Match Doints Come Doints

Argonne Pawns, W. E. Gambiteers Move Up in Standings. The Western Electric Chargers, who have not scored less than 6½ points in any match and seem to be serious about challenging Argonne's domination of first place for the last two years, rolled over Illinois Bell and Motorola 7-1 and $7\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$, respectively. The Argonne Pawns moved into a clear fourth by beating Goss Printing $4\frac{1}{2}-3\frac{1}{2}$. The Argonne Knights downed Stewart-Warner/Sunbeam 7-1 to keep pace with the Bishops and Chargers. The Western Electric Gambiteers defeated Hall-Roto $5\frac{1}{2}-2\frac{1}{2}$ to move into a tie for sixth place. Goss Printing also won over Hall-Roto, $5\frac{1}{2}-2\frac{1}{2}$ to enter the win column. Goss and Stewart-Warner/Sunbeam have faced the toughest onposition in the first three or four rounds. Six of the fifteen matches in the first three rounds were decided by one point or less.

Fischer wins Title For 7th Time. Chess prodigy Bobby Fischer of Brooklyn defeated Dr. Karl Burger in the last round to win the U. S. Chess Championship for a record seventh time. 22-year-old Fischer, who first became champion at 14, finished one point ahead of Grandmasters Robert Byrne of Indianapolis and former champion Samuel Reshevsky of Spring Valley, New York with a score of $8\frac{1}{2}-2\frac{1}{2}$.

Martz Wins North Central. The annual North Central Open, held in Milwaukee over Thanksgiving weekend was won by William Martz of Hartland, Wisconsin by a score of $6\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$. 2nd to 6th places went to Curt Brasket, Charles Weldon, Albert Sandrin, Ivan Theodorovich and Martin Safer. Angelo Sandrin of the Argonne Bishops finished 8th with $5\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$. 131 players participated.




