Joe'Brozovich introduced the idea that a new 6-man league should be formed. This will be brought to a vote at the August meeting, so it is urged that you attend the meeting. Jim Brotsos' ideas, which were sketched briefly in Bulletin #6 may also be voted on then.

Some of the disadvantages mentioned to Brozovich's idea are as follows:

Below is a letter as sent to Jim Zechinati of Amoco from Matt.Pavitt of McGraw-Hill Inc. of New York. The letter itself is from Arthur Bisguier and tells of the scores of the telephone match that was held on February 28th.

Dear Matt.

I am sending the scores of yourntelephone match back to you together with my decisions on the unfinished games. Five of the games are quite clear and I have so indicated with my initials. However, two of the games are rather involved and I have already devoted a couple of hours of analysis to them and it seems the more time I spend the more I tend to vacillate in my original decision. And even though I attempt to avoid being swayed by the original play of the players involved rather than by the adjudicated position it seems rather ironical to apply grandmaster analysis to draw a position which could have been won quite easily by either side at various stages of the game.

The games in question (1) N. Anderson vs. M. Cavallo. Anderson, white, is a pawn ahead and has clear winning chances but rook and pawn endings are notoriously difficult and the spector (after dissolution of pawns) of an ending with rook plus bishop and rook pawns vs. rook leads me to believe the position is tenable. Game #2, Don Costello vs. Douglas Anderson, black is already a pawn ahead and can even win a second pawn on zugzwang maneuver but since the kingside pawns are already blockaded a draw is still the likely outcome although it must be conceded that black does have winning attempts. I would hope that a Solomon-like decision could be made by calling both games drawn. Apparently in game #1 Chicago has the advantage but I don't know who the players represent in #2.

I assume Rod Vidal informed you that when I spoke to him on the phone I agreed to do the job for you but that I wouldn't get involved in any real heavy analysis. If either of the positions in question were my own I would spend just as much time as I had on winning or drawing the adjournments. Certainly on game #1 a figure of twenty hours might be necessary to assure me that my analysis would be accurate. And if I started billing you for my time on that basis my fee would be prohibitive. So if you want my fast judgment based on my intuition and a couple of hours of analysis call both games drawn but no absolute guarantees go with that decision and as I mentioned above I would hope that one team had the advantage on one board and the other side held the edge on the second game.

junior division report...by ned anderson

North - West Sections

This is the last bulletin before the play offs begin and so far only one team has a playoff spot wrapped up. Zenith-Raulands has 1st place in the West Section with a 7-1 record with one game left to play. Second place in the West Section should go either to Amoco or ITT, and we will have to wait until the last game is played to find out the winner.

The North Section is really tight. The EXcaliburs show the best overall record, 9-1, but since they are not elgible for post season games there are no playoff spots decided. Teletype has a slight edge. Not shown in the standings is a Teletype-A.B.Dick draw and possibly a Teletype-Zenith Niles draw. The Zenith-Niles match is not officially decided yet because of an adjourned game. This would put Teletype at $7\frac{1}{2}-3\frac{1}{2}$ with one game left against EXcaliburs; Zenith-Niles at 6-5 with one game left against A.B.Dick; Procon at 6-5 with one game left against Signode. If Zenith Niles and Procon end up identical, then Procon would have the tie breaking points. Consider this; if Teletype loses the adjourned game they lose the match and quite possibly the match against EXcaliburs, then their record is 7-5. This could produce a 3-way tie for the playoff spots.







C I C L Business Meeting Spring, 1976

March 19 Meeting opened at 7 PM Amoco Research Center, Naperville

Members present:

Jim Brotsos opened discussion with several suggestions to be relayed to team members by the Chairmen and Captains for further discussion and consideration so that these ideas and suggestions may be brought to a vote during the next business meeting of Fall 1976-1977 season.

- I. Suggestion for discussion of ideas concerning the upcoming 20th Anniversary of the Chicago Industrial Chess League:
 - A. possibilities for a commemorative book complete with pictures of past events, teams, past and present officers and other noteworthy items, facts, etc...
 - 1. It was suggested that this might require separate funding to be planned for at present time.
 - 2. It was also suggested that a committee might be appointed to investigate the possibilities and the extent of this type of endeavor.

- II. Suggestion that a Bond be required of new teams entering the League. Such Bond to be refunded after the new team has completed its first season.
 - A. Suggestion that an entrance fee (non-refundable) might be required in addition to such Bond or in lieu of.
 - 1. that entrance fee might be preferred to a Bond
 - 2. that all payments: dues, entrance fee, and bond be payable prior to the 1st match.
 - B. Discussion was had and suggestion made that a committee might be appointed to investigate the feasibility of such Bond and or Entrance Fee and to determine the amounts
 - that such committee would draft a clear ruling to be noted.

During this discussion, it was mentioned that copies of the current rules and regulations with all amendments up-to-date should be in possession of all team Captains. Any team Captains who do not have current up-to-date copies should avail themselves of such copies.

- III: Suggestion for promotion and recognition of the League as well as improving internal participation and interest, that the League host a non-USCF-rated tournament.
 - A. That the League host a Swiss style tournament for teams complete with guaranteed prizes.
 - 1. team vs. team
 - 2. individual vs. individual according to rated strength with a team averaging total results
 - B. That, if such an endeavor be undertaken, we obtain assistance from such professional organizations as Illinois Chess Association or Chicago Chess Club who have had professional experience in such matter.
 - . any such assistance would be subject to a fee or some sort of reimbursement for time and effort

IV. The USCF hosts various team Tournaments throughout the country: It is suggested that CICL might wish to field a team (either one of the championship teams or an allstar team) to enter such tournament, if in Chicago vicinity, and for the League to sponsor this team and contribute to their expenses (either entrance fee and/or travel, etc.

Discussion had as to what would become of any prize money that might be won.

V. Suggestion that a "Commemorative Tournament" be held:

Rather than the usual "Annual CICL Tournament" we might wish to give a name to our annual tournament in honor of some past officer of the League or its founder.

(All above suggestions are meant to gain recognition for the League and increase interest and participation).

Suggestion also made that the League might wish to honor its past presidents by presenting them with free copies of the bulletin in a small ceremony i.e. over a free lunch as a token award of their services.

VI. Suggestion made for increasing dues and comments made regarding such increase and the amount.

Our last dues increase was in 1972 and that was from \$20 to \$24.

Comment from our Treasurer that the present dues seem sufficient. Last year the Treasury "broke even".

Discussions on this subject pointed out that with the League's continuing expansion and the proposed additional activities to increase recognition of the CICL and the increasing costs (such as possibly the publishing of the bulletin, ratings, awards, awards banquets, etc.) that such increase in dues might become necessary.

The Treasury at present has \$800 which is expected to be down to approximately \$150 by the end of the year.

- VII. Suggestion made to promote the interest of League members in participating in rated USCF Tournament. The thought being that such participation would promote interest in the League.
 - A. It was pointed out that we already have an incentive for USCF participation by having a reduced rate for membership in the USCF.
 - B. It was mentioned that participation in rated USCF tournaments by individuals, instead of sharpening their game and being more eager and active in the League, may just turn them off because of the tiring routine of the long weekend tournaments.
 - C. It was noted that the League has absolutely no control to push for any promotion of extra League activities.

This last comment ended discussion and signaled the heated campaign of the candidates for the new administration. The campaign speeches, although emotional and fired by stormy debate, were to the point, brief and sometimes nonexistent. In fact, the 45 second speeches were offered by the respective campaign managers or friend or other acquaintances as the candidates had left the room for the voting.

Nomination made for President: Greg Berry
Terry Andresen

The vote was unanimously carried for Greg Berry as Terry Andresen promptly declined his nomination.

Nominations were accepted for Senior Division Chairman Rick Schaaf Carl Dobin

Prior to the voting discussion was had regarding the possibility of two Co-Chairmen for the Senior Division. The Senior Division Captains opposed this proposition and Rick Schaaf was promptly elected in unanimous vote.

The voting was briefly interrupted for a suggestion made regarding the vested rights of retired players and after no discussion, the serious task of voting was anxiously resumed.

Nominations were accepted for two Jr. Division Chairmen Fred Ciba and Ned Anderson. Although unapposed, they were immediately elected in an unanimous vote.

Nominations accepted for the arduous and unrewarding position of Secretary:

Gary Wolcott Joe Brosovich

In a tough race after equal praises and accolades were afforded for each candidate, the new Secretary was elected in the closest vote of the evening. The 20-4 vote was carried for Gary Wolcott.

No nominations were offered for Treasurer. It seemed perfectly natural that Gary Benson was unanimously reelected to this most demanding and unrewarding position. As Gary was present during this overwhelming show of confidence in his reelection (whether he liked it or not) he was, doubtlessly overcome by emotion, forced to display great big smile in gratitude. It was at this time that Terry Andresen (present Jr. Division Chairman) promptly made a motion to have the books audited.

The voting closed, there was a discussion by the rating chairman of the qualifications and equipment necessary to perform this duty by our present rating chairman who wishes to resign his position. There is a small salary (actually a mere token appreciation) given to the rating chairman. This, it was suggested, is another reason for an increase in dues.

The Trophy Chairman discussed his proposition for a different type of trophy. A motion was made and carried that the Treasurer, President and Awards Chairman make the decision for the trophy if the Treasury allows.

The last item for discussion was a proposal to consider 6 man teams. During the discussion, it was pointed out that this proposal was suggested in the past and was totally refused by the 8 man teams and by the 4 man teams. The entire proposal for the 6 man division was not too clear (whether some 4 man teams would be forced to consolidate and some of the powerful 8 man teams forced to break up or whether the 6 man division would be just another section depending on new teams entering the League).

At the close of this Spring's business meeting, it was pointed out by the President that we do not yet have a chairman for the Awards Banquet. For lack of volunteers, Jim Brotsos agreed to check-out some competitive bids on Chicago's South Side.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 9:30.
