#### Minutes

Note: Ross Siegel declined to vote as a representative of Continental Bank.

- 1. President Ross Siegel called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.
- Interim Secretary Tony Jasaitis read the highlights of the minutes of the August 25, 1989 meeting. No changes were noted.
- 3. Ross Siegel relayed information from Treasurer Jim Brotsos:
  Our treasury contains about \$3000, about \$300 of which has
  been allocated as a payment to Harvey's Frime Rib for the
  league banquet.
- 4. We debated the following proposal by Jim Brotsos:

"I would like to propose a reward for loyalty and activity. Members reaching the double centurion level should receive a 50% subsidy for all future awards banquets they wish to attend. Members reaching triple centurion status should be invited to be the guest of the league at all subsequent banquests."

We arrived at an estimate that at this time the cost to the treasury would be about \$100 for active double centurions and \$40 for triples, with a number of double centurions not far from becoming triples. No enthusiam was shown for this proposal. Concern was expressed that non-active members could abuse the proposal as stated. Ross Siegel relayed a reduced-subsidy proposal from Jim Brotsos, which also did not stimulate any enthusiasm. The Brotsos proposal was voted down unaminously.

- 12. A Playoff Tournament site has not yet been chosen. Ross Siegel will investigate the possibilties of Amoco, Motorola, and Wheaton.
- Ross Siegel relayed that Wes Underwood will continue as Trophy Chairman.
- 14. Tony Jasaitis volunteered to evaluate games submitted for prizes, assisted by Russ Rzeszutko.
- 15. President Ross Siegel reminded the Division Chairmen to schedule an All-Star Match during the summer.
- 16. Three new proposals were made, to be voted on next meeting. See attached for complete descriptions and members'
- 17. Conflicts between smoking and non-smoking members at matches were brought up. Dave O'dell made the following proposal, to be voted on at the next meeting:

"Whether smoking is permitted at the board will be determined by the captain of the home team, providing that building rules do not supersede a decision to allow smoking."

Other proposals for how the league should deal with this matter are welcome.

18. President Ross Siegel closed the meeting at 8:51 pm.

# PROPOSED CICL RULE CHANGES

#### Proposal #1 (Tony Jasaitis):

#### Section II.B.1 reads:

"Team captains will be responsible for making an honest effort to rank their players according to their current relative playing strength for each match. No player with an established CICL rating (based on 25 more rated games) shall be ranked below any other player with an established rating more than 100 points lower than his, based on the most recent published rating for both players. Each captain will provide the other with a written lineup for each match prepared in advance. The home team's written lineup shall be prepared on the match results sheet."

#### Discussion:

- a) In practice team captains are often scrambling up to the last minute to put together a team. In 6 years of league play, I have never seen the "advance written lineup" rule observed. As the clause reflects neither reality nor practicality, I propose that it be dropped.
- b) 25 games is a long interval to technically allow a team to place a player anywhere it wishes (about 2.5 years of regular season play).

## Suggested new wording:

"Team captains will be responsible for making an honest effort to rank their players according to their current relative strength for each match. The home team captain shall present his lineup first on the match result sheet. Players shall be ranked by most recent CICL rating, with no more than a 100 point difference between any and all players ranked out of order. If a player has played less than 100 rated games, a 200 point leeway is allowed for that player. New CICL players with a USCF rating should be ranked at that rating, and it should be provided on the match result sheet for the benefit of the ratings statistician. Exceptions to the ranking rule must be agreed to by the opposing team captain."

# PROPOSED CICL RULE CHANGES

#### Proposal #1 (con't):

Discussion at league meeting:

Several team captains were unaware that the "advance exchange" rule even existed. No one expressed any support for retaining it.

Several members reported abuse of the less-than-25-game ranking rule. Some pointed out that players sometimes do not receive a rating even after 10 games. However, ranking of such a player would not be affected. The possiblility of a provisional rating being far out of line was brought up. That is the reason for the last clause of the new rule: exceptions can be approved by the opposing team captain.

## Proposal #2 (Tony Jasaitis):

Section II.B.6 reads in part:

"He [the home team captain] is responsible for submitting a legible results sheet signed by both team captains or their representatives to the division chairman within one week of the match date. He must also provide a copy of the results sheet to the visiting team captain."

#### Discussion:

The winning team typically has more incentive to submit a timely result sheet than the losing team, especially one having a poor season.

## Proposed new wording:

"The winning team's captain is responsible for submitting a legible results sheet signed by both team captains or their representatives to the division chairman within one week of the match date. He must also provide a copy of the results sheet to the other team captain. If the match is a tie, the home team captain will assume this responsibility."

#### Discussion at the league meeting:

Some sort of penalty was suggested for home team captains that do not fulfill their responsibilty. FAX'ing of result sheets also was suggested instead of mailing. However, the problem is not the transmission vehicle; it is the lack of action and responsibility. The proposal would naturally improve result submission by favoring the winner's self-interest.

# PROPOSED CICL RULE CHANGES

#### Proposal #3 (Russ Rzeszutko):

Section II.F reads:

"The time limits and move requirements for a match are 50 moves in 2 hours and 25 moves per hour thereafter."

#### Discussion:

Some chess players do not participate in the league (or not as much as they would like to) because the present time control results in late-ending games. However, many of us like the present slow time limits. A solution to the problem is to have individual game time controls agreed to by the players. In the case of disagreement, the slower of the two time controls would be used. This method has been used successfully on the CRT Team's chess club ladder.

The rule should also establish FASTEST and SLOWEST time controls. (We would not want a 5-minute game to qualify as match result and we would naturally want the present 50/2 for the slowest).

The league may want to adopt this rule experimentally for a year, and gather statistics on how much the rule is being used. Match result sheets could indicate any faster time controls used.

## Proposed new wording:

"Time controls can be set by individual player agreement. The SLOWEST and DEFAULT time control is 50 moves in 2 hours. The FASTEST allowable time control is 60 moves in 1 hour. If the two players have different preferences, the SLOWER of the two time controls will be used. Time controls will be defined as an even number of moves on a per hour or per 2 hours basis. The secondary time control will be half of the initial one (eg, 60/1 yields 30/.5). If a clock is to be started in the absence of a player, the SLOWEST league time control will be used, unless the team captains agree otherwise."

## Discussion at league meeting:

Most of the discussion stemmed from misunderstanding the wording of the new rule, with members fearing playing faster than they would want to. We decided to emphasize that NO ONE WILL HAVE TO PLAY FASTER THAN THEY WANT TO. ON ANY DISAGREEMENTS, THE SLOWER TIME CONTROL WILL BE USED, WITH 50/2 BEING THE SLOWEST AND THE DEFAULT.

#### Ratings Notes

Fermilab has incurred a second forfeit on an upper board. Their privilege of starting a clock in the absence of a player is withdrawn for the remainder of the season, per the CICL rules. If any Fermilab players are not present at the end of the 15-minute grace period, all boards must be shifted up and forfeits taken on the lowest boards. The following teams have now forfeited this right:

Fermilab Exemplars Fel-Fro Amoco Corp.

Results from the East division are running behind. One result for Round 7 (Alumni vs. Merc) has not been received, and no results from the round-robin swiss (scheduled to have started Feb. 13) have been received.

In the Far West Division, the Round 7 result of the Wheaton-Tyros match has not been received. This has prevented results from five matches played in later rounds from being rated. Please forward this match result to the division chairman (Irwin Gaines) or to the ratings chairman (Charlie Ward) so that the rating of the remaining games can be unblocked.

In the North division, round six and seven matches involving Fel-Pro (vs. Exemplars and UOP) have not been received. This will prevent rating of matches played at later dates than these.

The deadline for receipt of ratings to be included in the next issue of the bulletin is Friday, May 11.

# USCF POLICY BOARD ISSUES STATEMENT ON WORLD RAPID CHESS RATING SYSTEM

The magazine <u>Inside Chess</u> has recently been promoting "The World Rapid Chess Rating System" for Action Chess (G/30) as an alternative to the USCF Rating System. <u>Inside Chess</u> has stated that the USCF "officers have given their complete approval" to the WRC system.

The USCF Policy Board does not support these statements. No USCF national officer endorses the use of any ratings in place of USCF ratings.

The USCF has been successfully rating action chess events for three years. The USCF offers organizers the option of rating action events at either full K or one-quarter K.

The Policy Board and the Ratings Committee have confidence in the accuracy of the USCF Rating System, and urge its continued use for rating Action tournaments.
