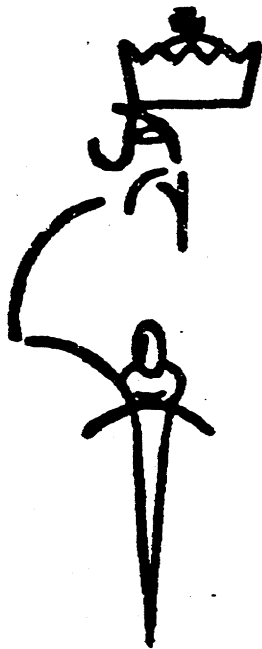

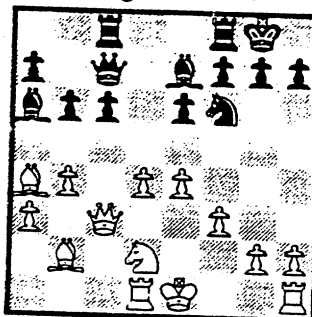
## Chess Challenge

Diagram 2 is difficult to solve. Hint: you must be able to use Black's Q if you are to succeed. The winning line is about six (6) moves deep.

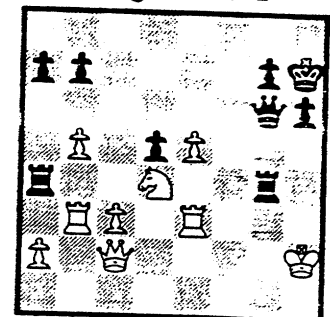

## ALTERNATE PROPOSAL TO CHANGE PLAYOFF TIE-BREAKER

### INTRODUCTION

A proposal has been put forth to use game points as the primary playoff tie-breaker. It has been referred to as MY proposal. It is not. It was put forth by Tim Williams and Case last year, and temporarily adopted during the playoffs. I simply fulfilled my duty as Secretary in compiling it, since the people pushing it last year seemed to drop the ball afterward. However, the FOLLOWING is MY proposal to change the tie-breaker.

As long as we are changing the rule, let's do it right. Let's use the method adopted by the people with the most experience at this. The proposed method is used at the US Amateur Team Championship (see attached note from USCF TD Al Losoff), and is defined in the USCF rule book. We can make game points the secondary tie-breaker (if needed), or stick with our own unique secondary tie-breakers if so desired, which I have included in the below wording.

The reworded relevant section of our rules under this proposal would read:

### PROPOSAL

#### E. TROPHIES

Trophies will be awarded to the top three teams of the playoff tournament. The tie-break method will be as described in the next paragraph. Teams still tied will share equally in the honors and trophies, unless there are not enough trophies allotted

(e.g., if the tie extends beyond third place). Then the tie-break methods of Section II.1 will be applied, replacing the words "regular season" with "playoffs".

For each round, the final score of the opposing team is multiplied by the number of points scored against that team. For example, if Team A scores 2.5 points against team B which FINISHES with 3 points, the tie-breaker for Team A for that round is  $2.5 \times 3 = 7.5$ . The sum of such computations for each round is the tie-breaker.

If it passes, the membership might wish to consider a separate amendment to use game points as a secondary tie-breaker.

ADDENDUM - Note from USCF TD Alan Losoff

In a round robin, such as the normal season, game points are the best tie-breaker. Everybody played the same teams.

In a Swiss, you don't all play the same teams, so game points are an indication of the WEAKNESS of your opposition.

If two teams have the identical score but, one has won all of its matches by 4-0 and the other by 2.5-1.5, the argument can be made that the first team played an easier field, and should get LESS tie-break.

The US Amateur Team method tries to address this, by multiplying board points times the number of points the opposing

team scored. It's complicated, but probably fairest. Total match points scored by opponents would be a better tie-break than board points, and surprisingly, total board points scored by opponents would make a good secondary TB - even though this is likely to be the reverse of total board points scored by my team.

## Tactics and Technique

Note: Examples shown in this column are taken from actual CIGL games. In most cases, names have been omitted to protect the identities of the players. (My thanks to Dennis Leong for transcribing scoresheets to computer text)

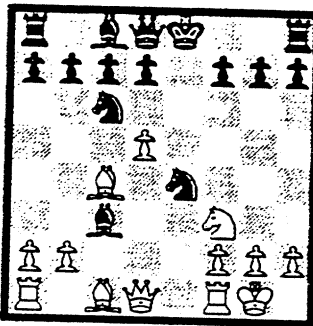
### The Opening -

A classic opening such as the **Giucco Piano** is extremely sensitive to even the slightest deviation from "book".

So, when an opponent deviates ever so slightly from the bookline in the Giucco Piano, **Robert Morris** of Motorola, playing the White pieces here uses this occasion to create the following work of chess art.

**Robert Morris (2070) White vs. a 1720 (Black):** 1.e4 e5 2.Bc4 Bc5 3.Nf3 Nc6 4.c3 Nf6 5.d4 exd4 6.cxd4 Bb4+ 7.Nc3 Nxe4 8.0-0 Bxc3 9.d5

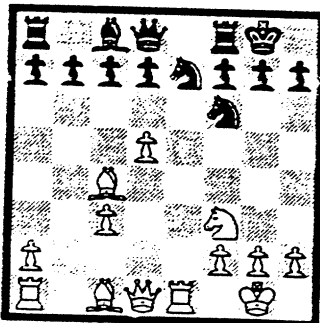
White has transposed from Bishop's Opening to the Giucco Piano (Moeller Attack).

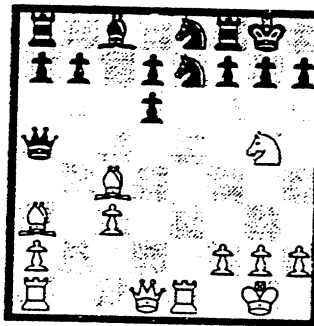

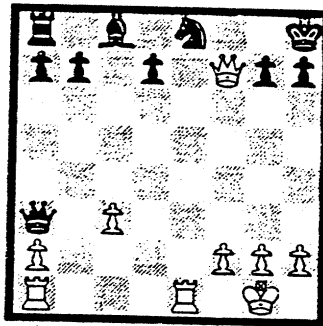

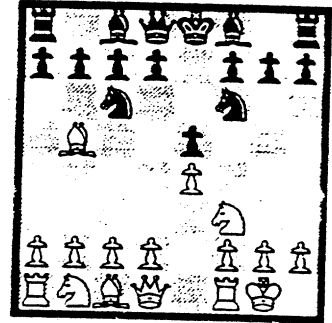
The Ruy Lopez is also sensitive to the slightest variation from book.

The reason why, after 1.e4 e5 2.Nf3 Nc6 3.Bb5 a6, White doesn't win a pawn with 4.Bxc6 followed by 5.Nxe5 can disappear when Black veers off the book line.

Another danger for Black in the

Ruy is the indiscriminate taking of White's e-pawn.

Here's a demo **H. da Motta** (1899) of Fermilabs conducts on the above basics in the Ruy Lopez: **H. da Motta (White) vs. a 1436 (Black)** 1.e4 e5 2.Nf3 Nc6 3.Bb5 Nf6 4.0-0



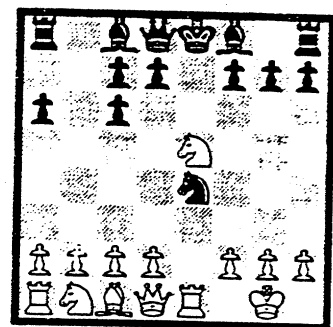
This is the Berlin Defense in the Ruy Lopez. I believe that the "book" offers Black three choices here: 4...d6, 4...Nxe4 (the Berlin) or 4...Bc5.

After 1.e4 e5 2.Nf3 Nc6 3.Bb5 a6, I think the reason why White doesn't win a pawn with 4.Bxc6 dxc6 5.Nxe5 is 5...Qd4 (or 4...bxc6 5.Nxe5 is 5...Qg4).

What makes a lot of difference here's that White has already castled so that the standard defensive mechanism against Bxc6 and Nxe5 doesn't operate anymore.

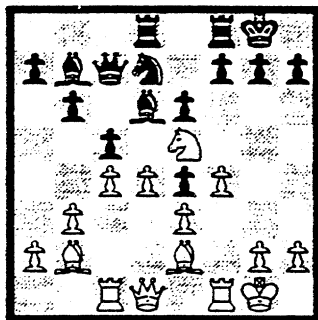


The mask is a basic pattern which has earned the respect of most masters.

So, whenever an opponent's rook shows up on the same file as the Q, the Q usually moves away immediately from the file - even if there are several pieces between the Rook and the Q.

Here Pat Sajbel (1785) of UOP, playing the Black pieces here against a 1695, exploits the mask with deadly accuracy when White fails to immediately move the Q away the moment Sajbel's rook steps onto the same file as White's Q.
