FISCHER VICTORIOUS

Bobby Fischer defeated Tigran Petrosian of the Soviet Union in the ninth game of their match winning the tournament, and the right to challenge world champion Boris Spassky.

Fischer was triumphant in 46 moves, scoring his fourth victory in a row and his fifth in the match. Three games ended in draws.

The biggest prize for Fischer was the opportunity to match his skill against Spassky, also of the Soviet Union, in a tournament next spring for the world's championship.

No American has ever held the world title and this is the first time in 23 years that anyone except a Soviet grand master has ever been a challenger.

It was a bitter defeat for the 42 year-old Petrosian, who was world champion from 1962 to 1969.

The tournament was scheduled to run through 12 games, but Fischer's charge in the last four made the three final games unnecessary. His win in the ninth gave him the $6\frac{1}{2}$ points required for tournament victory. Petrosian had $2\frac{1}{2}$.

Petrosian used the French defense as he had in the third game that ended in a draw.

The ninth game is recorded below.

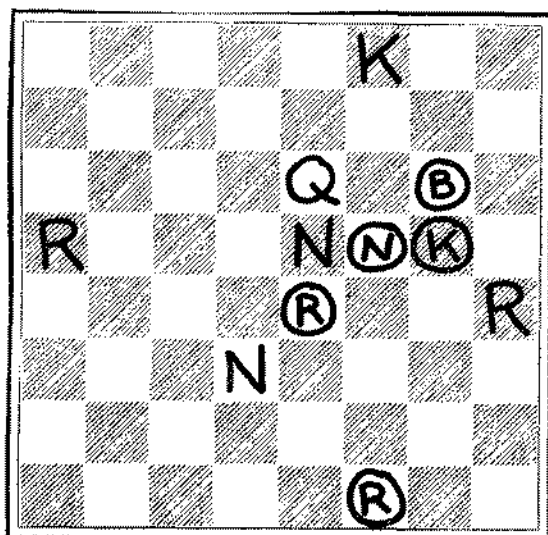

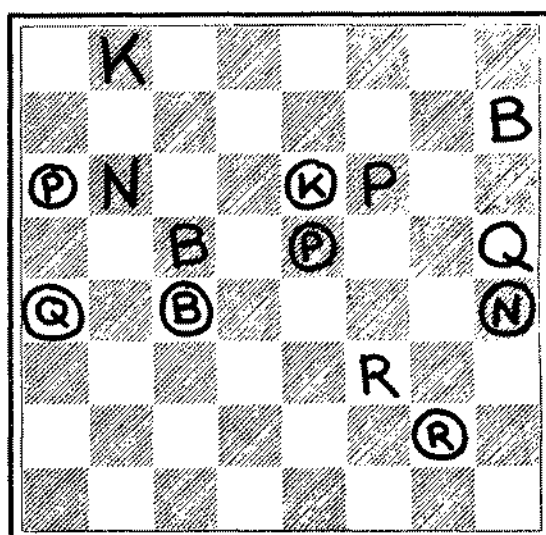
