Membership in the USCF includes a subscription to Chess Life, one of the world's best chess magazines. It also allows members to play in USCF-rated tournaments and to earn a nationally recognized rating. There is a USCF-rated tournament scheduled almost every week somewhere in the Chicagoland area, ranging from the Illinois championship down to small local tournaments. USCF members can also purchase books and equipment at discount prices.

One year's USCF membership is regularly \$25.00, but is only \$21.00 for CICL members (this is the \$4.00 affiliate discount). If you are renewing your membership, please also include your membership number and expiration date (printed on the Chess Life mailing label) or, if you are not currently a member, the approximate expiration date of your earlier membership.

I will forward your check to the USCF along with a letter certifying that you qualify for the discount. I will also send you a receipt that will serve as a temporary membership card until your permanent card arrives from the USCF.

In other matters as they relate to the treasury, it was agreed that team dues for the season would be reduced to \$64.00. After November 30th the dues go up another \$5.00, after December 31st they go up \$10.00. Team captains should pay their dues promptly to Jim to avoid these penalties. A discussion ensued concerning the continuations of a sinking fund for a new computer. It was agreed that after \$1,500 is collected in this fund it would stop and we would vote as to the need for a new computer. (We have \$900 now). This was unanimously passed. Brotsos pointed out that he has a Smith-Corona typewriter that belongs to the CICL. It cost \$88.00 and was used for 3 years. It was generally agreed that we should dispose of it via an advertisement in a future bulletin. The officers will decide what is an acceptable dollar offer for its sale. 7. A discussion was held on the idea that we could hold another Watts line simultaneous exhibition with the CICL of New York City. (Two have been held in our history, the last one 10 years ago). A volunteer is needed to run the event. Patrick Sabados will check into the availability of Amoco Labs for our playing site.

1. The meeting was called to order by CICL president Bruce McNeil at 7:10 p.m.

2. Jim Warren gave a report on the Annual Awards Banquet held at Harvey's Prime Rib on June 13th. His efforts in organizing the banquet were applauded. Individual and group invitations were issued by Jim and helped in increasing our attendance to this once-a-year affair. Some consideration was given to next year's dinner - perhaps another evening or a Sunday afternoon? Through general consensus it was agreed that a Friday evening works out best. Jim volunteered to do the job again in 1987. (And was quickly appointed to do so by the president!)

3. Charlie Ward gave a report on the CICL ratings. Everything seems to be running along very smoothly with only one recent glitch; one player's rating was off by 7 points, that bug was discovered though and remedied. Charlie expressed concern that the division chairmen mail to him game results as soon as possible. Without those timely results it is impossible for him to establish an accurate up to date rating for an individual player. Of course, it is necessary for team captains to hasten their results to division chairmen as well.

4. It was pointed out that the CICL Tornado is still on for September 6th. It is open to all past and present CICL members, providing their team is still active.

5. Jim Brotsos gave his 1985-86 treasurers report. Highlights are as follows...

8. Irwin Gaines had an idea for an all-star CIGL match between divisions. The 10 best players from each division would square off at a place and time to be determined. Irwin was asked to pursue this good idea further. The only request was that the matches be played in the evenings and not on a Saturday.

9. Bruce McNeil made a motion that the second and third rounds of the 1986-87 CIGL playoffs be held on Saturday, May 16, 1987. This motion was seconded by Wes Underwood. It passed unanimously. It was also agreed that the awards banquet would be held June 12, 1987.

10. Bruce McNeil proposed that a list of captains be published in a future CIGL bulletin. Wes Underwood will oblige. (Ed. - Please send all corrections and updates on captain names and addresses to me so this list will be accurate.)

11. A discussion as to the merits of individual versus group chess trophies took place. It was generally agreed that teams prefer individual trophies even though they cost more than group trophies. It was pointed out that trophies and awards for 1985-86 totalled only \$480. Why take away an incentive for singular gain? It was agreed that the choice will remain with the team captain.

12. A roster of Alumni players were voted into the CIGL....Anderson, Osterund, Kras, Leong and Daniluke.

13. President Bruce McNeil closed the meeting at 9:15 p.m.

GAMES !!! (Please submit some games - with or without analysis - for publication! Here are two from last season.)

The following game between Gee Leong 1993 Excaliburs (white) and Marv Cox 1921 Alumni (black) is submitted by Marv for publication.

- 1. P-QB4 English Opening. Usually a slow, drawish, positional game.
P-K4 This is now a Sicilian, colors reversed, with white a move in hand.
- 2. N-QB3 N-KB3 In as much as I am rated lower than my opponent by 72 points I will play the most drawish moves possible.
- 3. P-KN3 P-Q4 Notice the similarity to the Sicilian Dragon variation. Transposition to a familiar line is always a handy strategy.
- 4. PxP NxP
- 5. B-N2 N-QN3 Recommended by Alekine against the Sicilian so should be good here.
- 6. N-KB3 N-QB3
- 7. O-O B-K2
- 8. P-K3 Q-O
- 9. P-QN3 B-K3
- 10. B-QN2 P-KB4 White has deviated from the usual queen side maneuvers of p-qn3, p-qn4 followed by a queen side attack. Instead he has fianchettoed both bishops and will attempt to clear out the center in order to make his bishops all powerful. Theory says I should prevent his P-Q4 and initiate a king side attack.
- 11. P-Q4 P-K5 I could not prevent P-Q4 but I was able to block the center and so keep one of his bishops out of the game.
- 12. N-K1 N-Q4 Further blocking the center to keep the white bishops bottled up. Also prevents an immediate P-KB3.
- 13. Q-K2 B-KB3
- 14. P-KB3 ?? K-R1 should have preceded this attempt to open the KB file.
NxKp White can not capture the knight or he'll lose his queen.
- 15. KBPxKP BxQP I probably should have taken the rook but I didn't see the continuations clearly. My uncle told me never to take risks when ahead in material, in this case one pawn. He said that over the board analysis deeper than 7 ply (4 of my moves and 3 of my opponent) would usually be faulty and blow up in my face to give me a lost game. Study the complications from 15. NxR
- 16. KPxBKP BxKBP 16. P-Q5
- 17. R-KB4 NxB ch I considered N-QB7 but decided to still follow my uncle's advice. I was very much afraid of what the two bishops on an open board could do to me.
- 18. KxN BxN Still trying to simplify.
- 19. Q-QB4 ch K-R1
- 20. QxB Q-K4 ch I'm trying to set up to force a queen trade without being mated or lose my bishop in the process.
- 21. N-KB3 R-KB2
- 22. R-K1 R-Q1
- 23. K-N1 K-N1
- 24. N-K5 B-R6
- 25. N-KB3
Moving either of his rooks to the second row would allow me to cause massive simplification and then take advantage of my extra pawn.
B-QB1 My bishop needed a safe home. Not at QR6 or QN5.

- 26.R(4)-K4 R(1)-KB1 Things are getting pretty tight for me. Displacement of any of my pieces would result in my collapse. Also my simplification threats are gone. At this time his young son started to bother him and broke his concentration.
- 27.B-QR3 Intending to displace my rook. But he no longer has the immediate mate threat so the move was a serious mistake.
- RxN I think my opponent went into shock at this.
- 28.R-K8 R-KB8ch If I take his queen I'm mated.
- 29.RxR RxR
- 30.B-N2 Q-K4 Let's try for that queen exchange I've wanted since I won the pawn in the opening.
- 31.QxQ Poor. The ratio of amount of my material to his material is now much bigger than it was before the queens were traded off. Also he has lost all later chance of drawing by perpetual check.
- NxQ
- 32.K-N2 R-K2 This time I made the poor move. Better was to move the knight to break the potential pin.
- 33.B-R3 R-K1
- 34.R-K1 R-K3
- 35.R-QB1 P-QB3 My candidate pawn on the half open file should move forward anyway.
- 36.B-QB5 N-Q6
- 37.Resigns

The following game between Marv Cox 1921 Alumni (white) and L. Crewse 2074 Exemplars (black) is submitted by Marv for publication as having the strangest ending of the year.

- 1. P-K4 P-QB4 Sicilian Opening. White should try to prevent black from playing P-Q4 and should initiate an active king side attack. Black should initiate an active queen side attack, particularly against the qb file.
- 2. N-KB3 N-QB3 Since my opponent is rated 153 points above me I will play all moves toward obtaining a draw. My uncle told me to always play for a draw until my opponent offers me a win.
- 3. P-Q4 PxP
- 4. NxP N-KB3 This knight move is a must. Otherwise white will play P-QB4 which is called the Marochy Bind and stops any black queen side attack cold.
- 5. N-QB3 P-K4 Prevents white from playing P-K5 when black plays P-Q4.
- 6. N-QN3 B-QN5
- 7. B-Q3 Q-Q BxN ch is rarely played because in the Sicilian middle game the bishops turn out to be much stronger than the knights.
- 8. B-Q2 P-Q4 Black has attained one of his objectives.
- 9. NxQP I would like to trade off everything on the board to be left with a bare king versus king draw.
- NxN
- 10.PxN QxP Black has the positional advantage of the center pawn and his centralized queen which is not subject to attack.
- 11.Q-Q BxB
- 12.QxB P-K5
- 13.B-K2 Q-K4
- 14.P-QB3 This helps me. The candidate pawn should be advanced and on qb3 the pawn keeps the black knight from advancing.
- B-K3
- 15.Q-K3 P-KB4 Evidently I have not played against this Sicilian correctly as black has the center and the king side attack.

16.P-KB3 QR-K1
 17.PxP QxKP
 18.QxQ PxQ As mentioned before, I want to trade to a drawn ending. Unfortunately the isolated passed queen's pawn will be highly anti-drawish. It can be lost or it can queen.

19.N-QB5 B-QB1
 20.RxR ch KxR
 21.K-KB2 At this point I missed a very strong sequence
 21.R-KB1ch K-KN1
 22.B-QB4ch K-KR1
 23.NxKP and black can not take the knight.
 I can hear my uncle saying, "Didn't I teach you better than that? Your opponent offered you a win and you didn't take it."

22.N-QN3 P-QN3
 23.K-K3 N-K4
 24.P-KR3 P-KN4
 25.R-Q1 N-KN3
 26.B-KR5 NxP ch Not a mistake on his part but a well thought out attempt to sacrifice an exchange in order to queen a pawn.

27.K-B2 BxKRP
 28.BxR KxB I don't particularly like my position. It's too anti-drawish. Also a bishop and two pawns is worth slightly more than a rook.

29.K-N3 P-KN5 Immobilizes his bishop.
 30.R-Q2 Immobilizes his knight as well. And I'm threatening to get both his pieces for my rook.

31.RxN P-K6
 32.KxB BxR
