#### Chicago Industrial Chess League Meeting of August 24, 1988 Motorola, Schaumburg

- The meeting was called to order by CICL President, Bruce McNeil at 7:40 p.m.
- 2. Fred Ciba read the secretarial minutes from the April 18, 1988 business meeting. They were approved unanimously.
- 3. Jim Brotsos delivered his treasurers report. Some highlights... The June 17, 1988 awards banquets brought in a \$161.26 profit. Jim attributed this to some teams not showing up, no flowers for the head table and no gifts for lady guests. Jim felt that we went "bonkers" on trophies this last season. The total was \$901 vs. \$608 last year. It was felt by teams present at the meeting that this years functional awards were a good idea. More money will be allotted for this in the future. Discussion took place concerning computer costs. Charlie Ward saw no point of putting more money into our computer sinking fund. All agreed. It was also agreed by member present, spearheaded by Wes Underwood, that we would no longer pay insurance premiums on our computer. Brotsos' complete report was passed out at the meeting. You can obtain a copy from your captain.
- 4. Marty Franck volunteered to be the CICL Bulletin Editor for the 1988-89 season. He was roundly applauded.
- 5. A discussion took place over Pro Con team's request for a partial refund of their dues based on a shorter than usual playing season. President, Bruce McNeil's decision to decline their request was supported by members present. Charlie Ward suggested that Division Chairman make a point of scheduling at least 10 games a season.
- 6. Bruce McNeil called for a volunteer to run the June 9, 1989 banquet. None stepped forward. Bruce will approach Jim Warren and Don Graft to see if they might repeat another fine performance in this capacity.
- 7. Bruce McNeil called for a volunteer to be the trophy chairman for the season. West Underwood stepped forward and was appointed.

- 8. Bruce McNeil called for a volunteer to organize and run the next Tornado. No one stepped forward. Playing sights were discussed, but without a director, nothing was decided.
- 9. The Chicago Mercantile Exchange was voted into the league. They will play in the East division. Larry Gavin will be the captain. Other teams were discussed as possible future nominees.
- 10. Bill Friesema was voted into an Alumni team. Alan Losoff's nomination was rejected.
- 11. Irwin Gaines was voted in as the Far West Division Chairman. Irwin also agreed to organize this years Allstar Match. He was roundly applauded for his previous effort.
- 12. Wes Underwood made the following proposel...

  "A team that becomes eligible for the playoffs is required to declare, in advance of the playoffs pairings, its intent to compete in all three rounds of the playoffs. Failure (for any reason) to field a minimum of 5 players for each of the three rounds will disqualify that team for eligibility for the following year."
- 13. Bruce McNeil closed the meeting at 9:12 p.m.



- 10. B-QN2 0-0 Two powerful white attacking bishops!
- N-Q2 A retreat is usually bad. Here, black wants better 11. 0-0 control of his K4 and to place his B on his KB3. Wishful thinking? 12.
- P-KB4 Nimzowich's famous "sawing position" intending to Q-K1 trade off white's huge center KP. 13. P-KB4
- N-QB4 Not PxP 14.QxP B-KB4 15. QxQBP
- 14. R-Q1 Further pressure on the center as well as a masked attack against my queen.

PxKP Hurray. The huge KP is gone.

- 15. NxP NxB My uncle always told me that when under attack trade everything off so the enemy has nothing left to attack with. 16.
- B-KB4 Another attempt to trade.
- 17. R-KN3 This caught me by surprise. RxKNP would ruin me. R-KB2
- 18. N-KN5 BxN Trade it off, of course, per my uncle's advice. 19. PxB
- Q-Q2
- 20. R(3)-KB2 QR-KB1
- 21. At this point let's stop and look at my squares KN2 and KB1. Q-QB3 There are 4 attacks on this group of 2 squares, namely the white queen and bishop, and also the two white rooks have a masked attack. There are only 3 defenders of those 2 squares, namely my black king, my black rock on my KB2, and my black queen. Importantly, note that the black rook on my KB1 does not count as a defender since it occupies one of the 2 squares under attack. My uncle pounded into me the "Law of 2-Squares" which states if 2 squares are attacked more times than they are defended the squares may fall. This is an extension of the idea if a piece is attacked more times than defended the piece may fall; the piece attacked is not counted as a defender.



Q-K2, If I had moved the bishop the four attacks vs. the three defenders of the 2-squares could have been utilized by white. He simply would have sacrificed his queen at my KN2, which is one of the 2-squares, and mated by RxR on KBl which is the second of the 2-squares.

22. P-KR4 B-K5 I can now move by bishop because I'm guarding my KB1.

23. R-K1 White unwisely let up his attack against the 2-squares to set up a pin of the black B against the black Q.

P-Q4 I'm willing to give up my QBP to start my attack.

24. QxQBP White moves another piece away from his 2-square attack. Now let's try to "Law of 2-Squares" again. This time look at black's KB6 and KB7 as a new et of 2-squares. Black has 3 attackers: 2 rooks and aB. White has 2 defenders: his K and KNP. Remember, his R on his KB3 doesn't count as a defender becuase it is on one of the 2-squares.

RxR The 2-squares now has 2 attackers and 2 defenders

25. PxxR Q-KB2 Now black has 3 attackers against the 2-squares, namely Q, R, and B. White has only one defender: his king.

- 26. R-KB1 Q-KB5 Black still has a 3 to 2 attack against the 2-squares.
- 27. Q-K6 ch K-KR1 A check? Who cares. My 2-square attack is still on.
- 28. Q-K7 Looking for a quick mate. Much better was Q-KN4 to help defend the 2-squares.

Q-KN6 ch Drives off the K as a defender of the 2-squares.

29. K-R1 BxP ch The 2-squares fall. I can almost hear my uncle saying "We win."

30. RxB QxR ch

31. K-KR2 Q-KB7 ch White would have loved 31. --- R-KN1

32. BxPch RxB

33. Q-K8ch R-N1

34/ Q-K5ch drawn

32. K-R3 R-KB3 ch

- 33. K-N4 R-KN6 ch The white diagonal must be cleared for the black Q as this diagonal contains the only access to white's KR5 square.
- 34. Resigns.

I hope this introduction to the "Law of 2-Squares" is helpful and educational. Set up your own examples on the board until you understand it. A large percentage of 2-squares examples are simple combinations. My uncle told me to expand the concept to obtain "Law of 3-Squares". The 3-square examples are generally complicated combinations.


