



I would like to propose a change in our constitution to rule 11D-1. I believe this requires a vote after the proposed change is published in the bulletin. The change should read:

11D-1 Team captains will be responsible to rank their players according to their strength as represented by the latest published ratings. If the team captain feels justified, he may position one player per match one board position below or above another player regardless of their rating. No restriction is placed on a players board position if they are positioned within 100 rating points of the next closest player.

A great deal of discussion has taken place lately concerning the correct board position that a man must play. Team captains have a great deal of latitude in assigning his teams line-up. At the present time, nothing prevents him from playing a man 2 or 3 board positions out of line; that is if his conscience will permit it. Even to say that a man can not play more than 150 points above his next closest peer is just an arbitrary decision. What is to keep us from placing a 250 point limit on this decision? Nothing! One can argue that our rating system is not entirely accurate, that we fluctuate some 150 to 250 points difference than the USCF. That may be true, but we do have a rating system, and it is a good rating system, and I am suggesting that we use it to the fullest extent until something better comes along.

What I am suggesting is that we use our rating system very stringently, and use the rating system to determine a mans correct playing position. To determine just what this means we have to first make an analysis of how the typical man, or average man is positioned. I have plotted a curve of individual ratings by board position of all teams thus far this year. The summary of these ratings are as follows:

If we average these ratings by board, we can find that the average board 1 player is rated at 1861, the average board 2 player is 1648 etc. After studying these numbers long enough it becomes apparent that allowing the average player to play 150 points above or below his rating would permit him to jump 2 boards. It is for this reason that 150 points is far to lenient. We must back this figure down to 100 points.

Reconizing that no system or ruling can be 100% perfect or just, We must place a contingency on this 100 point limit. That is to allow the team captain the flexibility of permitting any one man per match to play one board position up or down even if his rating difference is over 100 points.

Therfore; I am suggesting that CICL rule 11D-1 should be revised. You may not want to publish this entire letter due to its length, but the summary of averages might interest several members.



NATIONAL CHESS LEAGUE NEWS BULLETIN #3- January 25, 1977

The League has expanded again! From 9 teams last year to 14 on Jan. 5, this year's opening night, it grew to 16 entries with the addition of two latecomers, Hartford and San Diego. The two new teams faced each other on Jan. 7, with the lower rated Hartford squad scoring an upset $3\frac{1}{2}$ - $2\frac{1}{2}$ win.

In a match postponed due to snow the previous week, the defending League Champions, the Washington Plumbers, encountered unexpectedly stiff opposition from the Ramada Rooks of Phoenix, an expansion team. The Plumbers, who have never lost a League match, won by the minimum margin of $3\frac{1}{2}$ - $2\frac{1}{2}$.

In round 2 matches, played Jan. 19, the frontrunning New York Threats, who swept Philadelphia 6-0 in round one, were held to a 3-3 tie by the Boston 64s. Four of New York's top stars were absent from the lineup due to their play in the Marshall Chess Club International, but New York's players still averaged 60 points above Boston's in rating, so the 64s have reason to be pleased with the result. Boston remains $\frac{1}{2}$ game behind New York in the standings.

After two adjudicated games, the San Francisco Dragons downed the Chicago Prairie Dogs, 4-2, to move into a second place tie with Boston. Chicago, which also lost its adjudication from round one, dropped into a 5th place tie.

The champion Plumbers scored a more impressive triumph in round two, winning 4-2 over the Cleveland Kinghunters, last year's third prize winners. Washington moved into 4th place, $1\frac{1}{2}$ games behind New York.

The Hartford No Faults, the League's 13th highest rated team, continued to surprise, losing to New Jersey's Westfield Colonials by only $3\frac{1}{2}$ - $2\frac{1}{2}$. Westfield, along with Philadelphia the only expansion team with a Master average strength lineup, also drew its adjudicated game against Los Angeles from round one to win that match by the same $3\frac{1}{2}$ - $2\frac{1}{2}$. Westfield is now tied with Chicago for 5th place.

The Ramada Rooks of Phoenix scored their second fine result in two matches with a stunning upset over heavily favored Los Angeles, $3\frac{1}{2}$ - $2\frac{1}{2}$. Another expansion team off to a fast start, the Lincoln Mid-Americans of Nebraska, downed San Diego, 4-2. Phoenix, Lincoln, and Hartford are all tied with Cleveland for 7th place with even scores of 6-6, very fine records so far for these three expansion teams.

Philadelphia's Quakers recovered from their first round shutout and trounced the New Orleans Maple Leafs, $5\frac{1}{2}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$, to pull up to $\frac{1}{2}$ point below the .500 mark. And the Berwick Bay Browns of Morgan City, La., the League's lowest rated team, upset the Atlanta Kings, $4\frac{1}{2}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$. Atlanta's lineup was weakened by an unusual snowstorm; even so, the Browns clearly do not intend to become the League doormats. Berwick Bay's Bradford scored a win by adjudication from round one, giving the Browns a very respectable total of $5\frac{1}{2}$ - $6\frac{1}{2}$.

The League is an 8-round Swiss System playing matches by telephone. The average phone bill for each match is \$72.00. Scoring is by game.

GM indicates an International Grandmaster, IM an International Master; these international titles are not based on ratings. A U.S. rating of at least 2400 indicates a Senior Master, 2200 a Master, 2000 an Expert, 1800 a Class A player, 1600 a Class B player.




