The Argonne Knights team has a new captain. He is Jon Harkreader, and his telephone number is 739-7711, extension 3958.

There has been some discussion within the eight-man division about CICL Rule II.D.1, regarding the team captain's responsibility to rank his players in the order of current playing strength. Every team captain is expected to abide by the spirit as well as the letter of this rule. Extreme violations of the rule will be considered as grounds for possible forfeits, upon appeal. In the case of disputes arising before or during the course of the match, the discussion of the dispute should be restricted to the two captains, or their representatives, and such a discussion should be conducted in a gentlemanly manner. CICL Rule II.D.2 provides that if such a dispute cannot be resolved by the two captains, the match shall proceed in accord with the host captain's opinion. The visiting captain may later appeal to the Division Chairman for resolution of the dispute, if so desired.



## PROBLEM SOLVING CONTEST 1972-1973

Each issue of the Bulletin will pose two problems for solving. Solutions should be sent to me by the postmark deadline. You should expect difficulty to gradually increase through the year.

### Ground rules:

- (1) Correct solutions are worth as many points as the stipulated length of solution, e.g., 2 for mate in 2.
- (2) Unless otherwise stated, only the first move of the solution, i.e., the key, is required to be sent in.
- (3) If the intended solution is significantly falsified by misdiagramming or by composer's oversight, the problem will be withdrawn from competition and no points will be awarded to any solver for it.
- (4) If the deadline is erroneously omitted, assume that the effective deadline is the day the Bulletin is published.

### Some hints for solvers:

A key move probably will not deprice black of strength or mobility. You may be sure that a key that checks or captures an officer is not an intended solution. Many keys will actually give the black king mobility by releasing a guard from a square in the king's field. It frequently pays off in solving to first examine black's resources. Often white has a ready reply to a black move, as, e.g., 2. QxN after a hypothetical 1...N-K4 in problem #1. But be ready for the key to change the "prepared" mate, as happens in this case.
