Unsets are Rule in February, March Matches. The Western Electric Chargers widened their lead to 12 match points by sinking Stewart-Warner/Sunbeam 7-1. The Argonne Pawns moved into second place by upsetting the Bishops and Knights in sucfessive matches by identical scores of 5-3 and drawing with Motorela 4-4. The Western Electric Gambiteers overtook Motorola by winning their February match 5\frac{1}{2}-2\frac{1}{2}.


