
Chicago Industrial Chess League Bulletin 6 Volume 34 March, 1991

Endangered Species!!

The American Condor (North America's largest land bird) has a very large wing span of 10 ft. to 12 ft. and is trying to be saved from extinction. All Condors are now in captivity and total 28. There are 13 males, 14 females and the first chick bred in captivity is a male.

The Peregrine Falcon still flying free in North America has been known to reach speeds of 200 MPH in a downward swoop in hunting for prey. The special physical make—up of its nostrils slows down breathing which would blow out the lungs of nearly all other birds. However, the Peregrine Falcon is also endangered. Also, the American Bald Eagle is another bird that is an endangered species.

In 1987, however, the Dusky Seaside Sparrow became extinct. It was guaranteed extinction back in 1980 when only 5 Duskys (all males) were all that remained in the entire world. The last one to die was a Dusky named "Orange Band" who died at the age of 12 in 1987. He got his name from an orange band placed on his leg by conservationists who tracked his flight by radio.

What does all this endangered stuff have to do with chess? Well, right here in the C.I.C.L. changing to "Pawn Pushers" from birds, we have an endangered species called the AT&T Chargers!





With regard to our notes after Black's 46th move, let me say something most of us probably know. It's no fun to have to play out a lost game, and in an individual tournament game I probably would have given up after White's 44th move, which snapped up a second pawn. However, in a close match against another team, you have to give your opponent every reasonable chance to 'fall asleep at the switch'. Not all won games are won. -MF

UPDATE OF LEAGUE CONSTITUTION AND RULES

I have been transcribing the League Constitution and Rules to a computer, and updating it with the amendments that have occurred since it was last issued. I intend to distribute updated copies at the Spring Meeting and at the League Banquet.

I have added a new section, "III. League Championship," which I have compiled from league precedents, motions passed at meetings, and consultation with a prior Playoff Director. Since this material has never been together in one place before, I am publishing it in this bulletin prior to the meeting so that it can be reviewed and formally accepted as part of our Constitution and Rules. For simplicity, I would like the League to approve it as is, and make amendments to it (if any) from that point.

In transcribing "Section II.D. Basic Rules," I encountered numerous references to FIDE rule sections that have obviously changed in the current edition (1987) and do not match the topic being discussed in our Rules. The wording of our rules implies that FIDE and USCF rules were the same at that time. Well, they aren't anymore. In examining both sets of rules, I feel that making USCF rules our basis would be more appropriate. I am enclosing my revision of this section of our rules for your examination. Below is a cross-table of old and new FIDE and USCF rule numbers, as best as I have been able to match them up:

*** I cannot determine from the context of our rules what this pertains to (our rules simply state the deletion of Artile 16.1), but I suspect that it pertains to the resumption of adjourned games. If anyone knows for sure, please contact me.

Since USCF rules allow castling with either the King or Rook first, I suggest that we delete our rule II.D.1, which insists on touching the King first. I presume that we do not wish to be stricter than the USCF? I also presume that all of us experienced players castle with the king first anyway; the main benefit of this leniency is to make the league more hospitable to beginners. Note that the USCF rule states that if castling is illegal, the touched rook must be moved.

Section II.D.2 of our old rules states that wins by time forfeit and draws by repetition can be only claimed by providing a valid score sheet. Since USCF Section I.12.L.d,e goes into great detail as to what constitutes a valid score sheet, I suggest that we drop this vague clause and use the USCF rules. A photocopy of the USCF rules on this subject is enclosed.

Rule Updates (p.2)

In summary, I am submitting the following proposals for the Spring Meeting:

- 1) Add a new Section "III. LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP" to our Rules.
- 2) Adopt the revised wording of Section "II.D. Basic Rules," which uses current USCF rules for its standard, and includes dropping the requiremnt of touching the King first in castling, and implies adoption of the USCF definition of a valid score sheet.

P.S. References are made to the tiebreak rules of "Section II.H.3" of the UPDATED constitution, which will be distributed at the Meeting and Banquet. Those tiebreak rules were adopted at the Fall Meeting.

Rule Updates (p.3)

III. LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP (proposed new section)

A. PURPOSE

The purpose of the League Championship is to determine an overall-season league champion from among the top non-alumni teams in the various divisions in the league, and to award trophies to the very best teams in this group.

B. TEAM ELIGIBILITY

The top two non-alumni teams of each division advance to the Playoffs. In the event of ties, the tiebreaking methods of Section II.H.3 shall be used.

A team that becomes eligible for the playoffs is required to declare, in advance of the playoff pairings, its intent to compete in all rounds of the playoffs. Failure for any reason to field a minimum of 5 players for each of the rounds will disqualify that team for elgibility for the playoffs for the following year.

C. PLAYER ELIGIBLITY

To be eligible in any form of playoff match (league championship or tie-breaking), a player must have played in at least one regular season game. Forfeit wins are acceptable, forfeit losses are not. Games as an "extra board" between members of the same team are not acceptable.

D. PLAYOFF DIRECTOR

The Playoff Director will supervise the playoffs, producing equitable pairings according to recognized tournament methods, and will resolve disputes, using League rules and USCF/FIDE rules as a guideline.

If a round is played at a common site supervised by the Playoff Director, time controls will be identical for all boards and all teams. The time control will normally be the slowest league time control (50 moves in 2 hours), unless the Playoff Director determines that this is too slow for the constraints of the playing site (such as when two rounds are played in one day); then the Director will set an appropriate faster time control, applicable to all games of a round. The Director may set secondary time controls on a fraction of an hour basis, or even "game/xx (sudden death)" if necessary, or he may set a deadline time for adjudication.

Rule Updates (p.4)

III. LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP (con't)

If more than one round is played on the same day, the Playoff Director will take into account the time necessary for secondary time controls, possible adjudications, a quick lunch, pairing time for the next round, etc., in setting time controls.

If adjudication is necessary to start the next round in time to meet the contraints of the playing site, and the players cannot agree on a result, the Director will call the four highest rated available impartial players (ie, those whose teams do not stand to gain by the result) as judges. If the Director is one of the highest rated available impartial players, he does not need to call anyone rated below himself.

E. TROPHIES

Trophies will be awarded to the top three teams of the playoff tournament. The tiebreak method will be "sums of the rounds," where the teams' records at the end of each round during the tournament are summed together. Teams still tied will share equally in the honors and trophies, unless there are not enough trophies alotted (eg, if the tie extends beyond third place). Then the tie-break methods of Section II.H.3 will be applied, replacing the words "regular season" with "playoffs".

Rule Updates (p.5)

D. BASIC RULES (proposed revision)

The Laws of Chess of the United States Chess Federation (USCF) will govern all matches, with the exceptions noted below:

- 1. USCF Sections I.15 and I.16, concerning the adjournment of games, are superseded by Section II.6 of the present rules.
- 2. USCF Chapter 8, concerning the interpretation of the laws and standards for chess equipment, is deleted.

In the interpretation of the Laws of Chess, the two team captains jointly, as described in Section II.B.2, will exercise all the powers and responsiblities assigned by the Laws to the arbiter/tournament director of the competition.

- . The game is lost by the player who has not completed the prescribed number of moves in the allotted time.
- I. Only the tournament director and the players in the game involved may concern themselves with the fall of the flag. Spectators, including players of other games, who point out the fall of a flag in any manner may be disciplined by the tournament director to the point of expulsion from the playing hall, loss of their own game, or expulsion from the tournament.
- 2. Whenever possible, a director should be present at any game in which a player is in time trouble, in order that he may observe the players and take immediate action if a claim of a win on time is made by one of the players. Under this standard USCF procedure, a director must never initiate a time-forfeit win without a player's first having made a claim.

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- 3. If the player whose flag has fallen accepts the claim, the game is over.
- 4. When the player does not accept the claim a. If a director is present, he stops both clocks and rules on whether or not the player has lost the game according to the procedures in this rule.
- b. If the tournament director is not present when the claim is made, the claimant should stop both clocks and summon a director to the board for the necessary ruling. Play in the game ceases and neither player is permitted to fill in any previous moves missing from his score sheet.

- c. The director will uphold the claim of a time-forfeit win if the claimant demonstrates from a complete (see d below) and accurate (see e below) score sheet that the requisite number of moves has not been made in the time allowed.
- d. Unless otherwise announced by the director at the start of the tournament, a complete score sheet is defined as one that has no more than three missing or incomplete move pairs (consecutive moves, white and black or black and white). The absence of three consecutive moves, white-black-white for example, counts as two incomplete move pairs. If either side's move is omitted, a move pair is counted as incomplete. The common error of omitting one move by one player and subsequently putting moves in the wrong columns counts as only one error. Moves recorded only with checkmarks are counted as missing moves.
- e. A reasonably accurate score sheet is defined as one that the director considers playable. Minor ambiguities in scorekeeping or errors involving no more than one symbol are of no consequence. Indecipherable notations count as missing moves, so that a player may not have more than three erroneous or missing move pairs and retain a right to claim a win on time, unless the director has announced a more liberal policy.
- f. The director may use the opponent's score sheet to determine that the requisite number of moves has been made and that the claimant's score sheet is in error. The di-
