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Hello everyone.

This issue contains a great deal of material from our games editor Tom Friske, who in fact gave me so much to publish that I did not put all of it in this issue. This month has some chess puzzles from actual CICL games from the current season. For those of you interested in testing your eye for tactics, be sure to check them out.

CICL President **Tony Jasaitis** has volunteered to direct the CICL Playoffs. Tony also put a lot of effort into a search for a suitable and inexpensive playoff site when it became evident that the CA facility would not be available to us on playoff Saturday, May 8 this year. Several possibilities were checked out, and a site has been selected. The playoffs and 2<sup>nd</sup> Tier event will be held at **Wat Dhammaram**, the Thai Buddhist Temple, at **7059 W. 75<sup>th</sup> Street** in **Chicago, IL 60638-5934** (<http://watdhammaram.org/?name=aboutus>). Here are some directions:

**From Harlem Ave (Route 43) turn east onto 75<sup>th</sup> street. Follow 75th about 1/2 mile. It will be immediately after Nottingham Park on the right (south side of the street). There is only one gate entrance. If you are on 75th you cannot miss it. Then pull around to the back entrance. Look for the Midway Chess Club sign.**

**There is a Harlem exit on I-55, and I-55 can be reached from I-294 near LaGrange Rd (Rt 45), or through the downtown interchanges as well as Lake Shore Drive. At the Harlem exit from I-55 (Stephenson Expwy), you are about 5300 South and so you will need to go south on Harlem to get to the site.**

At press time, a decision has not been made as to whether the second tier event will be an individual tournament or a four-person team event. As of now, the playoff director has had insufficient input from interested league members to discern a preference, but a decision is expected very shortly. Meanwhile, those of you who have been monitoring chess events worldwide already know that another championship is happening overseas. At press time, in Sofia, Bulgaria, after a stunning loss in game 1 against a prepared variation, defending World Champion **Viswanathan Anand** has come back and taken a 2 ½ - 1 ½ lead on challenger **Veselin Topalov** through four games. Game five is scheduled for Friday, April 30, 2010 at 3 PM, EEST, which is 11 PM CDT. (There is an eight hour time difference between Chicago and Sofia).

Also, the spring business meeting took place on April 14, 2010 at Molex in Lisle. The minutes from that meeting as prepared by CICL Secretary Jerry Thomas are included in this bulletin, along with CICL Treasurer Paul Freidel's budget report.

The annual CICL awards banquet will once again be at the Alpine Banquet Haus in Westchester, IL. The date is Friday, June 4, 2010 and our guest speaker will be **National Master Dr. Steven Tennant**, who has had many interesting over-the-board encounters with some of the big names of American chess from decades past. Dr. Tennant played board one for team CICL in the recent U.S. Amateur Team North championship. See you all there!

**MINUTES**

President Tony Jasaitis called the meeting to order at 7:02 P.M.

**1. OFFICERS REPORTS:**

**A. President – Tony Jasaitis**

Tony mentioned a couple of new teams for next season. One is a medical type group in the downtown area and the other was Northeastern University with a near north side campus. Tony will invite these prospects to the individual or team tournament on playoff Saturday.

**B. Secretary – Jerry Thomas**

Jerry said there were no changes to the fall business meeting minutes published in the bulletin.

**C. Treasurer – Paul Freidel (via email)**

Paul Freidel provided a report showing the year-to-date CICL financial Activities (the CICL YTD budget, see web site link). We are projecting about a \$100 surplus based on minimal cost for the banquet speaker.

Trophy costs will be higher. There are a bumper crop (8) of Centurion awards and the new Biggest Game and Team Upset awards

Irwin asked if the \$330 in late team dues was going to be collected. Tony replied that all but \$120 was coming in with BIGE (Enterprise) and JUDO (Hornets) owing the \$120.

Budget for 1 copy of an Access program to be used in the Rating Rewrite needs to be added. This is a capital expenditure and our current surplus comes from including capital funds to purchase laptop computers. Since league laptop computers are not needed, these funds are available. See New Business for Rating Rewrite details.

Proposal: Use up to \$200 to purchase 1 copy of Access for the Rating Chairman.

Vote: For – Unanimous Proposal adopted

**D. Division Chairmen:**

**West-Irwin Gaines, Chairman**

Irwin said the Downers Grove Chess Club is 1<sup>st</sup> and St. Charles Chess Club is 2<sup>nd</sup>. The Tyros and Yorktown were playing matches this week and could change the standings between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> place. After the meeting, Yorktown wound up in 3<sup>rd</sup> and the Tyros is fourth. The first three teams for sure are in the playoffs and the 4<sup>th</sup> place team probably will be in as a wild card team. All teams agreed to participate in the playoffs.

Irwin explained that 5 matches involving Enterprise and the Hornets are unplayed. He accepted their delays since it does not have playoff implications. He will give them until 5/7 to play. If teams play after that, games will be rated and it will be considered an exhibition match.

**North-Jim Thomson, Chairman**

Jim said Motorola Knights finished first, UOP was second, and Motorola Kings were third. The Motorola Knights and UOP have agreed to participate in the playoffs. There are 2 non-playoff affecting matches to be played.

**East-Tony Jasaitis for Fred Furtner, Chairman**

Tony said DRW Trading is 1<sup>st</sup>, Blue Cross/Blue Shield is 2<sup>nd</sup>, and Northwestern finished third. DRW Trading and Blue Cross/Blue Shield qualified for the playoffs. Loyola and one other team have to complete some matches.

**2. OTHER REPORTS:**

**A. Bulletin, Webmaster-Marty Franek**

**BULLETIN:** Marty asked for more contributions from league members. Attendees suggested using something from old bulletins. Marty will investigate that. Marty really needs more annotated games and attendees agreed to mention that need to their players.

**WEB:** Marty has received requests from other sites to post their links on our site. He will do an initial review of the sites and then ask our membership to review the site after the link is posted and give him feedback.

**B. Games Editor -Tom Friske**

**GAMES Editor:** Tom said scoresheets have come in pretty steadily and 75% were in after Tony's push for more. Providing stamped addressed envelopes to captains and requiring both the home and away captain to submit the scoresheets was suggested. Northwestern, BIGE (Enterprise), the Rooks, and JUDO (Hornets) were the biggest offenders. The new team captains probably are unaware of this requirement and Tony will remind them. Tom promised 10-15 pages of annotated games for the bulletin.

**C. Rating Chairman-Art Olsen via phone**

Art said the rating committee would work on rating revisions during the summer. The committee will:

- Rewrite the rating program in Access (a more widely used current programming language).
- Investigate ways to get better ratings for new players (perhaps via a Bonus system, 10 game provisional rating, higher K factor).
- Other changes to improve rating accuracy.
- Reduce the effort of the ratings chairman.
- Automate the rating process aimed for faster updates.

**D. Publicity Chairman-Matt Vail (not present)**

Matt was out of town and there was no report. Publicity is doing well with new teams added this season.

**E. Banquet Chairman-Katherine Zack (given by Tony Jasaitis)**

Date: Friday June 4

Place, cost, food, directions etc. is the same as last year. Katherine contacted some other sites and she couldn't improve on our current site of Alpine.

Banquet speaker: Steve Tennant will be our guest speaker. There will be a lecture and the speed tournament. Based on last year's banquet, there is not enough time for a lecture and an exhibition.

Commitment: We need to give a number to Alpine like last year.

Speed chess: Art agreed to conduct the speed tournament.

**F. Trophy Chairman-Mia Pillarella (not present, Marty Franek supplied)**

This year's budget was discussed under the Treasurer's budget report. Marty said the determination of what award a team got required a lot of work and follow-up. Marty will work to reduce this and get the captains involved to decide faster. The Team default award will be a trophy if the captains do not provide a choice.

**3. ELECTIONS**

**A. President**

Tony Jasaitis agreed to continue if no nominees. There were no other nominees. Tony was unanimously elected.

**B. Secretary**

Jerry Thomas agreed to continue. There were no other nominees. Jerry was unanimously elected.

**C. Treasurer**

Paul Freidel agreed to continue. There were no other nominees. Paul was unanimously elected.

**D. Publicity Chair (Appointed)**

Matt Vail agreed to continue.

**E. Division Chairmen (Elected by division captains)**

Jim Thomson, Irwin Gaines, and Fred Furtner agreed to continue.

**4. PLAYOFFS****A. Determine Playoff Teams**

The playoff teams are: DRW Trading, Blue Cross/Blue Shield, Motorola Knights, UOP, Downers Grove Chess Club, St. Charles Chess Club, Yorktown, and Tyros. All teams committed to playing in the playoffs

**B. TD(s)**

Tony Jasaitis said he would be playoff TD. Fred Furtner will help Tony with the individual or 2<sup>nd</sup> tier team tournament. Art will also help if he is not playing.

**C. Determine Site**

No playoff site has been chosen. Loyola offered their site via their captain. It is unclear whether we have or need official university approval. Parking is limited and it is costly. With expressway construction, travel time will be significant especially for the 4 West division teams.

Tony ruled out Grace Church since liability insurance would be required from us.

The Buddhist temple (75<sup>th</sup> and Harlem) was offered. The league would have to provide a \$100 donation.

Perhaps BP or Molex site could be the site. Dan McGowan agreed to check this out. The Molex site would be in our current meeting building and use multiple rooms. An answer is needed within the next week. Subsequent to the meeting, Dan reported that neither BP or Molex will be available for the playoffs.

**D. 2<sup>nd</sup> Tier Event**

Tony agreed to email the league to see how many 4-player teams were interested in a 3 round Swiss. Based on the response he would decide on whether to hold a team tournament or an individual tournament. See Old Business item A.

**4. OLD BUSINESS****A. Tournament Choice for Playoff Saturday**

Proposal: The individual tournament would be the preferred Playoff Saturday tournament unless there is overwhelming support for a team tournament.

Vote: For – 6 Against – 3 Abstain – 0 Proposal Adopted

**5. NEW BUSINESS****A. Banquet Details**

Banquet will be same time and site as last year. See Banquet Chair report.

**B. Summer Chess Activities (Norm Hughes via email)**

Project 1: You asked me to look into whether the site at “ChessBoss” would be able to host our internet match if we had one. I have sent three inquiries to the site and have not heard from him. So we can hang this site up.

Project 2: Internet match with Bankers Athletic League (BAL)- I have contacted them to see if they would like to play during the summer. They are looking forward to it. The format should be as when we played two years ago and they agreed that that was the best format. More to follow.

Summer chess – Only 6 responses to Warren Juniors match which is disappointing. Tony will email again. Matt found a library that is open on Sunday for this. Norm and Tom Friske cannot do a Sunday. 1400-Master level players

are needed. 1700-2150 rated players have responded. Our last match was 10-12 boards.

An **Inter-Divisional All-Star match** was suggested. It would be a 2 round Swiss. Irwin Gaines and Len Weber agreed to pursue this.

### C. Untimely Scoresheet Submission

The attendees discussed making it easier via stamped addressed envelopes and penalizing the offenders. No conclusion was reached.

### D. Form Summer Committee to Review / Upgrade Rating System

Art Olsen, Jim Thomson, and Jeff Balicki are working on upgrading the rating system. Jim described our current rating system and its problems. Jim will rewrite the rating program in Access since the current program is in an obsolete hard to maintain language. Details on the changes being considered are in the Rating Chairman report.

### E. Encourage Games Submitted

The attendees wanted more annotated games, commentary about matches, and information about the context of games to the match results. How could we get more of this interesting material for the bulletin? Fred Furtner takes pictures at matches, sends them, and that generates comments. Tom Friske asked that the "Reinstituting the Best Annotated Game Award" be placed on the Fall Meeting agenda. The attendees agreed.

*Our narrator opens the story with introductions and paints a scene on a cross-Atlantic journey by ship. While executing a stake-out plan to meet the recluse chess champion named Czentovic, whom was discovered on board, he gets lost in revelry:*

“I had never in my life had an opportunity to make the personal acquaintance of a chess champion, and the more I now sought to form an impression of such a temperament, the more unimaginable appeared to me a mind absorbed for a lifetime in a domain of sixty-four black and white squares. From my own experience I was well aware of the mysterious attraction of the “royal game,” which, alone among the games devised by man, regally eschews the tyranny of chance and awards its palms of victory only to the intellect, or rather to a certain type of intellectual gift. But is it not already an insult to call chess anything so narrow as a game? Is it not also a science, an art, hovering between these categories like Muhammad’s coffin between heaven and earth, a unique yoking of opposites, ancient and yet eternally new, mechanically constituted and yet an activity of the imagination alone, limited to a fixed geometric area but unlimited in its permutations, constantly evolving and yet sterile, a cogitation producing nothing, a mathematics calculating nothing, an art without an artwork, an architecture without substance and yet demonstrably more durable in its essence and actual form than all books and works, the only game that belongs to all peoples and all eras, while no one knows what god put it on earth to deaden boredom, sharpen the mind, and fortify the spirit? Where does it begin, where does it end? Any child can learn its basic rules, any amateur can try his hand at it; and yet, within the inalterable confines of a chessboard, masters unlike any others evolve, people with a talent for chess and chess alone, special geniuses whose gifts of imagination, patience and skill are just as precisely apportioned as those of mathematicians, poets, and musicians, but differently arranged and combined. In earlier times, when there was a rage for physiognomy, a Gall might have dissected the brains of such chess champions to determine whether there was a special convolution in their gray matter, a kind of chess muscle or a chess bump more strongly marked than in the skulls of others. And how excited such a physiognomist would have been by the case of a Czentovic in whom this narrow genius seems embedded in absolute intellectual inertia like a single gold thread in a hundred-weight of barren rock. In principle I have always found it easy to understand that such a unique,

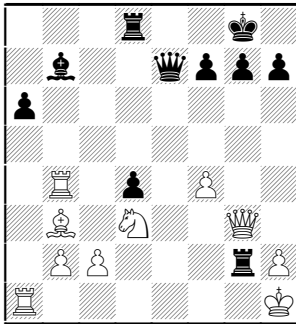
ingenious game would have to produce its own wizards. Yet how difficult, how impossible it is to imagine the life of an intellectually active person who reduces the world to a shuttle between black and white, who seeks fulfillment in a mere to-and-fro, forward-and-back of thirty-two pieces, someone for whom a new opening that allows the knight to be advanced instead of a pawn is in itself a great accomplishment and a meager little piece of immortality in a corner on a chess book – someone, someone with a brain in his head, who, without going mad, continues over and over for ten, twenty, thirty, forty years to devote all the force of his thought to the ridiculous end of cornering a wooden king on a wooden board!

“And now that one such phenomenon, one strange genius or mysterious simpleton was for the first time physically quite nearby, six cabins away from me on the same ship, alas! I, for whom curiosity about things of the mind is more and more becoming a kind of passion, was unable to approach him. I began to think up the most absurd ruses: I would tickle his vanity by pretending to interview him for an important newspaper, perhaps; or pique his avarice by proposing a lucrative tournament in Scotland. But finally I remembered a hunter’s trick, that the most reliable technique for decoying the wood grouse was to imitate its mating call. What could be more effective in attracting the attention of a chess champion than to play chess oneself?”

Now I have never in my life been a serious chess player; my dealings with the game have been purely frivolous, for pleasure alone. If I spend an hour in front of the board, this is by no means to exert myself but, on the contrary, to relieve emotional tension. I “play” chess in the truest sense, while the others, the real chess players, “work” at it, if I may use the word in this daring new way. But, in chess as in love, a partner is indispensable, and at that time I did not yet know if there were other chess lovers on board apart from us. To lure them out of their holes, I laid a primitive trap in the smoking room. Though my wife’s game is even weaker than my own, she and I, the bird-catchers, sat at a chessboard. And in fact someone passing through paused for a moment before we had made even six moves and a second asked permission to look on; finally the desired partner turned up too, and challenged me to a game.”

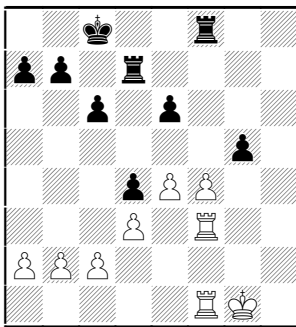

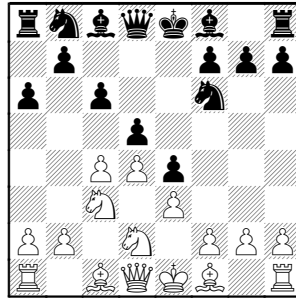


At first glance, one would expect Black's advanced Pawn to be an easy target, especially after Nc3,g3,Bg2,Qc2.

**4...c6** Black is ready to play d7-d5, and suddenly his position feels

spacious.

**5.e3 d5 6.Nc3 a6**

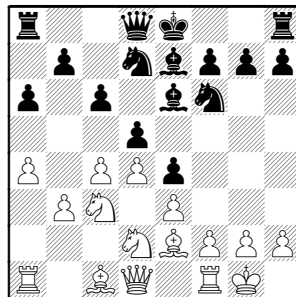


There's several differences, but in the QGD Slav system there is a similar Pawn structure where c4-c5 is a prized move, securing Queenside space and hopefully creating Pawn enemy weaknesses there.

White plays another way of hindering Black's Queenside while keeping options open in the center.

**7...Be7 8.Be2 Be6 9.0-0 Nbd7 10.b3**

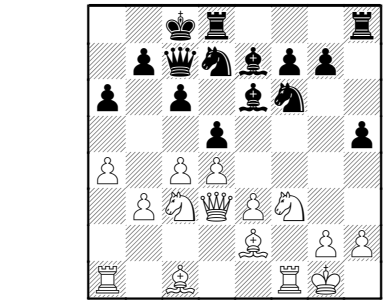

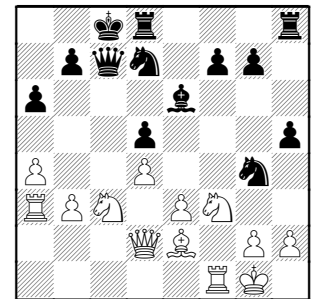
Since White threatens no opening of the position, Black begins a flank attack where most of his pieces point. Maybe g4 can be an coming outpost.
