President's Report

Quring Greg Berry's tenure as president, one of the greatest reorganization in CICL history took place, the highly successful transition from 8 and 4 man teams to six teams as proposed by Paul Weston. Through the efforts of the CICL Officials and direction of Berry, the League has continued to run smoothly these last two years.

I'm going to presume on Greg a bit and relate to you what he said as he turned over CICL records to me; "I've really enjoyed being president and would like to continue" but he expressed concern that too many terms in the presidential office might somehow have a detrimental effect on the League.

In Berry's case, I disagree. Our League's continued success proves this.

I am glad to hear that the great old WESTERN ELECTRIC "GAMBITEER" team has resurrected. A tough name to live up to. I am sorry to report the Argonne Monarchs and my team, the Bell Lab Dragons, are being retired. All the Dragons' trophies (one for every year of its existence, except one) will gather dust, the insignia, emblems and patches will sit in my desk in the hope that some day the Dragons will resurrect like the Gambiteers. I doubt the Legendary Dragon fighting spirit will soon be forgotten.

Several years ago, when Fischer was playing, the Bell Lab had two 8 and one 4 man team, plus a team in the NORTHERN ILLINOIS CHESS LEAGUE, with people angry that they couldn't play on a team. Now there is one 6 man team, the Royals.

Much concern has been expressed about a rather slow turnover of match results to Division Chairman, Rating Chairman and Bulletin Editor. If each link treats the results like a hot potatoe, this problem will easily be eliminated.

At this writing it appears the response to play Larry Christiansen is slow. This is a golden opportunity to play a Grandmaster for a reduced price and get a dinner for four if you can beat him. Minutes CICL Annual Meeting August 15, 1978

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 7:15 P.M. at the Standard Oil Research Center, Naperville. The minutes of the April 18, 1978 business meeting were approved as written.
- 2. In the absence of treasurer Doug Anderson, the 1977-78 financial statement and the 1978-79 League budget were presented by president Jim Sobun. It was moved that the dues schedule for the coming season be as follows:

\$20.00 basic dues per team
\$7.00 one (required) bulletin per company
\$3.00 each additional bulletin at same address
\$3.00 each bulletin for members of alumni teams,
mailed to each player's home address

This schedule of dues was approved by a vote of 22-0.

- 3. It was moved that the banquet ticket assessment voted at the April business meeting be in the amount of \$7.00 per team. This was a non-refundable amount, to be credited toward the purchase of tickets to the 1979 annual awards banquet. This motion was approved by a vote of 19-2.
- 4. There was a discussion as to whether multiple-team companies should be required to purchase achimber of bulletin subscriptions equal to their number of teams. It was decided to leave the arrangements as they presently were (by a vote of 16-7), but a committee was to be appointed to study the allocation of the bulletin costs for the 1979-80 season.
- 5. J. Brotsos raise the question as to whether plaques should be awarded to Century Club members. Although original members of the Century Club were awarded small plaques, new members in the last two years were awarded certificates only. It was moved and unanimously approved that all Century Club inductees receive the same award as in previous years, and that this be applied retroactively. It was noted that the 1978-79 budget presented at the meeting appeared able to support this expense without alteration.
- 6. One new team was approved for membership: the Western Electric Gambiteers, which would be based at the Hawthorne plant. Their entry was approved unanimously. Two other potential entrants, Fel-Pro and Sargent-Lundy, were not represented at the meeting, and so could not be voted on. However, it was agreed that the respective division chairmen would be empowered to grant either of these teams entry into the League if, in their opinion, they would be able to muster a serious effort and satisfied all of the usual requirements for membership. (Susequently, Fel-Pro was admitted to the North Division.)

then stated that Bell Labs would try its best to field two teams, despite staying at the six-man level. Charlie Ward announced that due to unusual attrition, Argonne would be able to field only four teams in the coming season.

- 8. There was then a discussion of the divisional alignment of the League. In the East Division, Metropolitan Corrections Center was dropping out, and Sears was going to just one team. (Subsequently, it was learned that Illinois Bell would be represented by only one team, leaving just seven teams in the division.) In the North Division, ITT #2 would be dropping out, but Fel-Pro might come in, leaving ten teams in the North. In the two West divisions, the withdrawal of one Argonne team and the entry of the Western Electric Gambiteers left nine teams in the Near West and seven in the Far West. It was agreed to ask the Wescom team to move from Near West to Far West, in order to balance the playing schedule.
- 9. Then ensued a long discussion of the proposal for preparation of a 25-year commemorative book, originally proposed by Jim Brotsos. It was moved that such a book be prepared, by a vote of 11-9. Brotsos would present a plan for this book at the next meeting.
- 10. There was then a discussion about the Larry Christiansen grandmaster simultaneous exhibition to be sponsored by the League on September 27 at Albright Gym at Western Electric in Cicero. Jim Sobun noted that the information in the last issue of the bulletin was incorrect and that in fact advance entries were not only allowed but encouraged. It developed that no one had been put in charge of organizing this affair, which would be run at a guaranteed profit for the League. It was agreed that Jim Sobun and Doug Anderson would collect the money for the affair, both in advance and at the door. Frank Tegel agreed to provide the demonstration board for the lecture, and Jim Brotsos to act as host to grandmaster Christiansen. Vern Stamm was to serve as liason with Western Electric and arrange for tables, P.A. system, and coffee, while Charlie Ward handled publicity for the affair.
- 11. Paul Weston suggested that a mandatory time, place, and date be established for the League championship match at least three months in advance, so that other League members could plan to attend to watch and in order to permit publicity for the League to be developed. After some discussion this suggestion was defeated by a vote of 11-9.
- 12. Jim Brotsos reminded members that an organizational meeting of the Illinois Chess League was being held at the Harvard Congregational Church in Oak Park on August 17, for any team or group of players who might be interested.
- 13. It was noted that lists of members of teams from multiple-team companies should be sent to the respective division chairmen and to the ratings chairman prior to the first game of the season.

 Terry Andresen requested in particular that any players moving from one team to another should be identified with both the old

The CICL's Roy Benedek is the new Illinois State Chess Champion.

He won the title over Labor Day weekend by winning 5½ of six games in the tournament in La Grange. There were 145 entrants.

Benedek won the championship by defeating Kurt Stein of Hillside in the fi-

nal round. Stein was the winner of last May's CICL Industrial Tornado.

Tied for first with Benedek was Ed Vano who, as a resident of Indiana, was ineligible for the Illinois title. Benedek and Vano each received \$250 prize money, and Benedek received a plaque emblematic of the championship.

Benedek played for the Argonne Rooks last year and will play for the Argonne Bishops this season. The state championship is the first USCF tournament

he has played in in five years.

Other CICL players who entered the tournament, but who did not fare as well as Benedek, were Dave Baurac and Steve Decman, both of Argonne, Nik Goncharoff of Motorola and Paul Weston of Western Electric.

THE LIGHTER SIDE OF CHESS: Murphy's law applies to chess too. In the Chicago Tribune recently, there was a column published defining all of Murphy's Laws as presented by Laurence J. Peter, author of, "The Peter Principle". MURPHY'S FIFTH LAW: If there is a possibility of several things going wrong, the one that will cause the most damage will be the one --Your Queen and both Rooks find themselves in a Knight fork. So you decide to save the Queen and are checkmated on the next move.

MURPHY'S SIXTH LAW: Nature always sides with the hidden flaw --- Remember that Knight you sacrificed?

MURPHY'S EIGHTH LAW: If you try to please everybody, somebody will be disappointed --- You just played such a brilliant game, everyone is calling it the game of the century. Then Bobby Fischer walks up and says; I already did that.

MURPHY'S TENTH LAW: Every solution breeds new problems --In a chess newsletter you published the only answer to one of your chess problems. A reader replies with two additional solutions.

MURPHY'S ELEVENTH LAW: Whenever you set out to do something, something else must be done first --- You have calculated a brilliant mate in 10 moves but then there was this matter of the 5 cups of coffee you drank during the game.

MURPHY'S THIRTEENTH LAW: If you're feeling good, don't worry, you'll get over it --- That won position you had at adjournment was lost upon resumption.

MURPHY'S SIXTEENTH LAW: By making things absolutely clear, people will become confused --- What happened in your lecture on how pawns capture, en-passant.

MURPHY'S TWENTY-SECOND LAW: Blame will never be placed if enough people are involved --- Boris Spassky had 13 advisers in his match with Bobby Fischer.

And finally: MURPHY'S FIRST and most profound LAW: If anything can go wrong it will --- You decided to spend your two week vacation playing in the U.S. Open Chess Tournament.

Background

In 1956 two young executives, Wm. P. Stevenson and C. B. "Bill" Herschberger, had created an active chess club at The Lakeside Press. The strongest player around was Rolland Caine of the R&D Dept. The two Bills were a step behind Caine in ability and much more active in playing and promoting the club. They received strong support that year by the employment of Jim Brotsos who was returning from active duty in the Navy (where he had organized chess clubs and tournaments) and young Chuck Bradley who was an experienced energetic player. Jim and Chuck became Pres. and Sec'y-Treas., respectively in 1957.

In Oct. 1956 the club hosted an Expert from the Chicago C.C., Sol Friedman, (an attorney) who beat 16, drew with Bill Stevenson and Chuck Bradley and lost to Tom Holder. This created more interest in the club and led to a team match with the U. of Ill. Navy Pier branch. Donnelley won, 3-1. In Feb., 1957, 3 weeks after its first team match, the club played another match with the "second team" of the U. of Chicago. Donnelley again won, 4-2. On March 13 7 members of the R.R.D. club participated in a simultaneous exhibition given by Sammy Reshevsky at Chicago Title & Trust. This event emphasized the fact that other companies had active chess clubs. One of them, the First National Bank of Chicago, was contacted and a match was scheduled between R.R.D. and the bank on March 29. The match was held in the Color Club Room on the 8th floor at R.R.D.'s main building. The results of the match were:

Despite this crushing defeat, the Donnelley players enjoyed this match and were not only impressed by the size and skill of the Bank's team, but by the class, wit, and sportsmanship of its members.

Within six weeks of this match, club Pres., Jim Brotsos, had scheduled another team match, The opponent was Western Electric's Hawthorne C.&C. Club who had recently lost a match to the 1st National Bank, 9-6. Also by early May an invitation (by phone) had been received from "Mirko" Mejzr, the leader of the FNB's team, to join in the organization of commercial chess teams into a league.

On May 17, 1957, the Donnelley team paid a visit to the Hawthorne club and received another lesson in match chess. The results follow:

The League is Born

On May 29th, 1957 representatives of six industrial chess clubs met at the (old) 1st National Bank of Chicago building to establish the Chicago Industrial Chess League. Donnelley records do not list those who attended, but the writer remembers most of them:

The name and the format of team competition were agreed upon. In order to prevent the possibility of "elite" teams within clubs. it was decided that other members of the clubs could augment the regular 8-man teams as pre-arranged between team captains before each match. Scoring would be on two levels: the team score (of the first 8 boards) and the club score (of all players participating in the match). The team season would extend from Sept. to the following June with each club playing a double round robin schedule. Dues were set at \$10 per club perseason. Winning and runner-up teams and clubs were to receive trophies and, at this meeting, it was thought that small individual trophics would also be presented to winning team members. M. Mejzr was elected league secretary to handle funds and receive and record all match results. Williamson and Luth were asked to prepare a simple constitution and Bradley was charged with establishing a general tournament schedule. The one philosophical idea that was accepted by all as a league guideline was that we should strive for maximum participation. Another practical guideline that was set out was that team captains would always make an honest effort to rank their teams according to their current relative strength. The team program also included a post-season awards banquet.

In the first round of competition in Sept., 1957 the FNB beat Ill. Bell Tel. by 6-2 (team) & 6-3 (club). Chic. T&T won the team match with W. E.: , $4\frac{1}{2}-3\frac{1}{2}$ but lost the club match, $7\frac{1}{2}-5\frac{1}{2}$. R. R. D. overcame S.W., 7-1 (team)& 8-2 (club). Incidentally, this match was played at the Palmer House because some thought that Donnelley at 22nd & Calumet and S.W. at Division & Kostner were too far aparts.

KUMRO'S KORNER

Twenty years ago, the C.I.C.L. experienced its' first expansion, going from its' original founding six teams to seven teams. This was brought about by the addition of the Motorola team. Motorola finished 2nd that year and as we are entering our 22nd season, Motorola is still around. Not only is Motorola still around, but they have established themselves as one of the strongest teams in the League. Last year they came very close to winning the League Championship and managed to get nosed out at the wire in the final round of the playoffs and lost to the Western Electric Chargers. (Motorola's only loss of the season).

Two years ago, Harza Engineering joined the League in our East Division. They're first year in the League found Harza holding its' own and finishing with a .500 record 3 wins, 3 losses and 3 draws. Last season Harza had a fine season by capturing the East Division Championship with a 9 wins, 1 loss record. They're only loss in the regular season was to the Alumni team. In a hard fought match the Argonne Knights eliminated Harza in the 1st round of the playoffs by a score of 4-2. However, congratulations to Harza are in order for their fine performance in the short time of two years.
