EXCALIBURS (Visitors) vs. KEMPER (Home) Board 1

November 26, 1990

White: Ed Buerger

1. **d4** Nf6 2. C4 **e**5

Before the game, one of our opponents was talking about how the Hungarian Polgar sisters were taking the chess world by storm, so I thought it was appropriate to try the Budapest Gambit in their honor. It turned out to be a good ploy, too, as my opponent spent nearly 25 minutes on his next move.

З. d:e5 Nq4

Qd4 ?!

This is one of the more obscure lines. The main variations are 4. Bf4, 4. Nf3, and 4. e4. That's not to say that the text is without its points, as it defends the e pawn and threatens Black's knight; however, such an early deployment of the Queen usually concedes a large lead in development to one's opponent and may also untimately place her Majesty in peril.

4. d6 5. ed B:d6 6. Nf3 0 - 0

Nc3

In Laszlo-Abonyi, Budapest 1933, White tried 7. h3 Nc6 8. Qe4 Re8 9. Qc2 Nb4, 10. Qc3 when Otto Borik says either 10. ... Bf5 or 10. ... Nd3ch wins.

7. Nc6 8. Qd1 Be6

I considered 8. ... Bc5, but did not see the followup 9. e3 Q:d1 10. N:d1 Nb4, which Black: Mark Siwek

in his book on the Budapest Borik characterizes as "practically decisive".

**e**3 Qf6

10. Be2


Either here or on the next move, White should consider Bd2. A possible continuation is 10. Bd2 Rad8 11. Be2 Nge5 12. N:e5 B:e5 13. Qa4 Rd7.

10. Rad8

11. Ob3 Bb4

12. Bd2

Too late. Best is 12. 0-0 B:c3 13. b:c3 Na5 with typical Budapest play against the doubled isolated c pawns.



R:d2!

One must act quickly to capitalize on a lead in development before the advantage dissipates. On the alternate sac, 12. ... N:f2, Buerger told me he would have tried 13. 0-0, but I was stuck for an answer after 13. K:f2 R:d2 14. N:e4.

13. N:d2 Q:f2ch 14. Kd1 N:e3ch 15. Kc1 B:c3 16. b:c3 Na5 17. Qb4 Q:e2 with the threats of Na:a4 and Rd8,

This loses the Queen (see the note following move 4), but none of the alternatives were all that appealing, either. (1) 15. Kel N:c3 16. b:c3 B:c3ch; (2) 15. Kdl B:c3 16. b:c3 Q:c3 17. Q:c3 N:c3ch 18. Kel N:e2 19. K:e2 B:c4ch; and (3) 15. Kcl B:c3 16. b:c3 Q:c3ch 17. Q:c3 N:c3 18. Bd3 Nb4 19. Kd2 Nc:a2 followed by Rd8.

Best, but not quite sufficient. In the remainder of the game, with the material advantage of Queen versus Rook, Black tries to keep counterplay to a minimum, and winds up weaving a mating net.



15. Ne4? (To be considered was 15. Qb5. True, Black has the makings of a big kingside attack, but White has no fundamental weaknesses and a queenside pawn majority for the endgame. Black's active piece play is, in the opinion of the editor, offset by the fact that he has not castled and his rooks aren't connected. Qb5 exploits this, but after the move actually played, the White queen is misplaced and Black's queen knight gets into the act. ed.)

Tony Jasaitis Chicago Research and Trading 440 S. LaSalle St. Chicago, IL 60605 The following proposal is being published in this bulletin for discussion and a possible vote at the next CICL business meeting:

Martin Franek proposes that the recently adopted rule which limits teams to a maximum of two forfeits above the bottom board, where the bottom board is not forfeited, be abolished.

Discussion: Last season we adopted a resolution to punish teams with a seemingly excessive number of upper/middle board forfeits. Our reasoning was based on the assumption that some team captains would leave a player's name in the lineup even if they knew the player would be absent if they felt that moving players up a board would compromise their chance of winning a match. This practice also deprives backup players of a chance to play. And there is no doubt that there are some 'win-at-all-costs' team captains out there that would routinely resort to this strategy to help their chances. Indeed, I think I voted in favor of adopting this rule, initially. However, having seen how quickly a team can legitimately incur the arbitrary limit of two upper/middle board forfeits, I realize that this rule is unfair to teams consisting of players employed in certain professions.

For example, my team's roster includes two attorneys, a medical doctor and at least one computer programmer (myself). All of us are in positions where we could be either delayed at the last minute so that we arrive after the end of the grace period, or miss the match altogether. A likely scenario is for one of us to arrive at 6:17 PM only to find everyone moved up a board, all the clocks started, and that we are too highly rated to play board six after our original sixth

board player was moved up to board five.

For the record, I object to the fact that my team, among others, is forced to operate on the brink of such a disaster for the rest of the season simply because some of our players had to respond to a spontaneous need by their employer on the night of a match. (I might also add, although it should be obvious, that it is not always possible to let a team captain know when something comes up at the last minute.) My suggestion is that you not force players to choose between being competitive in the CICL and their livelihood. I recommend that the rule be abolished. Instead, I would suggest that team captains be reminded that they are supposed to make a good-faith effort not to abuse their right to let a clock start in a player's absence.
