FIDE: Will Fischer Write Its Epitaph? - Helen Warren

Lost in the maelstrom of "will he" or "won't he" play is the larger consideration of the status and future existence of the International Chess Federation, FIDE*. We are hearing a lot of "Will FIDE stand up to Fischer" and "Will it survive if Bobby doesn't play". It might be a good idea to take a look at this crisis-ridden confederation on the occasion of its Golden Jubilee.

Prior to this century, there were visionary chess enthusiasts, players, organizers and journalists, who promoted the idea of a federation of nations and players. The first to articulate such a notion was the Englishman, Howard Staunton, who organized the first international tournament in London in 1851. His dream was doomed to oblivion, circumscribed by the time and expense of travel from distant points to a central location for meeting and organizational planning. In the interim, until after World War I, chess on the highest levels was "on its own" as world champions organized their own tournaments and settled on their own terms for purses and match conditions.

In Paris in 1924, a team tournament was held with 10 nations participating; and at the same time, "an Amateur World Championship" event was staged. Because of the confusion surrounding the definition of "amateur" and "professional", it failed; but at least the groundwork for the first Olympiad was laid, held some 3 years later in London under FIDE auspices. The organization of the Olympiads each two years remains the most spectacular undertaking for the world body. From London in 1927 to Nice in 1974, from 16 nations to 76, it has been an arduous road.

Remarkably, FIDE has had but three presidents in its half-century of life: Alexander Rueb from the Netherlands (1924-1949), Folke Rogard, Sweden (1949-1970) and the present, former World Champion, Max Euwe of the Netherlands. As its membership grew, so did the number and variety of international events sponsored: the Women's Olympiad, Student Olympiad,

But, it is in the area of establishing criteria and conditions for the World Championship cycle, from Zonals to the Championship match itself, that FIDE has its most taxing role to fill. Steinitz, Lasker and Capablanca all picked their challengers and set their own criteria for their matches. So did Alekhine. But after Alekhine's death in 1946, FIDE asserted its dominance and after some jockeying, with the great boost realized from the joining of the USSR, a match tournament format consisting of six players was agreed upon. So the first Candidates Tournament began on April 11, 1950 and finished on May 18, 1950 with Bronstein and Boleslavsky tying and Bronstein subsequently defeating Boleslavsky in the play-off. Significant for the U.S., and the subject of much second-guessing and speculation thereafter, was the unfortunate withdrawal of Reuben Fine from this first Candidates. So Bronstein faced Botvinnik, winner of the five-man match tourney held in 1948 to determine the Sixth World Champion.

The chronicle of pre-Reykjavik events, the embroilments of the match itself, and subsequent events are well-known history now. President Euwe, representing FIDE, bent rules to assure that the match would be held; Fischer's utter scorn of FIDE's position throughout the match is a matter of record. The choice of Fred Cramer, acerbic representative for Fischer and ironically a FIDE representative for the U.S., failed to render the road smoother. As Spassky resigned the final game of the match, Cramer was in the process of writing still another ornery protest to a FIDE committee!

Subsequent FIDE meetings amended the conditions for the Championship match, most of them designed to placate Fischer; the length of the match went from 24 to 36 maximum, with first player to win 10 games declared Champion, or with the incumbent Champion retaining the title in case of a tie. Now Fischer is demanding a match with no game limit and a score of 9-9 resulting in automatic match win for the Champion. Already Fischer has won two preliminary rounds in choice of site (Manila) and choice of official referee. By April 1, the chess world should know whether we're in for another Reykjavik, but it won't be until game time in June that we'll know for sure whether there will be a match at all.

In addition to the intricate planning of international competitions, FIDE does much else. Through its many standing committees, it performs a myriad of functions: the Commission for Chess Compositions, including GM's, Masters, and Judge titles**, is active in screening problems, studies and compositions for publication; the Qualification Committee sets standards for awarding of titles; there is a permanent committee on Rules of Play, one for Funds, another for Statistics; other Commissions include those for Ladies' Chess, Junior Chess and the Association of Chess Journalists.

International Master Title Goes to U.S. Players - Martz and Grefe -

Two young U.S. players with contrasting styles of play and even more contrasting life styles achieved the coveted International Master's Title at the Houston International Tournament held December 7-19. John Grefe, 27 year old Californian, former U.S. co-champion, follower of a guru, every inch the mod-mod, scored 6 points in this Category 9 event. Twenty-nine year old Bill Martz from Hartland, Wisconsin, holder of a Ph.D. law degree, many times a winner of the strong Milwaukee North Central and Western Open tournaments, earned 5 and a half points, the minimum necessary for the IM norm. This was the second leg for both players. Grefe secured his first rung last year at Slantchev Brieg in Bulgaria while Martz achieved his first notch at the Italian event at Regio Emilia. Thus Grefe and Martz join the prestigious circle, and ever-widening one, of International Masters.

As of 1973, the U.S. had 13 IM's, the Soviet Union 33 and other nations a small sprinkling. The U.S. also had 13 IGM's (International Grandmasters) while the USSR boasted 34. This "Parity", if it can be called that, shows signs of continuing.

The awarding of titles and the establishment of standards for their attainment is one of the many ancillary functions of FIDE. Prof. Arpad Elo, creator of the Elo International Rating System, also heads the committee on titles. The International Master Title can be attained only after two "legs" are achieved, i.e., a minimal performance in two tournaments within a stipulated length of time and in tournaments of stipulated overall strength, with a mandatory number of IGM, IM's and lesser national

masters competing. The strength of a tournament is determined by the mean Elo rating of its participants. Strength is designated by the term "category", with category 1 having a mean rating of 2250 upwards to category 15, a 2625 average. The weaker the tournament, the more stringent the point requirement. A category 9 event, for example, would have a mean rating of approximately 2450, well into the senior master ranks, and could be considered quite strong. In this case, an even score secures a leg of the IM norm, while 10-5 would be required for the leg of the GM. Foreign tournaments have generally been stronger than U.S. tournaments termed "international", but as the U.S. gains more experience in sponsoring such events, attracting foreign IM's and IGM's to play in them, the level of the U.S. International will improve.

For Grefe and Martz, it was the end of a long and tedious road. It is difficult for U.S. players to get the financial assistance to travel abroad in order to participate in strong events that provide opportunity for achieving IM norms. This situation is improving, however, and the USCF has provided some promising U.S. players the chance. The introduction of the U.S.-based International event, the first held in Pennsylvania, then Los Angeles, Chicago and Houston, should do much to enhance the picture for aspiring U.S. talent.




BLACK 5 pcs #10

7:00 p.m. - Round IV


