#### President's Report

Mr. Racutt and Mr. Whittenhall performed this service at our last banquet. I have received some input on places to have this year's banquet, but so far no one has volunteered to head up the effort to find a suitable banquet facility for that event.

At this time we are still looking for a place to hold our annual tornado. Although, I am currently investigating a few possibilities, anyone who has any ideas for a tournament site should call me: days 681-6707 (note changed from number in last months' bulletin), evenings 325-6140. Also, Ken Lempa of the V.A. has volunteered to serve again as nominating committee chairman.

Also included in this issue is a note from ratings chairman Charles Ward which I think is self-explanatory, and two chess articles from National Master Report M. Snyder of California. Mr. Snyder, whose articles occasionally appear in Chess Life magazine and other chess publications, submitted these articles to us free-of-charge with a request that the ad for his chess services at the end of the first article be included.

#### Notice

Far west division chairman Wes Underwood has informed me that he has approved the participation of DuJuan Meekins, a security guard at the Bell Labs facility in Naperville, on the BTL Indians team. Mr. Meekins has worked at Bell Labs for over two years and two different security contractors during that time. Therefore, for practical purposes, Mr. Meekins is a Bell Labs employee, although technically he is a California Plant Protection employee. Citing the vote concerning Wes Franz at our August business meeting as a precedent for long term contract employees (which allowed him to play for another far west division team, the Western Electric Tyros), Mr. Underwood did not wish to bring the matter to a formal vote. However, he did request that notice be given to the entire league in this bulletin about Mr. Meekins. I consider his decision to be valid. However, if objections are raised by the far west division team captains or, the other three division chairmen, Mr. Meekins' eligibility to play for BTL will be reviewed.

# Correspondence: The Ideal Chess

Correspondence chess has been known to have been played as far back as the 13th century, between noblemen and kings. It is largely responsible for the development of many of the worlds greatest players; both Alekhine and Keres played correspondence in their early development as players. It allows for the highest level of play; as far as time goes, five minute chess is to over the board teurnaments as OTB tournaments are to correspondence play. Yet, in the United States, little attention is payed to Master level correspondence play. I recently started play in the ICCF IX Olympiad as 4th board for the U.S. team. I wasn't too surprised to find out that almost no one had heard of a correspondence Olympic team, much less that our team is now in the finals in the VIII Olympiad!

I recently completed a fine example of correspondence play in my game against master level player Reiner Stach who, in 1976, won the Championship of Frankfurt, Germany and had a plus score at an international tournament in Biel, 1976.

White: Reiner Stach (Federal Republic of Germany) Black: Robert Snyder (US)

- 1. d4 .1f6 2. c4 .26
- 3. g3 15 4. Eg2 ic

I feel it is best to capture the parm at this point. In the Queen's Cambit Accepted, White would be able to recapture his parm with Mb. With this bishop fishchettoed, this is no longer possible, so White must use his queen if he wants to recapture his parm. The main alternative was the passive 4...Be7.

#### 5. Qa4+ Vbd7

This is the fast move. The main alternative is 5...Bd7 6. Qc4 Bc6 7. Nf3 where Black will have difficulty using his pawns actively.

6. Nd2

White wants to recapture the pawn with his knight and gain a strong foothold on e5. More usual are 6. Qc4 or 6. Nf3.

It is a wonder that this move was last seen in 1950. Nost books give 6...c5 as the main line and White ends up with an edge. The text prevents 7. Nc4 b5 etc., and cuts down on the scope of White's fianchetteed bishop.

## 7. Qc4 ...

White must capture the pawn or else Black plays b5.

7. ... e5

Black obtains complete equality with this natural thematic thrust which frees his game.

## 3. de ...

Black has no problems with the alternative 8. Ngf3 Nb6 (not 8...Bd5 9. Ng5! Qe7 10. Nde4 or 9...0-0 10. Ne6!) 9. Qd3 ed 10. Nd4 Be7 11. 0-0 0-0 with equality.

8. ... Ne5 9. Qe3 Bd6 10. Ngf3 ...

It does White no good to try and obtain a pawn center with 10. f4?! Ng6 11. e4 0-0 12. e5 Be5 13. fe Ne5 and Black has more than enough compensation for the sacrificed material.

10. ... Qe7 11. 0-0 0-0 12. Ne5 Be5 13. Qc2 Bg4

Here Smyslov-Keres, USSR Championship 1950 went 13...Bc7 14. e4 Re8 15. b3 Bg4 16. Nc4 Rad8 with about equal chances. I feel that the text is more accurate.

## 14. Nf3

Write could maintain equality with the more active 14. No4 Bc7.

14. ... Bc7 15. b3

White intends to try and improve on the game Junge-Keres Salzburg 1942 which continued 15. Be3 Rfe8 16. Rfel Ba5 17. Bd2 Bb6 18. Bc3 Rad8 where Black is better. With the text, White seeks a more effective diagonal for his bishop.

#### 15. ... Rfe8

Bringing the rook onto an open filt with a threat provoking White to weaken on the White squares.

#### 16. e3 Radí

Black has found ideal squares for each of his pieces whereas White has yet to develop his Q-side and is weak on the white squares on the kingside.

#### 17. N±4?! .

White doesn't have enough time for this centralizing move and should complete his development with 17. End where I had planned to play 17...New with the edge.

#### 17. ... Be5

Pirming down the knight and preparing to drive it out of the center with my next move.

> 18. Eb2 c5 19. Ne2? ...

Instead of allowing Plack to obtain a clear edge with 19. No. 3 BC 20. Qb2 a6 21. No.3 RC3 where Black has no immediate forced win, White seeks complications which are better for Elack. Also if 19. NF3 Pb2 20. Qb2 Ne4 or 19. Ba3 Rc3!

19. ... Eb2 20. Cb2 Ne4

Posting the knight strongly with the threat of 21...Rc2. It would be fatal for White to exchange off his KB for Black's knight at any time.

## 21. NE4 g5

The key wirning idea. This forces White's knight back to a square that's worse or to head for complications with the fork used.

#### 22. f3

Here, I had prepared the following analysis for 22. Nh3 which shows the depth of analysis permitted in correspondence play: 22...Nd2 23. Rfcl (not 23. Rfel Bh3 24. Bh3 Nf3+) Nf3+24. Kh1 Rd2 25. Rc2 (if 25. Qc3 Bh3 26. Bh3 Rf2 with the threat of mate.) Red8 26. Ng1 (or 26. Rf1 Rc2 27. Qc2 Rd2 28. Qb1 Bh3 29. Bh3 Qc3! and not 30. fe Rh2 mate!) Rc2 27. Qc2 Rd2 28. Qc3 (28. Qc4 Ne5 29. Qe4 Nd3! with the threat of 30...Nf2 mate!) Rf2 29. h3 Qd6!!, so subtle but crushing with the idea of mating the king after 30. hg Qg3 or 30. Nf3 Qg3.

#### 22. ... Rd2

Black's rook now dominates the 7th rank!

23. Qcl gf 24. fe ...

Here, much detailed analysis was required to determine what I was to

do had he played 24. ef now Bf3! 25. Bf3 Qd6!, once again a subtle move proves so crushing, i.e. 26. Qc4 (to prevent 26...Qd4+) b5! 27. Qb5 Qd4+ 28. Kh1 Re6 with threats of Ng3+ followed by Rh6+ or Nf2+. If 24. gf Bf3! 25. Rf3 (25. Bf3 Qh4 26. Bg2 Qg4) Qf6! and White is in a bind and defenseless against Black playing moves like Kh8 followed by Rg8.

#### 24. ... fe

Simple and good. White is help-less.

## 25. Qc3 ...

All other moves also lose quickly i.e. 25. Rel is met by Qf6 26. Rf1 Qd4 or 25. Rf4 Rd1+ or 25. Qe1 Rg2!+ and finally, if 25. Qc4 Be2 is good enough.

25. ... Rg2+ 26. 0-1

For after 26. Kg2 Qe4+ 27. Kg1 Bh3 28. Qb2 e2! does the trick!

## IMPROVING YOUR CHESS

## BY NATIONAL MASTER ROBERT M. SNYDER

One of the most common questions asked of a professional chess instructor is how a player should go about improving his game. There are three basic ingredients that go into improving your game in the most effective matter.

The first ingredient is study. It is said that more books have been written on chess than all other games combined. It is advisable to take advantage of this. You can begin by selecting several good books and purchasing them.

The lower rated player should select a few openings and learn them well. Don't try to learn more openings than you are capable of handling effectively. Know th main lines of your opening system and understand the ideas behind the moves. For the lower rated player or beginner there are two excellent books published; 1) IDEAS BEHIND THE CHESS OPENINGS, by Reuben Fine, Published by Tartan, and 2) THE PENGUIN BOOK OF CHESS OPENINGS, by W. R. Hartston, Published by Penguin Books.

For middlegame tactics an excellent book to use is 1001 WINNING CHESS SACRIFICES AND COMBINATIONS, by Fred Reinfeld, Published by Wilshire Book Company. This book is useful to all levels of players. You should study from this book by spending no more than about five minutes trying to solve any one problem. If after about five minutes you haven't found the best move then go to the back of the book and go over the solution. Don't spend all day trying to solve one problem. The key to improving your tactical ability is to learn from a variety of different positions containing important tactical themes.

There are several good endgame books available to the lower rated player; 1) A GUIDE TO CHESS ENDINGS, by Euwe and Hooper, Published by Dover, 2) CAPABLANCA'S BEST CHESS ENDINGS, by Irving Chernev, and 3) PRACTICAL CHESS ENDINGS, by Paul Keres. The beginner should start off by learning the most simplified basic chess endings (such as mate with K & Q vs. K, K & R vs. K, then K & P vs. K, etc...). After learning the basic endgame positions then it is time to move into the more complicated endgames such as those found in CAPABLANCA'S BEST CHESS ENDINGS.

There are a large number of books available to contain analyzed master games. Go over and study games played by the masters. They contain elements found in all parts of the game and help tie your studies together. When studying master games don't try and rush through them. Take the time to gain an understanding of what is going on in the game. A couple of examples of excellent game collection books are; 1) 500 MASTER GAMES OF CHESS, by Tartakower and Du Mont, Published by Dover, and for the lower rated player 2) LOGICAL CHESS, MOVE BY MOVE, By Chernev, Published by Simon and Schuster.

The second ingredient is to receive instruction from a strong and experienced chess instructor. Your instructor can analyze your games and point out improvements in your play, give you problems in middlegame and endgame positions and help you set up a sound opening system.

The third ingredient is play. For the developing chess player practical experience is a must. By playing you can put your ideas and knowledge to a test that has been gained from your study and instruction. Learning by trial and error may seem like a slow way to learn, but it is a nece-

ssary part of developing your game.

You should seek out players who are better than yourself. When your game is completed it is a good idea to go back over it and find your errors. For the lower rated player playing off hand games for fun is good. However, after learning the basics of the game it becomes important to get involved with rated tournament competition.

Five minute (or speed) chess played with a clock is a good way to sharpen up your tactical skills. Correspondence chess (chess by mail) allows for in-depth analysis without the pressures of a fast time limit. Many of the world's greatest players gained much of their skill by playing correspondence chess.

One of the best places to start is to join your local chess club. That can lead to tournament play and many years of pleasure at the chessboard. You should also consider joining any chess classes if they are offered in your community.

Why the East Division Isn't Getting Rated

It is important that the games played by CICL members be rated in the order that they are played. Thus, games played in, for example, Round 2 of a division's schedule cannot be rated until the Round 1 games involving each of the teams has been rated (assuming that the Round 1 game is played first). The match results are entered into the standings at the same time that the individual games are rated. Thus, failure to submit match results to the division chairman, and through him to the ratings statistician, will result in standings and individual ratings published in the CICL Bulletin that are badly out of date.

This is what is currently happening to the East Division. Only one Round 1 result has been received to date, and this is the only game that appears in the East Division standings in this issue of the Bulletin. Two Round 2 results have been received, but they cannot be rated and published until the Round 1 results for the involved teams are received.

The moral of the story is: SEND YOUR MATCH RESULTS TO YOUR DIVISION CHAIRMAN PROMPTLY!!!
