POLICIES AND RULES DISTRIBUTED

In mid October each club should have received at least two copies of the revised Policies & Rules. A copy of these should be circulated to all interested members, and the Team Captains should especially review the sections on their duties and rules.

Also enclosed with this mailing were several copies of Koltanowski's booklet on 100 Shortcuts to Chess Victory. We still have a couple of hundred of these, so anyone requiring extra copies should call the Vice President-Secretary.

KEEP THE INFORMATION FLOWING!

One of the unwritten responsibilities of the Team Captain is to make sure that all his team mates are (promptly) apprised of League activities. He should also make an effort to get feedback from his membership on special events or polls and send them in without delay so that decisions can be made and action taken. So far there is some evidence that some members are not getting to see the League bulletin and don't get "the word". Beyond this, it seems that several team captains are very lackadaisical about following up on special programs and reporting their club's preferences or level of interest. Since we cannot settle all of our business at the designated meetings, the bulletin becomes an important means of announcing special activities, especially to those clubs not participating in the business meetings. It is up to the Team Captains to provide the communication link between the League administration and his team mates. Without this link, it is pointless to attempt any special events.

One last point: in most cases the home Team Captain should be able to mail the match results to his respective Division Chairman the day after the match. If this is done and if the Chairmen are alert in phoning in last minute results to the V.P.-Secretary, we should be able to publish standings that are truly current in every bulletin.

NORTH SIDE ALUMNI TEAM?

In the last couple of months, your President has been pursuing the possibility of a north side counterpart of ArgonneX. Colin Willmott has offered to be Team Captain, and has one fellow Perma-Power employee ready to play. Bob Peters formerly of C.T.&T., and Jerry Maks, formerly of Goss, have shown interest in playing on this team. We still need three or four team mates to make this venture feasible. If any of you know of candidates for Alumni team membership working or living north, it would be appreciated if you would submit their name and locations to the writer. There is still time to re-arrange the north section's playing schedule to accomodate a new team, if we can attract a couple of enthusiasts in the next few weeks.

WORKSHOP FOR C.C. LEADERS

Certainly people like Emil Strabac, Jim Warren, Walter Elliott, Dan Kumro, Don McCluskey, Nik Goncharoff, Ray Leuth, Ray Fabijonas, etc. would have many helpful suggestions for maintaining interest in the industrial club. Also, we could invite club leaders from community chess clubs to participate in this meeting and offer their recommendations.

The writer feels that a good club program stimulates team strength. If any of you would like to have such a "workshop", please notify your President. Such a meeting could be combined with our election meeting next May.

FUTURE TEAM PROSPECTS

Two new industrial chess clubs have made their debut in the last month. One is at Universal Oil Products (UOP) in DesPlaines; the other, Amoco Chemical Products in Naperville. Since both these clubs are starting off with about 25 members, they seem like good prospects for team entries into the Senior Division. 
