Chicago Industrial Chess League
Meeting of September 5, 1985
Amoco Labs, Naperville

1. The meeting was called to order by CICL president Russ Rzeszutko at 6:45 p.m.
2. Jim Brotso, our treasurer, went over three pages of financial details concerning the 1984-85 season. Here are a few highlights from his report....

Jim then went over his proposed CICL operating budget for 1985-86. Highlights from this report....

Cash from prior year	\$1,236.00
Income	1,509.00
Expenses	1,530.00
Dues for season	\$65 team

Brotso's report and his proposed budget was passed unanimously. Details are available from your team captain. (Be sure to mail your team dues to Jim Brotso as soon as possible).

3. Russ Rzeszutko resigned the presidency and called for the election of a new CICL president. Fred Ciba and Wes Underwood were nominated for the post but both declined because of other league responsibilities. Dan Kumro nominated Bruce McNeil for the post. After a second motion Bruce McNeil was elected president of the CICL for the 1985-86 season unanimously. In other elections, Dave Burian was elected chairman of the north division and Leon McClendon was elected chairman of the east division.

4. A general discussion followed as to the number of teams participating in the CICL this year. Here is a tentative break down....

North division	- 7 teams
East division	- 4 teams
Near West Division	- 6 teams
Far West Division	- 6 teams

It was discussed that possibly A & B Radio could move from the Near West to the East division. Both division chairmen agreed to get together with A&B Radio to discuss this possibility.

Leon McClendon was asked if he could check into the University of Chicago's presumed interest in joining the CICL.

New membership was discussed. It was felt that our league could use some new teams. It was also felt that more exposure for our efforts was necessary. The Secretary pointed out that a position in the CICL called "Publicity Chairman" was available for this. Russ Rzeszutko volunteered for the job and was appointed to it by the president.

5. A new team asked to join the CICL. Steve Healy, of the Village of Oak Park, gave a short speech on the merits of his proposed team. They were voted in unanimously. They will play in the Near West division and asked to be called the "Village Chess Players".
6. Wes Underwood led a discussion into the feasibility of hiring a grandmaster to play against CICL members who pay a fee. He suggested that it would be possible to fly Arthur Bisguier from New York to Chicago, pay his expenses and add a financial incentive. The total charge to each participant was discussed. Interest in such an event was explored. Jim Warren pointed out that the Midwest Masters will be played in Chicago in March 1986. Perhaps we could secure a grandmaster to play us at that time and save travel and per diem expense (or, at the most, share). Wes felt that at least one person per team could foot a \$10 entrance fee to play a grandmaster. The more that played, the better. Perhaps we could even profit from such a tournament.

Bill Holm made a motion that Wes Underwood devise a plan for a grandmaster tournament, submit the plan to the officers of the CICL and they would approve or disapprove it. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

(Secretary note: If you feel you would like to participate in such a tournament with a \$10 fee, contact your captain. He will then get a reading of interest and report that interest to Wes).

Dan Kumro made a motion to close the discussion on this matter. It was seconded and passed unanimously.

7. Bruce McNeil circulated around computer printouts of the playoff games he received from the 1984-85 season finals.
8. Charley Ward requested that division chairmen publish teams and team member's names.
9. Fred Ciba opened a discussion on the merits of playing the 1st, 2nd and 3rd rounds of the CICL playoffs during evenings. Other teams expressed interest in evening playoffs. Some teams expressed a desire to leave the 2nd and 3rd rounds on a Saturday. Both sides of the question were heard from. Bill Holm made a motion that the teams that qualify for the playoffs (including Alumni teams) decide when they will play. This motion was seconded and passed 6 in favor, 5 opposed. The president will oversee and supervise this vote. It is to take place after the playoff teams have been selected. Play must conclude by the third Saturday in May.
10. Steve Healy asked why the Tornado Chess Tournament was cancelled during the previous season. Reasons were given. Steve then expressed an interest in running the next Tornado himself with help from one or two other CICL members. He was appointed to the job by the president.
11. Jim Warren expressed an interest to run the banquet this season. A discussion as to the program followed (magician, grandmaster to speak, dancing, picnic). Many praised Jim's involvement. He was appointed to the job by the president.
12. President Bruce McNeil closed the meeting at 8:55 p.m.
