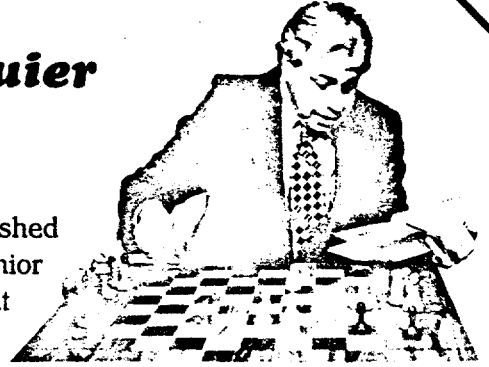

Grandmaster Arthur Bisguier

International Grandmaster Arthur Bisguier has had a long and distinguished chess career dating back to the forties when he was twice National Junior Champion and several times Manhattan Chess Club Champion. Since that time the roster of players he has beaten or drawn reads like a Who's Who of Chess and includes virtually every leading grandmaster in the world.



Five-time U.S. Open Champion

In 1950 Bisguier won the U.S. Open for the first time and also won or tied for first in 1956, 57, 59, and 69, finishing only half a point from the top in many other years. He scored his first international victory at Southsea, England, in 1950. Even while in military service, he squeezed in some chess, scoring first in Vienna in 1952 and playing for the United States team in the Helsinki Olympiad of 1952.

Returning home from the Army, he won the Hollywood Pan American Championship in 1954. Later that year, he won the Challengers' Tournament in Philadelphia and the U.S. Championship. He has played in most of the succeeding U.S. Championships, and in the 1962-63 event, he led the field until the final round when he characteristically succumbed to Bobby Fischer and had to content himself with second place.

Bisguier was awarded the International Master title in 1952 and the International Grandmaster title, the highest of all, in 1957, when this title was rare indeed. He has participated in two Interzonals, five Olympiads, innumerable international tournaments, two team matches against the Soviet Union, and one against Yugoslavia. He has also been very successful in domestic tournaments, at one time or another winning outright or tying for first in every major Swiss-system event, including the prestigious Lone Pine Tournament, the National Open, and the World Open. In 1979, he won the first American Grand Prix, having accumulated the best results in the year-long series of major open tournaments.

Mr. Bisguier is Grandmaster-on-Staff for the U.S. Chess Federation and Technical Advisor to the monthly magazine *Chess Life*. In addition, he continues as a popular and active chess lecturer and simultaneous exhibitor, playing as many as 100 opponents at a time. He has also been a frequent contributor to chess magazines, encyclopedias, and books, as well as having co-authored, with Andrew Soltis, *American Chess Masters From Morphy to Fischer*. He has appeared often on television and hosted his own show during the Fischer-Spassky World Championship Match.

His other activities have included work in accounting, computer programming, technical writing, and magazine editing. He was married in 1959, has two daughters, and resides with his family in the Catskill Mountains at Rock Hill, New York.

When It's Over, It's Over

INCORRECT STARTING POSITION NOTICED TOO LATE -- RESULT STANDS

Here's one for the chess lawyers: What happens when the game is over and the players suddenly notice that the pieces had been set up incorrectly?

This happened during a fourth round match between Rockwell International and J. I. Case in the Near West Division. Acting captains Jeff McQuinn of Rockwell and Duane Satterlee of J. I. Case discussed the matter and decided the best way to proceed was for Jeff to file a protest.

The incident occurred on board five, where Rich Lasken of J. I. Case, playing the white pieces, beat Sam Solemani of Rockwell International. According to Jeff, the game was the well-known Fool's Mate and was over in "about three minutes." After the result was recorded on the match results sheet, the players returned to the board and noticed that kings and queens of both colors were on the wrong squares.

I decided in favor of J. I. Case. The game was over, and the result must stand.

Here's why:

Article 9.4 of the Official Rules of Chess states, "If, during a game, it is found that the initial position of the men was incorrect, the game shall be annulled and a new game played."

A FIDE interpretation of this rule centers on a 1960 game in which the tournament director inadvertently assigned the players the wrong colors. The loser discovered the mistake some days later and appealed to have the game overturned and replayed with correct colors.

FIDE ruled that, while a game played with reversed colors does qualify as having an incorrect initial position, the position was not noticed during the game, as the rule requires. Consequently, the initial results stood.

The same reasoning applies to the CIGL game in question. Once the game is over, it's over.

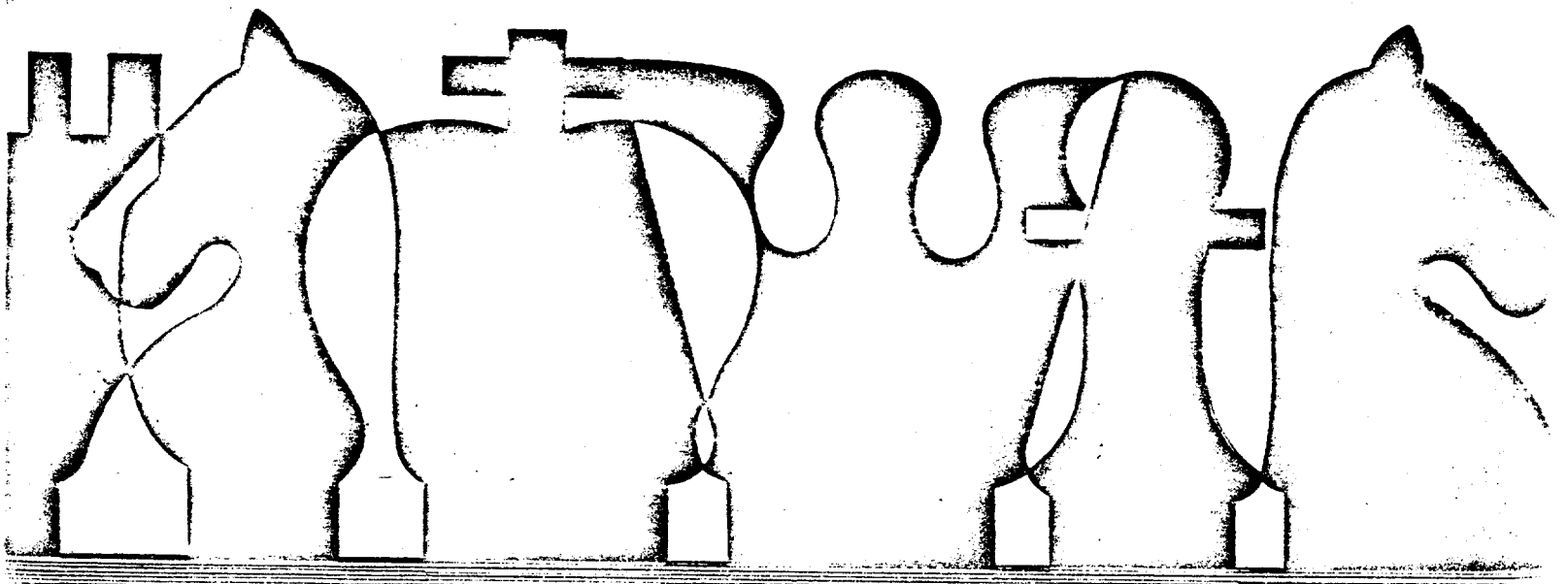
