larsen's (both of whom make me want to play chess), he should be commended for the attempt. Let us hope that this volume is remembered for Karpov's chess and not Roshal's propaganda.

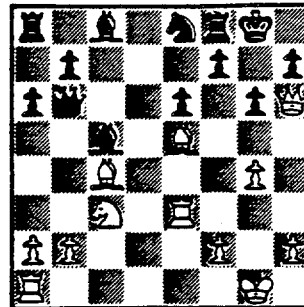

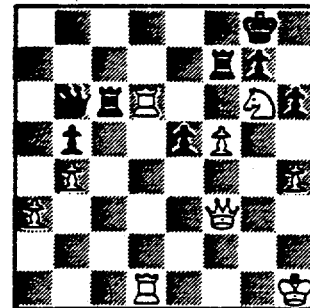

Victor Korchnoi of Switzerland was declared winner of the final candidates' match when his opponent, Robert Huebner of West Germany, withdrew after eight games.

The match, played in Merano, Italy, had been scheduled for 16 games. Korchnoi, who was leading 4 1/2 to 3 1/2, will face Anatoly Karpov of the Soviet Union this summer for the world championship.

"Huebner's actions tell me that his nerves cracked," said GM Michael Stean, Korchnoi's second, "that he couldn't stand the match pressure. But we were prepared for a fight."

Huebner, however, gave no explanation for his withdrawal. Shortly before the adjourned ninth and 10th games were to be resumed, he went to Korchnoi's hotel room, shook hands and left. According to GM Robert Byrne of the New York Times, Huebner held a small advantage in game nine and was at a disadvantage in game 10.

Huebner took an early lead, winning the first game of the match, but Korchnoi won the second to pull even. After a draw in game three, Huebner took the fourth contest to resume the lead.

He held the lead with draws in games five and six, but Korchnoi won game seven when Huebner blundered on move 63 and dropped a rook. The shock of losing a piece in a simple position apparently carried over into game eight, which Huebner also lost.

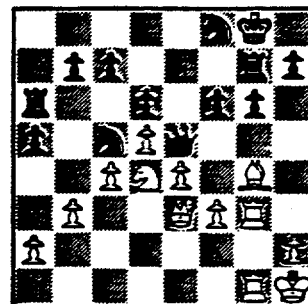

Bent Larsen of Denmark won the Clarin International Tournament held last November in Buenos Aires, Argentina, with a 9 1/2 to 3 1/2 score. He won eight, lost two and drew 3.

World Champion Anatoly Karpov of the Soviet Union tied for fourth place with 7 1/2 points, winning four, losing two and drawing seven. This was the first time since his last match with Korchnoi that Karpov entered a tournament and failed to win it.

Larsen finished a scant 1/2 point ahead of the field, but the tournament was not close. He won 9 1/2 of the first 11 rounds, and lost only the last two games which by then were meaningless.
