NOMINATING COMMITTEE AND ELECTIONS

Steve Schwartz of Sears and Ron Dargis of R. R. Donnelley have agreed to serve as the Nominating Committee for election of officers for the 1971-72 year. If anyone has any nominations to make for an elective office (President, Chairman-Senior Division, Chairman-Junior Division, Vice President-Secretary, Treasurer), please notify either committee member. All nominees should read the Policies and Rules of the CICL to determine the duties and responsibilities of the position for which they are running.

It has been previously agreed not to hold elections at the banquet in order to save time at that important event. It had been thought that a business meeting would be held before the banquet in order to hold this election, however previous experience has shown that not all teams are represented at these meetings. In order to insure that each team gets a chance to vote, a mail ballot will be used. The names of all nominees and a brief biography of each will be presented in the next bulletin. A blank ballot will also be enclosed. This ballot is to be filled out by each team captain and mailed to Ron Dargis. Representatives of the Senior Division will be allowed two votes each, while Junior Division representatives will be given one vote each. The deadline for returning ballots is Monday, June 14th. The new officers will be introduced at the banquet on Friday, June 18th.

THE MIGHTY FALL

There are no longer any teams with perfect records in the CICL. The previously undefeated ArgonneX alumni team of the Junior Division met their fate at the hands of the R. R. Donnelley "A" team. After eight consecutive victories, they fell 3-1. Previously undefeated Vincent Puchala, who had alone managed to avoid defeat the previous evening at the simultaneous exhibition, was beaten by Ron Dargis contributing to the upset. Procon is now the only remaining undefeated Junior Division team.

A MASTERFUL EXHIBITION

On Tuesday, March 23rd, twenty-one stalwarts of the CICL met at Illinois Bell Telephone in an effort to defeat Master Greg DeFotis in a simultaneous exhibition. None succeeded. Young Greg, sporting a USCF rating of 2393 had 20 victories and 1 tie. Congratulations to Vincent Puchala of the ArgonneX team who secured the lone draw. The two who held out the longest before succumbing were Gary Benson of Bell Labs and Ron Dargis of R. R. Donnelley. Both of these games exceeded 75 moves. The others who tried valiantly to no avail were Ray Lauth, Ray Rode and Alan Barker of Illinois Bell Telephone, Terry Andresen and Steve Schwartz of Sears, Vern Stamm and Ed Radavicius of Western Electric, Ron Langenberg, Adolph Brosig and Lee Stensaker of Signode, John Ason and Jim Duffy of Bell Labs, Charlie Stevens, John Greczek, Bill Poppe and Richard Lee of Amoco, Chester Lee of Continental Can Company and Jim Brotos of DeSoto, Inc.

ONE GOOD TURN DESERVES ANOTHER

Notes:

- (a) Now White has 3 pieces developed for the sacrificed pawn.
- (b) 8. B-N5+ with the threat of 9. N-K5 is more aggressive.
- (c) This sets off a trade which places Black's Knight in the rim of the chessboard.
- (d) Since White was planning to capture the pawn with the Knight at N5, he made this preparatory move to deprive the Black Knight of 22...N-B2.
- (e) It seemed better to capture a more central, advancing pawn than the rook pawn which can be gobbled later.
- (f) Now White has won back the gambit pawn plus a bonus, but Black finally has effectively placed pieces.
- (g) Now with 31...R-K3!, 32.R-QB8, R-Q3 Black poses serious problems including a mating threat.
- (h) Black had assumed his King would be able to cut off the advancing Pawn. But now the knights turned into voracious dragons and ate Black alive.


ALL-STAR MATCH

BLACK 9




WHITE 8

COMPUTER CHESS CHAMP

There were no pom-pom girls there, but it was as competitive as any football game ever played at Dyche Stadium. And the best part was that NU won the title.

Chess 3.0, a program of the University's CDC 6400 computer, captured the winners trophy in the First United States Computer Chess Championship held in New York in August and September. The U.S. Chess Federation-sanctioned match was part of the 25th Annual Conference of the Association for Computing Machinery.

The program is the brainchild of three Northwestern alumni - Larry Atkin 69, Keith Gorlen 70 and Dave Slate 66. The three now are working in the computer field.

In the New York tournament Chess 3.0 topped five other programs, including entries from personnel at the University of Alberta, Carnegie-Mellon, Texas A&M and NASA Goddard. The CDC 6400 took all three of its matches.

Teletype carried the game moves from Evanston's Vogelback Computing Center to New York. Gorlen handled the game in New York, with Slate and Atkin monitoring the program at Vogelback.

It seems only fair to mention that in a mixed human-computer competition last spring, Chess 3.0 ranked only 13th of 24 players competing.
