The following informal but rated match was played on July 9, 1987 between the Bell Labs Dragons and Amoco. Wes Underwood of Wheaton College played first board for Amoco, making up for the absence of Mike Nagle, Amoco's regular Board 1 player.

#### CHICAGO INDUSTRIAL CHESS LEAGUE Meeting of August 25, 1987 Motorola, Schaumburg

- 1. The meeting was called to order by CICL president Bruce McNeil at 7:05 p.m.
- 2. The treasurers report was presented verbally by Jim Brotsos. The balances in our treasury for prior years as compared to todays are as follows....1984 \$980; 1985 \$1236; 1986 \$1700; 1987 \$1850. Jim feels that we are in good financial condition. The only negative financial news was the \$83 we lost during the Arthur Bisguier exhibition. All members present voted unanimously to keep the yearly CICL dues at \$64 per team. Please submit to Brotsos as soon as possible to avoid penalties.
- 3. Bruce McNeil reported that the Fall Tornado was being postponed because of the lack of an organizer. He will approach Steve Healy and Steve Decman as possible tournament directors to run this event in the Spring of '88.
- 4. It was determined that Wes Underwood will continue to publish the CICL bulletin. Wes will continue to get \$14 per team from the treasury to help defray costs.
- 5. Charley Ward expressed the need to get game results from division chairmen as soon after matches as possible. If teams play out of their scheduled order, he must have that information as well.
- 6. The following players were voted favorably onto the Alumni team in the East division: Hale Chan, Tony Jasaitis.
- 7. The minutes of the April 6, 1987 meeting were read by secretary Fred Ciba II. Jim Brotsos raised an objection to the wording on one point; at the 4/6 meeting, he had made an issue of dues being turned in late by deliquent teams during the 1986-87 season. Jim was looking to propose that those teams be penalized if their dues or lateness fees went unpaid. The penalty would be dismissal from the league. The secretaries report did not flag out his objections in the form of a proposal.

However, Charlie Ward pointed out the fact that the CICL rules already stipulate that teams that do not pay their dues "by the required date" are ineligible for future play. This was interpeted to mean "by the following season".

The minutes were approved 14 to 2.

- 8. A new team was voted into the far west division; they are Tellabs with Donald Graft, captain.
- 9. Bruce McNeil expressed the need for a new June '88 banquet chairman. Donald Graft volunteered for this post providing he can get help and/or direction from a previous chairman. Some members voiced concerns over the running of the June '87 banquet. The absence of a microphone was addressed as was the lack of organization in the speed tournament. Others praised the speed tournament.
- 10. Bruce McNeil pointed out that the NYCCL telephone match, scheduled for June 20, 1987 was cancelled because of the lack of a playing sight. Russ Rzeszutko volunteered to organize this event for the near future. Norm Hughes will look into the possibility of playing at Kemper.
- 11. There was a general discussion about the possibility of another all-star match between divisions. Russ Rzeszutko volunteered to run this event if Irwin Gaines could not. There was general support for such a match if team captains could promote it amongst their members.
- 12. Norm Hughes was voted in unanimously as the North Chairman.
- mitted in a special bulletin to all teams in August, 1987. Gee was looking to change the wording of Constitution IB2a regarding eligibility. His rationale for this change has to do with his concerns over keeping teams stable in the league. In effect, the requirement rule would be more liberalized to allow former employees of a team to stay on that team after leaving a company. Much discussion ensured. Some members of the league wondered how this constitution change would affect alumni teams. Others felt that some teams fold up after a key player leaves and a change such as this would keep the team together. Others noted that players would have a choice of staying with his old company or going to an alumni team. Finally, President Bruce McNeil called for a vote. The results were 12 in favor of the change, 5 against. The new rule will read as follows....

IB2a: Each team member must be on the payroll of the organization which they will represent, or must have a normal daily work routine that finds him primarily on the site of the organization which they will represent, or must work primarily based out of the organization which they will represent, or be a former employee that has left that organization, for whatever reason, after a minimum of one year of service.

- 14. Wes Underwood's proposal #1 from the August '87 special bulletin was also addressed. In effect, he is looking for divisional winners each year to have the option of choosing a practical or functional award, such as a chess clock, board or related item vs. a trophy. This proposel passed unanimously.
- 15. Wes Underwood's proposal #2 from the August '87 special bulletin was then discussed. Wes would like USCF or APCT gift certificates to be awarded to "best" games published in the CICL bulletin. The categories are as follows....
  - 1. Best sacrifice (or attack) leading to victory.
  - 2. Best endgame play leading to victory.
  - 3. Best salvage of a draw (or win) when behind.
  - 4. Best upset victory.
  - 5. Best overall game.

Discussion centered around prize amounts (\$10 was decided), the minimum of entries that should be considered (2 was decided) and who should do the judging (the bulletin editor was decided). The proposal was passed 13 in favor, 1 opposed, 3 obstained.

- 16. The poor sportsmanship that was displayed in the 2 and 3 round playoffs at Amoco on May 16, 1987 was talked about. It was felt that
  the tournament director should reign tighter control on appropriate
  procedures.
- 17. Charlie Ward called attention to his article in the June '87 CICL bulletin. In it, he is looking for past tournament games a player participated in that they feel should be included toward the Century Club. Some form of official documentation should accompany your request. Charlie pointed out that our database goes back to 1978.
- 18. There was a general discussion on the merits of expanding the scope of our league; i.e. should we include chess clubs? It was felt that any restructering of the CICL woul dilute its character so no proposal was made.
- 19. President McNeil closed the meeting at 9:05 p.m.
