Finally, all games submitted for prizes MUST be to me no later than May 7. The last publication of the year will shortly follow and prizes will be awarded at the CICL banquet.

#### CICL PRESIDENT'S LETTER

To All League Officers, Team Captains, and Players:

As the season draws to the close, this is a good time to address some pertinent topics, some of which came out at the Spring Meeting (see the minutes elsewhere in this bulletin).

The playoffs will be held at J. I. Case again this year. Skip Kale is the TD for this event. Any question regarding the playoffs should be directed to him at (708) 887-2372. In the event Skip is unavailable, you may contact me. Even if your team did not make the playoffs, you are welcome to come to spectate or play some rated games against opponents you may not regularly meet. Match result sheets for such games will be provided. Playoff teams should remember to bring their own chess equipment and match result sheets. Please note that J. I. Case is a smoke-free building.

Marty Franek has volunteered to serve as Trophy Chairman again this year (thanks, Marty!). Division Chairmen should call me with their selections for awards in the following categories: MVP (Most Valuable Player), and OTC (Outstanding Team Captain). Suggested criteria for the OTC were published in the Spring 1991 minutes. This is the second and final year that Russ Rzeszutko is donating the trophies for the OTC (thanks, Russ!). We should decide at the next meeting whether we will continue this award in the future.

This is your last chance to submit games for award consideration. The Bulletin Editor's deadline is elsewhere in this issue. As decided at the Fall Meeting, the upcoming playoff games will be eligible for next season's awards.

The (anti-)smoking proposal was tabled as impractical as stated. We decided to mull the issue over during the summer. The only workable rule may well be "no smoking at the board." A new proposal, if any, will appear with the Fall Meeting announcement.

I would like to especially call your attention to the discussion in the minutes of the meeting to the suggestion of altering the status of Alumni Teams. We formed a committee study the issue over the summer, but all additional creative input is welcome. A good solution should make Alumni Teams feel more like full-status league members while (probably) dealing with fears of overly

dominant Alumni Teams.

Regrettably, we have lost two teams in the Far West Division. Chemical Waste Management was severely impacted by layoffs, and Alumni West has mysteriously dropped out of contact. That's the bad news.

The good news is that admission to the League Banquet (June 12) will be cheaper this year, reflecting our lower costs. See the announcement elsewhere in this bulletin.

After conferring with our Banquet Chairman and Treasurer, I would like to clarify a number of issues related to the banquet. First of all, we urge everyone to register in advance. We need to provide a guaranteed number of attendees (and deposit) to the restaurant about a week in advance. While a limited amount of at-the-door registrations are OK, an excess number will strain the serving capacity that the restaurant planned on (so "bad" service can be our own fault). To encourage pre-registration, we decided to increase the at-the-door registration surcharge from \$2 to \$3. Refunds of pre-registered payments will be allowed until June 1. Note that payment is to be made even for those who are using their team's advance deposit, which is part of the teams dues (see below).

The handling of the teams' banquet deposits which are built into the dues has been a source of confusion in the past. I would like to clarify it here. Part of your team's dues includes the anticipated admission cost for one team member to the banquet. This advance payment is to guarantee a minimum attendance at the banquet, and is non-refundable. Our prior Treasurer, Jim Brotsos, had found the following handling of this payment to lead to least complications: Attendees pay for the actual admission cost to the banquet as if the team dues deposit had not been made. After the banquet, each attending team's representative gets from the Treasurer a rebate of the team dues deposit, which may or may not be the same as the admission actually paid.

As stated in my prior letter, don't expect a head table at this banquet. Members that expect to be at the microphone often can seek out seating near it.

Some teams have expressed interest in playing matches over the summer break. I will serve as the contact for such teams. The matches can be rated like any other. I see no problem with matches being arranged involving less than 6 players, since the

results will not count toward any standings. If a large amount interest occurs, perhaps even a summer team tournament or league can be implemented, with Swiss-style pairings.

Some of the lower-ranked teams in the league have expressed interest in schedules that would increase competition amongst themselves, and reduce how often they get "beat-up." Are there any creative ideas out there to address this topic? One idea which is likely to be implemented in the East Division is: after the initial round-robin, to have a modified Swiss where the top teams (top half, or whichever teams still have a mathematical chance to make the playoffs) are paired as if they already had scored one point in the Swiss (or, split the division into two round-robins).

Besides leading to more play between the lower-ranked teams, this would also result in more head-to-head competition between playoff contenders than has been occurring in the current Swiss methods in the various divisions. Another possibility is to use the season's match points throughout the Swiss as the basis of pairing, rather than results within the Swiss. The maximum pairing between teams of similar strength would occur with a double or triple Swiss that spanned the entire season, but that is probably impractical, as too many bottlenecks in the schedule would occur, since the pairings of each round would depend on the prior one. Although this is a division-level issue, we can still kick around these ideas for the benefit of everyone.





#### **Minutes**

- President Tony Jasaitis called the meeting to order at 7:14 PM. 1.
- The minutes of the previous business meeting, August 21, 1991, were accepted 2. without revision.
- Wes Underwood gave the Treasurer's report. He indicated that the league was on 3. track with regard to expenses and in fact had benefited slightly by the inclusion of an additional team during the year. A mid-year cash reconciliation statement was distributed.

There is presently \$850 allocated toward trophies and awards. (TJ: Marty Franck will be the awards chairman.)

- Tony Jasaitis moved to formally admit both Columbia College and Franklin Watts 4. (a publishing company) to the league. There were no objections to this.
- The divisions were then polled as to end of season standings. 5.

Irwin Gaines indicated that the AT&T Tyros and Fermilab will finish first and second respectively in the Far West Division, regardless of the outcome of a match to be played next Wednesday. He also reported that the around the mid-point of the season the Far West lost its two new teams: Chemical Waste Management and Alumni West. Waste Management was the victim of a corporate reorganization; it is not clear why the Alumni team has apparently folded.

Karel Dobr reported on the status of the Near West Division. The Argonne Knights are the clear first place finishers and at this point second place is unresolved. Charlie Ward indicated that Frank Tegal, a Bell Labs Dragons' player, was recuperating from a heart attack suffered the previous weekend.

Frank Suerth reported on the North Division. Franklin Watts and UOP will finish in the top two spots, with the exact order still to be determined.

Tony Jasaitis announced that in the East Division the top two finishers will be CRT and Sears, again with the exact order still to be determined.

- 6. A short discussion ensued as to the playoff site location. The use of J. I. Case was approved. By prior agreement, rounds 2 and 3 of the playoffs will take place on Saturday, May 16. Skip Kale is the playoffs director. Persons requiring additional information on the playoffs should contact Howard Klinefelter (708 887 3750). Tony also gave his work number: 312 431 2966. At a later point Howard stressed that Case has a no-smoking policy for the entire complex.
- 7. Skip Kale reported on the state of negotiations with Harvey's Prime Rib, the traditional banquet site. It is possible that the final per person cost will be smaller than last year's. A discussion ensued as to whether is would be more desirable to reduce the banquet fee or to enrich the speed chess prize fund. Sentiment favored lowering the banquet charge, assuming the cost does turn out to be lower than expected.
- 8. Tony Jasaitis submitted the following rule change:

"A Player playing a game counting toward a match result can request of the opposing team that no smoking occur (by any member of the opposition) at the board and/or close enough to be a serious nuisance. Failure to honor such a request will result in a forfeit victory for the requesting player, and a forfeit loss for his opponent (regardless of whether his opponent is the actual offender). Only one forfeit per offender can be incurred."

The proposal was criticized for being vague ("close enough"), subject to a loophole ("only one forfeit per offender"), and unnecessary (there are general sportsmanship rules). Finally, Al Litvinas wondered if the proposal should not be simplified to simply ban all smoking at match sites. It was felt that the issues involved should be thrashed out in the bulletin and feedback sought before proceeding with such a rule change; the proposal was tabled.

- 9. In the absence of interest in contesting elected posts, Charlie Ward moved that all present officers be re-elected to their posts by affirmation. This was so done.
- 10. By way of new business Al Litvinas proposed a rule change which would end the distinction between alumni teams and regular teams with regard to the playoffs. He felt that the alumni teams were "discriminated" against by being forced to play in a separate playoff field. Also, as the number of alumni teams has diminished—there are presently only two—their participation in the final playoff rounds becomes more problematic.

This proposal generated considerable discussion. Irwin Gaines felt that as stated this would put a damper on the admission of future alumni teams. John Zoellner suggested handicapping teams "as in a bowling league" so as to eliminate or reduce the perceived advantage of alumni teams. Many people stressed the original motivation for excluding alumni teams from the regular team playoff pairings: by virtue of their ability to draw former players from any team in the league, the alumni teams could, in principle, dominate the playoffs. Charlie Ward stressed that this proposal represents a fundamental departure from the league's roots (originally there were no alumni teams), and suggested that the proposal be reviewed before any further action is taken. Tony Jasaitis then proposed a committee consisting of J. Brotsos, I. Gaines, A. Litvinas, R. Stoltz, and F. Suerth to study these issues over the summer.

- 11. Tony Jasaitis raised the issue of the status of the Chemical Waste Management former players: are they eligible for future alumni status given that CWM had folded before paying its first year dues? The games they did play do count toward the Far West Division standings and individual ratings. A suggestion was made that the unpaid dues could be requested in return for alumni standing. In the end, it was felt that this sort of decision should be deferred until such time that a former player is seeking alumni status.
- 12. In response to the suggestion of handicapping teams, Irwin Gaines raised the possibility of having "B and C" playoff pools for teams not advancing to the championship playoff rounds. The aforementioned committee will consider this possibility along with other playoff format changes.
- 13. Frank Suerth proposed Bob Bloom (Motorola) and Phil Peters (Felpro) for alumni status within the league. Charlie Ward confirmed that both players had indeed participated in the league, and both were admitted by affirmation.
- 14. Skip Kale brought up a thorny scheduling problem in which one team was insisting on playing on a particular night. Irwin Gaines noted that the rules already deal with such a situation. Karel Dobr expressed some dissatisfaction with the discretion accorded to the division captains in settling such disputes.
- 15. Skip Kale also requested that a list of teams interested in match play over the summer be published.
- 16. President Tony Jasaitis closed the meeting at 8:54 PM.

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





# THE 2 SQUARES COLUMN



In diagram 42 the game is almost equal in material. Black has several weaknesses. His king is on an open diagonal. This is a no-no while the queens are still on the board. His bishop and knight can be forked by a white pawn and white's queen has a masked attack against e6 which is on the black king's open diagonal. Consider squares e5 and e6. White has two useful attackers, the queen and e4 pawn. Black has only one defender, the black bishop. White's attack is simple.

#### 1.e5, Bxe5 2.Qe6+



In previous columns we have illustrated the swish-en-zug. In this tactic a masking piece moves out of a rear line of fire to produce two attacks in one move. We have also shown the double swish-en-zug where two masking pieces leave the rnasked line of fire one be one. This can produce three attacks in two rnoves. Even fairly good players will at times fall into that trap. Diagram 43, above, illustrates a triple swish-enzug. The attack of the white queen against the black king is masked by three white pieces. The order in which the masking pieces leave the file (or row or diagonal) can be important. in diagram 43 the sequence is to attack the black rook, the black queen, and finally the king. Note this is in ascending sequence of value.

- 1.Bxg5, hxg5. The position is now a double swish-en-zug.
- 2.Nxc5, dxc5. The position is now a simple swish-en-zug.
- 3.Bg4. White will have won a queen and two pawns for three minor pieces, maybe enough to win.



In diagram 44 White has a minimal material advantage but will lose it unless he does something drastic. White need simplification and pawn movilitiy. He attack squares b6 and e8 with threee pieces. Black has only two defenders of those squares. Ahha! The makings of a two-square attack.

1.Rxb6, Rxb6 2.Rxe8, Rxb5. White has simplified, obtained mobility for a pawn, and has obtained a trace more material advantage. Can he set up another two-squares attack and finish off Black? The pawn's queening square is a8. After the rook trade White's queen can fork the queening square and the newly exposed black king.

3.Rxf8, Nxf8 4.a7, Rb2 5.Kh3, Ra2 6.Qe4.
