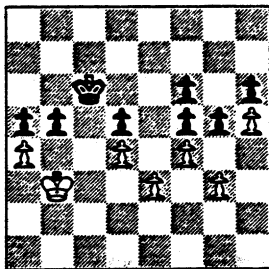

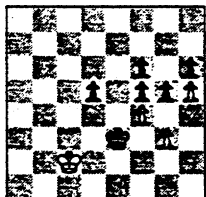
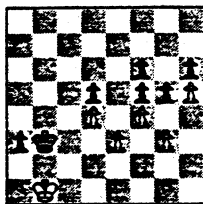

Black continued with 44...b4 and had to reluctantly accept a draw as his K couldn't penetrate.

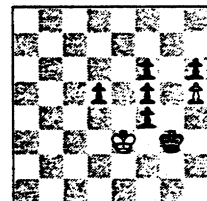
There are two methods for winning the position above after 44...bxa4.

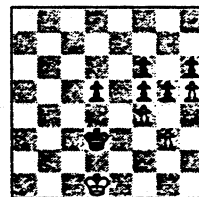


**Method 1:** Leave the passed pawn and go after the opposition's other pawns. For example, 1....Kc3 2.Ka2 Kd3 3.Kxa3 Kxd3 4. Kb3 Kxd4 5.Kc2 Ke3 (see diagram left.) If now 6.Kd1 then 6...Kf3 7.Kd2 Kxg3 8.Ke3gxf4+

(diagram right) when White won't be able to stop either of Black's d or f-pawn from queening.



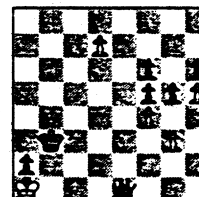
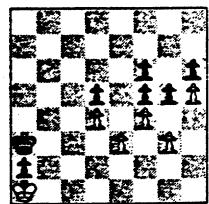
However, after 6.Kd1, Black can queen the d-pawn with the reply 6...Ke6



(see diagram left) where White is forced to give up the square d1. If now 7.Kc1 then 7... Ke2 or if 7.Ke1 then 7...Kc2 when there's no

stopping Black from escorting the d-pawn to d1 (8...d4, 9...d3, 10...d2, 11...d1Q).

**Method 2:** Cause the opposing K into a stalemate position: 1. ...a2+ 2.Ka1 Ka3 (diagram right) when White can only make pawn moves.



For example, 3. e4 when 3...dxe4 ((not 3...fxe4 4.f5 e3 5.g4 e2 stale-mate) 4.d5 e3 5.d6 e2 6.d7 e1(Q)++ is mate. (see diagram left).

White may try 3.fxg5 but after 3...fxg5 (not 3...fxg5 as White queens the h-pawn) 4. g4 fxg4 5.d4 g3 6.exd5 g2 7.d6 g1(Q)++ White still gets mated.

**I. CONSTITUTION**

**B. CONDUCT**

**1. Expected Conduct**

The actions and behavior of CICL members at sponsored activities (business meetings, matches, tournaments, banquets etc.) shall be in accordance with the spirit of fair play and good sportsmanship. The following is a list of actions and behaviors that are considered inappropriate and not accepted by the CICL. The list serves as an example and is not intended to be exhaustive.

- Repeated or gross violation of the Constitution.
- Disruptive behavior.
- Cheating in a game of chess.
- Deliberate misrepresentation of a teams roster or individual ratings.
- Participating in a tournament under a false name or while under suspension.
- Offensive racial remarks, profanity, or threats of physical harm directed at another CICL member.
- Intentional pushing, shoving, hitting, punching of another CICL member.

**2. Procedures For Improper Conduct**

At each sponsored CICL event, a member is in charge of the activity (e.g. the President at business meetings, home team captains at matches, tournament directors, banquet chairman). With this responsibility comes the authority to take appropriate action whenever a member's actions or behavior is contrary to our rules of conduct, or whenever a complaint is brought to his attention concerning another member.

The person in charge will first try to resolve the matter amicably. If this is not possible, he will take the following steps, in this order:

- a. Officially warn the offender of his improper conduct.
- b. Give a second warning to the offender.
- c. Ask the offender to leave the meeting/activity.

Items b. or c. will require a written notification, with witness names if possible, to the league President. The offender is encourages to do the same.

Note: At business meetings the League President conducts these meetings according to Robert's Rules of Order (Article I.D.1.). In this capacity, he has authority to end or Table discussions as necessary.

**\*\*Conduct Proposal (continued)\*\***

The league President will read or distribute copies of the notifications at the next scheduled business meeting.

The league Officers will meet to review the situation and determine what level of sanction, if any, to apply to the offender. The Officers will act objectively and fairly and gather as much information about the incident as reasonably practicable, including discussions with the parties involved.

The decision of the Officers will be printed in the Bulletin.

**3. Sanctions**

The following sanctions may be imposed by the Officers:

- a. A written reprimand and warning.
- b. Suspensions from the next scheduled match, meeting, tournament, banquet or other event.
- c. A one year suspension from all league activity.
- d. Expulsion from the league.

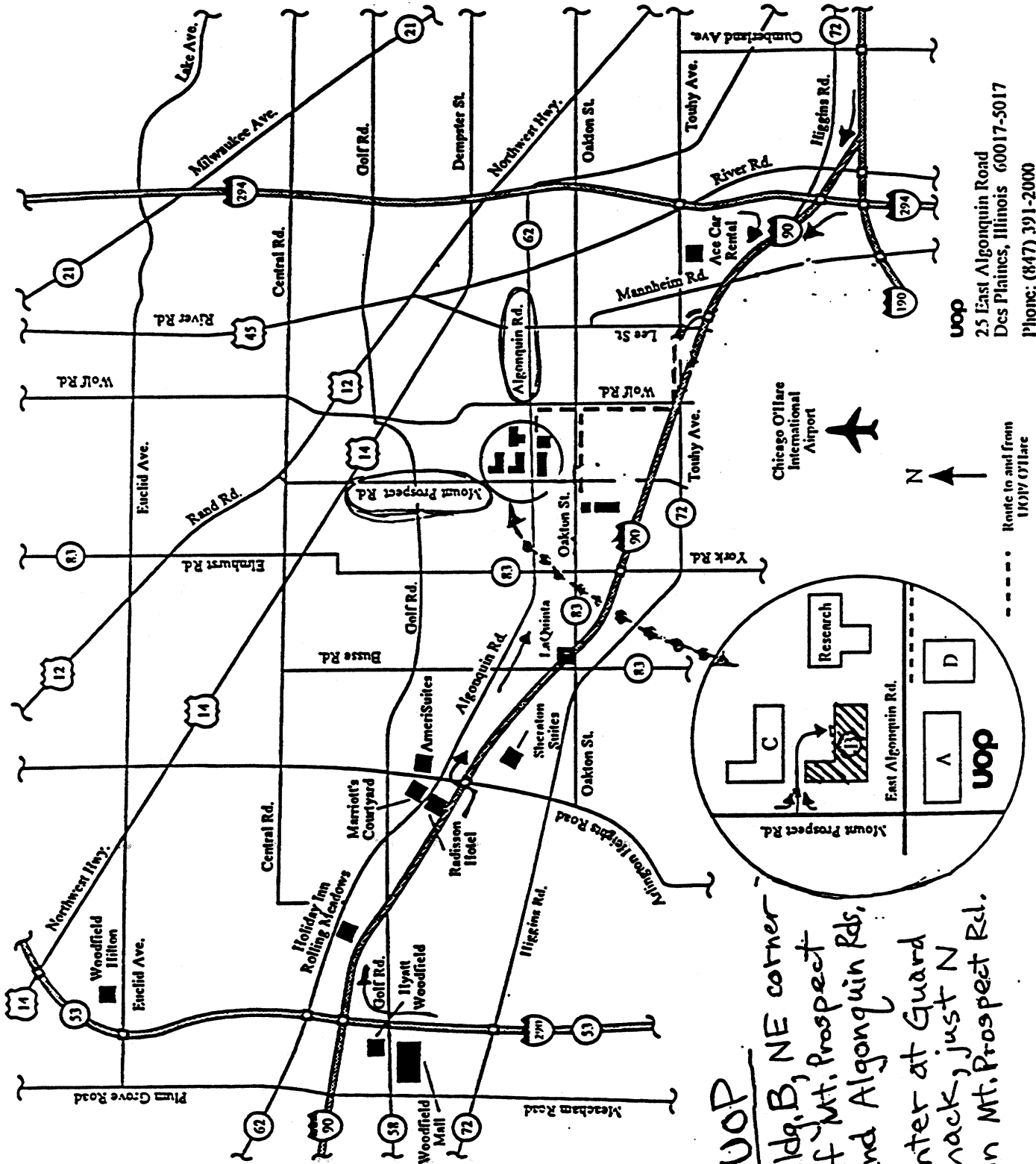
