Chicago Industrial Chess League Meeting of August 19, 1982 Minutes

- 1. The meeting was called to order at the Oak Park Chess Club by president Paul Weston. He announced that Bruce McNeil of Motorola had agreed to serve as North Division chairman.
- 2. Treasurer Jim Brotsos presented his annual treasurer's report. The League earned a profit of approximately \$777 during the 1981-82 season. Approximately \$323 of this profit came from the CICL Bulletin, through a combination of a pessimistic estimate of Bulletin expenses at the start of last season, and the publication of seven issues rather than the planned ten.
- 3. Jim then presented a proposed budget for the 1982-83 season, based in part on last season's experience. This budget proposal called for League dues of \$22 per team, a Bulletin subscription rate of \$15 for teams and \$6 for individuals, and a \$13 refundable banquet ticket guarantee. The budget indicated a projected profit for the season of \$290.
- 4. During the ensuing discussion of the budget proposal, Vilo Machuca of the Veterans Administration suggested that the amount budgeted for trophies be increased to \$430, approximately \$100 more than was spent last year, with the suggestion that the increase be used to fund awards designed to encourage the average player. This suggestion was agreed to unanimously. This change reduced the League's projected profit to \$220. The budget proposal as amended was approved by a vote of 19 to 4.
- 5. The next item of business was the admission of new teams to the League. Paul Renn of Bell Laboratories requested admission of a third Bell Labs team, the Indians, which would play in the Far West Division. Paul would be the captain of this team. The admission of the Bell Labs Indians was approved unanimously. Next, Wes Underwood of Wheaton College requested admission of a team from the college to the Far West Division. In response to a question, Wes stated that he would be the only employee of the college on the team; the remaining players would be students. Wes would serve as captain, and could be readily contacted by telephone. Jim Brotsos pointed out that the League Rules specify that all team members must be on the payroll of the company that they represent. Several others pointed out that Wheaton College had been a good member of the CICL for a number of years prior to last season, when they were forced to drop out of the League temporarily. After considerable discussion, the admission of Wheaton College was approved by a vote of 18-7. Finally, Chris Musgrave requested admission of a team from the Engrave-It Company. Team members are employed under contract by the company, which recruits its employees from

the Oak Park Chess Club. The Engrave-It team was admitted to the Near West Division by a vote of 20-1.

- 6. Tom Gaffigan announced the formation of a new alumni team in the East Division, subject to the approval of several players as alumni by the League. Players J. Mathews, K. Jakstas, S. Parmeter, and G. Vivian were accepted unanimously as alumni members. Also proposed for alumni membership was C. Alfaro, who had played for an Argonne team last season. It appeared that Alfaro's eligibility to play last season was open to question, and approval for him to play had been mistakenly granted by an irregular procedure. After some discussion, Alfaro was approved to play as an alumnus by a vote of 16-8. Finally, Jim Brotsos requested approval for J. Zahora and F. Suereth to play as alumni with the Excaliburs. Approval was granted unanimously.
- 7. Jim Brotsos made a motion that the League contribute \$200 to the Illinois Invitational Tourney. During the discussion, the proposed contribution was amended to \$50. The amended motion was defeated by a vote of 16-10.
- 8. It was proposed that the championship playoff format used
 last season be changed to having only the final round at a
 common location. After some discussion, a proposal to repeat
 last year's arrangements was passed by a vote of 16-6.
- 9. Dan Kumro proposed that the championship playoff tie-break procedure be changed to the F.I.D.E. cumulative match point method. Under this method, tie-break points would be the sum of a team's match points at the end of all previous rounds. This proposal was approved by 23-1.
- 10. Joe Brozovich proposed that the League consider the use or purchase of a microcomputer for maintaining the League rating system, and possibly for producing the Bulletin. Paul Weston responded by appointing Joe the chairman of a committee to study this question. Other members appointed were Duane Satterlee of International Harvester and Nate Stelton of Rockwell International. A report from this committee was to be produced in time to be published in the January issue of the Bulletin.
- 11. Paul Weston requested consideration of a proposal that alumni teams be permitted to win trophies and to participate in the championship playoffs. No conclusion could be reached after considerable discussion, and it was decided to table this proposal until a future meeting.
