

CHICAGO INDUSTRIAL CHESS LEAGUE BULLETIN

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30-30 SWISS PLANNED FOR FEBRUARY 13th

The Swiss Tournament will be held at Albright Gym of Western Electric, 4921 West 22nd Street, just west of Cicero Avenue. The time for registration will be 9:15 - 9:30 A.M. The 1st round will begin shortly thereafter. The tournament is planned for five rounds and should end by 7:00 P.M.

All members of the League including Bell & Howell employees are welcome to enter the event. Also, friends and relatives of the League are invited to participate. The entry fee is \$2.00. All proceeds plus \$10 from the treasury will be converted into cash prizes for approximately the top third of the field.

The General Chairman of the event is Frank Tegel; the Tournament Director will be Jim Brotzos. The first time control will, of course, be 30 moves in 30 minutes. This will be followed by an additional 15 minutes for the next 20 moves, and finally 5 more minutes will be added to each clock with the last time control being Blitz-style. In this way we will eliminate time-consuming adjudications. Score keeping will be required during the first two time controls.

We would appreciate Team Captains surveying their members to give us a count of how many plan to attend by February 11th. Let's emphasize the fact that this tournament is a rare opportunity for players to meet others from different divisions, for lower ranked players to have the experience of playing Class A or Expert stars, and that this is the Swiss bargain of them all!

Be sure to bring a chess clock!

MORE PERSONAL SKETCHES

In Bulletin No. 1, thumbnail sketches were given on some of our League leaders. As a result of this article, a request was received that we included such sketches on Jim Brotsos and Jim Warren. The following are printed accordingly:

Jim Warren -- Rating Chairman

Jim has worked in computer systems development with Western Electric for 14 years. For 17 years he has played tournament chess (holding an expert's rating for nine of those years) and for ten years has served in various official capacities in chess administration. Jim is a charter member of the Gompers Park Chess Club.

His chess championships include: La.-Miss. Open, 1959; Austin CC, 1960; Northern Illinois Open, 1960; Gompers CC, 1961 & 1962; Oak Park CC, 1962; Gompers Swiss, 1963; Western Electric Swiss, 1964; and Class A titles from: Illinois Open, 1967; Greater Chicago Open, 1969; Wamsley Open, 1970; US Amateur, 1970. He was runner-up in: Boston Open, 1956; Massachusetts State, 1957; South New Jersey Open, 1957; Lake Ontario Open, 1957; Chicago CC Open, 1959; Gompers CC, 1962 & 1963. He also won the nation-wide Bell System Postal Chess Championship in 1969.

Jim has served as Chicago Industrial Chess League Chairman, Bulletin Editor and Problem Contest Chairman. He is a regional director of the USCF, of which he is a Life Member; and a director of the Correspondence Chess League of America.

He has given simultaneous exhibitions, worked actively in promoting prison chess and most importantly, developed a program for computing ratings, applying USCF statistician Arpad Elo's rating procedure. This program was used to determine initial CICL ratings in 1968 and an international rating list for Elo in 1969. This latter list was used in determining board placement in the USSR vs. Rest of the World Match held this year. Jim has played first board for Western Electric since he joined the team in 1959.

Jim is certainly well read in chess. He receives 15 chess periodicals regularly, and his personal chess library includes over 260 chess books and over 2000 issues of 64 different chess periodicals.

Jim Brotsos - President

Jim is Manager of Engineering, Chemical Coatings Division of DeSoto, Inc.

He began playing chess in 1954 while living in the New York area. Since then he has founded the Argentia, Nfld. Naval Station Chess Club, the IMC C.C., and the Sherwin-Williams C.C. He was also President and Team Captain of the Lakeside Press C.C. and has been a member of the Gompers Park C.C. and the DeSoto C.C.

In 1957, while at Donnelley, Jim met with M. Mejzr, J. Traeger, J. Dunworth and a handful of other leaders to form the C.I.C.L. He was the chairman of the first awards banquet, and later the Chairman of the League for two years. Jim originated the Blitz Chess tournament held at the banquet, formed the first League all star team which competed in the Greater Chicago Chess League, began the first regularly published bulletin, helped prepare the first set of policies and practices, and later helped update these. He organized the 4-man and alumni team programs which have become a key part of the C.I.C.L.

In 1962 Jim helped create the Illinois Chess Association and was its first President. He has also been a Regional Director of the U.S. Chess Federation.

Jim has no significant accomplishments as a chess player outside of a few first and second places in small chess clubs. He currently has a Class B rating in the U.S.C.F.




