# Adjournments - John Greczek

It has recently become obvious that our <u>Policies and Rules</u> do not adequately cover the question of adjourned games.

Our players seem to be getting stronger and games are lasting longer with adjournments becoming very common. Last season, we had some arguments about where an adjourned game should resume and formulated guidelines for the season. These have not as yet been ratified into the Policies and Rules. This time, there is a question on adjudication of an adjourned game. Again, our Policies and Rules do not adequately deal with adjudication. Adjudication can only be a last resort measure employed where there are special and extenuating circumstances that prevent resumption of the game. Otherwise, the game must be resumed (unless, of course, the players agree to draw or one player resigns). Also, the game should be completed even if it is not decisive in terms of the entire match. We obviously must avoid making it possible for a lost game to be expediently adjourned never to be resumed!

On a different subject, Dan Kumro has suggested speeding up the rate of play to 50 moves per 2 hours. Many match games are lasting into the wee hours of the morning, and this can be a real draw-back to participating if, on top of that, you have a long drive back home.

Let's think about these matters before our next business meeting.

# Nominating Committee Now Active - John Greczek

By mid-May or thereabouts, we hope to have a slate of candidates for the June elections of 1975-6 CICL officers. The Nominating Committee, consisting of Jim Brotsos, Lou Aldort (982-3717), Nik Goncharoff (451-1000, Ext. 4112) and Hobe Schroeder (420-5497), is on the look-out for suitable candidates. I think they have a very important job. The slate of candidates they propose will determine how well the entire CICL will function under their leadership. If you would like to be considered or if you know of another likely prospect, get in touch with the Committee. # We Will Miss Him - Jim Warren

For as long as there has been a Western Electric team in the CICL, Erwin Puto has been part of it. Erwin played on the board next to mine in many matches; he was dependable; he was loyal and a team player all the way.

In 1961, a Western Electric team effected the first whitewash in CICL history as it defeated R.R. Connelly, 8-0. Erwin Puto was on that team. Of the eight CICL championships that Western Electric has won, Erwin played on six of those teams. In the 1966-1967 season, Erwin had the best won-lost record on the Chargers, 9W, 1L, 1D.

Erwin won the Hawthorne Chess Club Championship, Class A, in 1968 and was runner-up in 1973. He won the Hawthorne Swiss in 1969. In speed tournament events, Erwin won his section at the League Awards Banquet in 1963, 1970 and 1972; and he won the Hawthorne Speed event in 1967. In a simultaneous exhibition I gave at the Albright Gym in 1968, Erwin was the sole winner.

Erwin was one of the Century Club Award winners at the 1974 annual banquet. He played more than 100 CICL games--and only two players have played more league games.

But it was in May, 1964 that Erwin's biggest chess thrill occurred; Bobby Fischer was giving a simul at the Albright Gym. The then aspiring World Champion played 50 boards, won 44, drew 5 and lost only one game--that one to Erwin Puto. Erwin didn't carry the game score around with him; he just wasn't the type for that. But he was proud of that game, as we were of him.

# CICL Third Industrial Tornado - April 13

The CICL's Third Industrial Tornado - a USCF rated open tournament - will be held Sunday, April 13, 1975, at the O'Hare Inn (Mannheim and Higgins Roads). This tournament is held to encourage USCF membership and to publicize the CICL. This is an excellent chance to become acquainted with tournament play.

There are eight guaranteed prizes:

First Overall - \$30 plus trophy Second Overall - \$20 plus trophy

Classes B, C, D, E and unrated winners will receive a trophy, as will the top CICL member winner. Other prizes will be awarded as entries permit (hopefully, a third place prize of \$10 plus trophy and others).

The tournament director will be Jim Brotsos. Competition will be a four-round Swiss style system. Time control will be 30 moves per hour. The following times will be adhered to:

8-8:30 a.m. - Registration

9:00 a.m. - Round I

12:30 p.m. - Round II

3:30 p.m. - Round III

7:00 p.m. - Round IV

Entry fee will be \$7 for USCF members (\$5 if received by Charles Ward by April 9). USCF membership is required, but the CICL can offer you the best deal in town. Membership can be purchased along with your entry. Normal membership dues are \$15 per year, but only \$12 for CICL members. In addition, if you are joining for the first time, you can get an additional \$2 off or only \$10. Remember this includes one year of "Chess Life and Review". To summarize, this means you can enter the tournament and obtain initial membership in the USCF by sending \$15 to Charles Ward now. If you register on April 13, it's still a good deal at \$17.



The First World Computer Chess Championship - Joe Brozovich (from December, 1974 Kingsmen Review)

The first all-computer chess tournament was held in New York in 1970 and six "players" participated. Last year in Atlanta, there were 12 participants and 7 others were refused admission to keep the event within

manageable proportions. A World Championship was the next logical step. This championship tournament took place in 1974 in Stockholm from August 5-9.

The pre-match favorite was Northwestern University's Chess 4.0 program which had won all four of the annual American computer tournaments without a defeat. Also from the U.S. were the programs that finished second, third and fourth in Atlanta. From Canada's Ontario University of Waterloo came "Ribbit", a new program that had recently won the first Canadian Computer Chess Championship with 4-1/2 out of 5. The most interesting entry came from the Institute of Control Science in Moscow. This program, called Kaissa, had never before played against another computer program.

The tournament was comprised of four rounds. In the first round, there were no big surprises although Tech II, one of the strongest American programs, had a tough time with Britain's Master program. In the second round, Tech II was convincingly beaten by Kaissa but the real surprise of the day was Chess 4.0's loss to its compatriot Chaos. Although Chess 4.0 had beaten Chaos before, Chaos rose to the occasion and made the first known example of a positional piece sacrifice in computer chess. (See game below.)

In the third round, Kaissa beat Chaos although an international incident almost occurred when one of the Chaos programmers typed in a wrong move. Kaissa gave mate a few moves later but Chaos replied with what appeared to be an illegal move. In the meantime, the Soviet programmer hung up the phone to Russia and it was impossible to reopen the telephone line with Russia in any reasonable amount of time. Fortunately, the whole affair ended peacefully when the two programming teams were able to complete the game from the point where the error occurred, before the fourth and final round started.

In the last round, Kaissa beat Ostrich of the U.S. and became the first World Computer Chess Champion. The final scores were:

1st - Kaissa of U.S.S.R. with 4 out of 4

2nd - Chess 4.0 of U.S.A. with 3 out of 4

3rd - Ribbit of Canada with 3 out of 4

4th - Chaos of U.S.A. with 3 out of 4

5th - 9th were Tech II of the U.S.A., Master of Britain, Ostrich of the U.S.A., Frantz of Austria, and Beal of Britain each with 2 out of 4

10th - 11th were Freedom of Norway and Tell of Switzerland with 1-1/2 out of 4

12th - 13th were Al6CHS of Britain and Papa of Hungary with 1 out of 4

Chaos was placed fourth on tie break points and Chess 4.0 beat Ribbit in a play-off for second place.

At present, the U.S. program is rated realistically about 1600 although it actually reached a rating of 1734 in a local American tournament. The real reason for its apparent strength is that the computer doesn't make mistakes (within its ply depth) whereas a human 1600 player does make mistakes. Incidently, a 1600 rating places the computer in the top 30 percent of all American chess players. In conclusion, it looks like David Levy's 1000 pound (English money) bet that no computer program will beat him in a match by 1978 is safe.

<u>Ever Play Blindfold Chess?</u> - Gary Vondrasek (from December, 1974 <u>Kingsmen Review</u>)

The kind where you are blindfolded but not your opponent. I did, and was it fun. My 16-year old daughter has played about 5 games of chess in her life and knows nothing about the game except how the pieces move. I had been trying to get her to play and she wouldn't. I finally asked her if she would play if I were blindfolded and she jumped at the chance. The

following is an account of the game. As you will soon see, my daughter is certainly not a chess player and the game is not submitted as an example of good chess, but I thought you might enjoy, as I did, this new experience.




