CICL PRESIDENT'S LETTER

August 30, 1991

To All League Officers, Team Captains, and Players

Welcome to the 1991-92 CICL season! The turnout at the Fall Business Meeting was very encouraging. Some good ideas were brought forth. While I encourage you to read the minutes of the meeting, I would like to highlight a couple of points that will affect many of us.

- 1) May I remind you that at the Spring Meeting the following policy was passed: In addition to sending a copy of the match result sheet to the Division Chairman, a copy must be sent to the Ratings Chairman. See the Officer List for addresses. Please note that the Ratings Chairman has made a FAX number available as well.
- To encourage publication of playoff games, we decided to make them eligible for the following season's Best Games Awards, provided they are published in the first or second bulletin of the following season. Being that the policy has just been announced in this first bulletin, playoff games will be accepted for award consideration until the third bulletin for this season only.
- 3) Publication of regular-season games has been meager as well. The meeting brought forth some interesting thoughts on this subject. Among the reasons for NOT publishing a game were:
 - a) Make it harder for others to prepare for playing you.
 - b) Embarrassment over missing "obvious" continuations.
 - c) Not wishing to embarrass your opponent.
 - d) Respecting the opponent's preference against publication.
 - e) A game result (read upset) may not be as noteworthy as it seems because of time pressuse, or the need of the losing player to play for a win at all costs for his team's sake, etc.

While at first these reasons may seem silly, they do make sense upon reflection. I must confess that some these factors have kept me from publishing some of my own games. In fact, upon becoming President, I have been torn as to whether I should set a good example by publishing some of my own games. I thank our members for their candor.

An interesting idea was brought forth by several people to address this issue. It may seem silly at first, but the more I think about it, the more I like it, as it really seems that it would encourage publication of more games. I would certainly come forth with some of mine. The idea is to allow publication of games without names.

Huh? Does anybody in the world do this? Well, let the only true Industrial League in this country blaze some new ground!

If a game is fun, or if some analysis is fun, why not share it? Does it matter that much if we don't know the names? I would encourage providing as much information as is practical. It seems that as a bare minimum, the ratings classes of the two opponents should be provided, as this adds a relevant dimension to the appreciation of what went on in the game. This idea is not without precedent in the League. It was pointed out to me that games were published without names in the early days, so that the awards judge could not be influenced by such information. We didn't really discuss whether these games should be eligible for awards this time around, but I think not. Certainly, if no names were provided to anybody, we wouldn't know to whom to give the award. I suppose it would be possible for the Bulletin Editor to conceal the information, to be revealed in full if the game receives an award. But that's a topic we can discuss at the next meeting, if the publication of games without names is a big hit.

An idea for keeping in touch with potential alumni players was passed at the meeting. A form willbe published in the first bulletin of each season for departing members that wish to stay in touch. The team captain (or whomever) can send a copy of the form to the League President, who willkeep an Alumni file. Alumni Team Captains and the President can draw upon this file as the need arises.

At the meeting, we admitted two new teams, both in the Far West Division, which was fortunate, as Wheaton was unable to submit a team this season. Please welcome Chemical Waste Management and an Alumni Team! Wheaton was a positive experience for the league despite a mostly student team (there have been negative ones). and a testimony to the principles that the school officially represents. A sad farewell as well to the Alumni Second Stringers of the East Divison. A few other teams are teetering (if it comes to it, please use the Alumni File form en masse!), and one new team may yet squeak into the East division. More details next time if they occur.

Well, that should be enough information to kick off the season. Gentlemen, start your pawns!

- 1. President Tony Jasaitis called the meeting to order at 7:10pm.
- 2. The minutes of the April 18, 1991 meeting were accepted without revision.
- 3. Treasurer Wes Underwood distributed a financial report for the 1990-1991 season and summarized the highlights. He noted that the CICL netted \$76.55 last year. In particular, profits were made on the bulletin (\$165.20) and the banquet (\$258.50). However, Wes anticipates that the bulletin costs will be substantially higher this year as the xeroxing resources will not be free. Publications costs have varied over the years depending on whether or not copying costs were subsidized. For this fiscal year, Wes is budgeting \$350 for the bulletin.

For the 1991-1992 budget, Wes proposed a projected deficit of \$153. He felt that an overrun of this level could easily be absorbed as we presently have \$666.76 in undesignated savings and \$1,400 in the computer fund. Team dues would be unchanged from last year.

In response to the proposed \$50 allocation for computer expenses, Charlie Ward indicated that no support would be necessary this year.

Jim Brotsos questioned whether banquet dues should not be increased by \$1 to take into account inflation or to allow for an alternative to Harvey's Prime Rib. Wes pointed out that the CICL has made money on the banquet for the last 4 of 5 years, although this is

not the intent of the dinner. Irwin Gaines noted that as we are actively soliciting new teams it is desirable to minimize the sticker shock of the yearly dues.

Jim Brotsos moved that the Treasurer's report and proposed budget, with the \$50 reduction, be accepted and this was done so by acclimation.

Wes thanked Jim for his many years of faithful service as Treasurer and for the fine shape in which he left the records. Both Jim and Wes received a round of applause.

4. Tony then reviewed the status of the League's appointed positions. The Division Chairmen for the 1991-1992 season are:

East Division - Bill Cooper (PSTOF)
North Division - Len Augsburger (MTRLA)
Near West Division - Dan Kumro (CHRGR)
Far West Division - Irwin Gaines (FERMI)

Jim Hodina (AMCRP) has agreed to serve as Bulletin Editor for this year.

Charlie Ward will continue as Ratings Chairman.

Skip Kale agreed to reprise his dual roles as Tournament Director for the play-offs and Banquet Chairman.

No volunteer came forward for the position of Trophy Chairman. Tony indicated that he would determine whether Marty Franck would continue in this role.

No volunteer came forward for the position of Publicity Director. Tony has already been doing publicity work, and he agreed to continue to handle these responsibilities.

It was noted that the position of Division Chairman is an elected post, and the four nominees were all approved without objection.

5. As part of old business, Charlie Ward supplied a FAX number (708 979 8451), to be used by home team captains to submit copies of match results to him. This is in response to the proposal adopted at the last business meeting:

"The home team captain will submit, in a timely manner, copies of the match result to the Division Chairman and to the Ratings Chairman."

Charlie requested that a return FAX number be included in the event of transmission problems.

As an alternative, Charlie also supplied his mailing address:

He further requested that Division chairmen send him their rosters and game schedules as soon as possible.

6. As part of new business the status of several teams was discussed. Two teams, the Alumni 2nd Stringers (E) and Wheaton College (FW), have folded due to a shortage of players. Some of the 2nd Stringers may migrate to Alumni Central. Also, there is some

question regarding the Excaliburs (N) as they presently only have four full-time players. Finally, it was noted that in all probability Argonne will again field only one team this year.

Charlie Ward reminded everyone that in addition to the admission requirement, the Excaliburs are also required to pay their 1991-1992 dues in advance. These actions resulted from their tardiness last year in remitting the annual dues. After some discussion Irwin observed that the first round in the North Division could be paired around the Excaliburs, and in the interest of giving them as much time as possible to establish a full roster, proposed:

"To avoid being expelled from the League, their (Excaliburs') dues must be in the Treasurer's hands by September 15th."

This proposal was approved unanimously.

7. Irwin Gaines discussed the possibility of two new teams in the Far West Division. The first team would be an alumni team, comprised of former Tellabs and Wheaton College players plus any other interested alumni in the area. There are potentially five Tellabs and three Wheaton players who would be eligible. Don Graft of Tellabs could serve as team captain. Tellabs has both chess equipment and a well-located match site. Some disappointment was expressed over the fact that Don was not present at the meeting. Irwin countered that Don was only very recently informed about the meeting and that one potential alumni player, Wes Underwood, was in fact in attendance. Irwin then proposed the following motion:

"To tentatively accept the new "West" alumni team into the Far West Division subject to final approval by the Far West Division Chairman."

This motion was accepted unanimously.

Irwin then mentioned the possibility of Chemical Waste Management in Geneva joining the League, again in the Far West Division. Bill Holm, formerly of AMOCO, would be the team captain. Six players are already committed. Some concern was voiced as to whether this team would have chess clocks at the beginning of the season, although it was pointed out that providing clocks is not a strict requirement. Irwin felt that the need for the Far West to broaden their base of team outweighed any concerns they might have about equipment shortages. He felt that the playing scheduled could be arranged to have Chemical Waste Management on the road for the first few matches, allowing them time to obtain equipment. Bob Stoltz also underscored the need for the Far West to grow beyond the present level of four teams. Irwin then proposed to:

"Admit the Chemical Waste Management team into the Far West Division."

The motion was accepted unanimously.

Tony pointed out, however, that for the moment the status of the Far West Division was somewhat iffy given the uncertainty regarding the new teams. He felt that if the Far West ends up with only four teams and the Near West has six, then an inter-division swap should be contemplated. Charlie thought that the two divisions may want to coalesce. Alternatively, there could be two divisions with inter-divisional play. Both Division Chairmen indicated that they were amenable to a rearrangement if necessary.

8. Al Litvinas proposed that Robert Buchanon and Richard Smith, both of who played for the First National Bank of Chicago, be accepted by the League as new alumni players. This was accepted unanimously.

Irwin Gaines proposed Don Graft, Pete Stein, Jeff Verive, Nate Stelton, and Mark Erlenborn, all from Tellabs, and Wes Underwood, Don Josephson, and Rich Komorouski of Wheaton College. All were accepted unanimously.

9. Discussion ensued as to ways of maintaining contact with former players. This is especially useful in bolstering alumni teams. Wes Underwood suggested a computer database with once a year post card reminders. Al Litvinas spoke poignantly about the need to maintain contact with players who have been involuntarily severed from their companies. In response, Jim Brotsos suggested the following proposal:

"To once a year publish a short note explaining the alumni program and include an address form for the benefit of those who wish to continue receiving the bulletin."

This proposal was accepted unanimously and will go into effect this year.

Len Augsburger also suggested that a notice be placed in the Illinois Chess Bulletin.

10. The issue of encouraging publication of play-off games was discussed. Irwin felt it would be desirable to see all of the play-off games published and proposed the use of USCF carbon-copy score sheets to facilitate this process. Wes countered that there are simply too many play-off games for any one individual to document. Considerable discussion ensued over the relative merits of having anonymous submission of games. In order, however, to encourage individual submission of play-off games, Wes offered the following proposal:

"To allow play-off games to be submitted in the following year's best games categories provided that they are published within the first two issues of the bulletin."

This motion was accepted unanimously and will go into effect this year. Thus last season's play-off games may be submitted this fall for prizes.

- 11. Tony then raised the possibility of reciprocal exchanges of tournament and informational advertising with other clubs and tournament directors. In general this has not been an issue and we have received free publicity at tournaments, but Tony felt he should have the ability to negotiate along these lines. No objection was raised to this suggestion.
- 12. Tony then enquired as to whether the league officers could use assistance with their functions. No requests for assistance were made.
- 13. With regards to speed chess ratings for new players (new to the Banquet speed chess tournaments), Tony suggested that they be allowed to enter with a rating up to 200 points different from their present CICL rating. Objections were raised to the implied ability to elect to enter with a lower rating. On another point, there were no objections to repeating the 8-man round robin format.
- 14. Documenting League history was the subject of some discussion. At present there is apparently no complete set of business meeting minutes. If older minutes can be located, they should go to the Secretary. Dan Kumro advised the group that he had a complete set of bulletins dating back to 1959 of which he would be willing to donate a portion. Irwin thought that at the very least a chronological listing of League presidents should be made.

- 15. Use of traditional banquet site, Harvey's Prime Rib in Westmont, was reviewed. Unhappiness over the quality of last year's service (too few servers) was voiced. However, it was pointed out that service has been better in the past, the food is very good for the price, and the restaurant is well located. It was suggested that the Banquet Director negotiate with Harvey's, when the time comes, to provide better service.
- 16. May 16, 1992 was accepted as the date of the final play-off rounds. This date conforms to the tradition of choosing the third Saturday in May.
- 17. April 18, 1992 will be the date of the next business meeting and by vote of preference it will take place at the Oak Park Village Hall.
- 18. A recommendation was made that the first bulletin of the season be published within the first two weeks of September
- 19. Irwin reluctantly pointed out that the Bell Labs Indians only supplied three boards in round 2 of last year's play-off. The shortage was accidental. However, according to our rules, Bell would be ineligible for this year's play-off. For the same reason the Exemplars are also ineligible. Irwin had hoped that an exception could be made. Tony, though, opined that in lack of an amendment to the contrary the rule would stand.
- 20. President Tony Jasaitis closed the meeting at 9:06pm.

Notes from the Treasurer

August, 1991

- 1) Of our \$2066.76 cash balance, 1400.00 has been reserved for the eventual purchase of a new computer (to maintain ratings). The remaining \$666.76 is available for use. If the proposed budget is accepted, a loss of \$103 for the upcoming season can easily be absorbed by this balance.
- 2) Bulletin costs are expected to be substantially higher this season than the last 3 seasons, because no company will be subsidizing copying costs.
- 3) Awards costs have been substantially higher during the past four years, based on a league meeting decision. However, it seems that with a decline in the number of teams, the support base for the awards is smaller. Thus I have proposed a cut in the awards budget for the 1991-1992 season.
- 4) The banquet is intended to be a break even event. However, it has generated funds for the CICL during 4 of the past 5 seasons. Thus I have budgeted \$50 in net revenue for this event this year.
- 5) Budgeted revenue from dues is based on 25 teams x \$33 = \$825.00. Budgeted revenue for the bulletin is based on 23 teams x \$14 = \$322.00.
- 6) I obtained a federal tax identification number for the CICL, to be used in association with the checking and savings account. The checking account is located at the Bank of Lincolnwood. The savings account is located at NBD Wheaton Bank.

1991 CICL SPEED CHESS TOURNAMENT

Following the CICL year end banquete, 34 players entered the annual CICL speed chess tournament. For the first time, this year's tournament was used to calcuate a speed chess rating. These ratings will be used in future CICL speed chess events. Current CICL tournament ratings were used as provisional ratings for this first event. Five round robin sections were played. The top section was won by Rueben Reyes with a score of 5.5 out of a possible 7.0. Other section winners were Rzeszutko, Goncharoff & Hill (tie), Kleinefelter & Motycka (tie), and Rujalski. Below are the results of the individual sections.

The 2 Squares Column

by Marv Cox.

If three squares are attacked more times than they are defended, they may fall.




Diagram 21 White to Play and Win

The three squares e8, g4, and h6 are attacked by a masked bishop, a queen, and black queen-total five. More attackers than defenders, The black knight on g4 is not a defender because it occupies g4. Ditto for the black pawn on h6. Note that the black queen is attempting to guard two of the three squares and so is overloaded. Ditto for the black bishop.

- 1. Qe8, Re8 (Obviously not Be8 or Qe8). The black rook is no longer a guard of e8 because it now occupies e8. So there are five attackers against the three squares and four defenders and is a simplification even though the white queen is gone.
- 2. fg4, Bg4. It is now reduced to a two-squares problem against e8 and h6 with four attackers and three defenders. A simplification.

- 3. Rh6, Rh6. Now three attackers and two defenders against the two squares e8 and g6.
- 4. Be8, Qe8. Now a one square problem with two attackers and one defender of g6. g6 falls. White wins.




Diagram 22 White to Play and Win

The h1-a8 diagonal and the a7-h7 row could be used to set up a see-saw against the black queen. A masked white bishop already occupies the diagonal. A white rook can use c7 as an entry to the a7-h7 row.

1. Rc7, Rc7; 2. Rc7, Qb8. White now controls both lines.
3. Rb7, Qa8 (not 3..., Qb7; 4. Nf6+ and the black queen falls). 4. Re7, Qb8; 5. Rb7, Qb8; 6. Rh7, Qb8; 7. Rb7, Qa8; 8. Nf6+, Rf6; 9. Rg7+, Kg7; 10. Ba8, Resigns.

Black could have given up his queen earlier with less ultimate loss of material but still with a badly lost game. However, this problem illustrates what devastation can be accomplished with a see-saw.




Diagram 23 White to Play and Win

The squares a6 and b7 are attacked twice but only guarded once, by the black queen. However, this potential two square position won't fall. So white includes h7 in the analysis to make it a three square problem. Also, if white can gain a tempo his rook on d1 can become an additional attacker against b7. Four attacks, two guards for a6, b7, h7.

- 1. Ra6, ba6 (gains the tempo.)
- 2. Rb1, Qc8 We now have a two square problem against b7 and h7. Three attackers and only two defenders, the black queen and king.
- 3. Bb7, Qb8; 4. Qh7+ (Be4 is inferior) 4. ..., Kh7 We're down to a swixh-en-zug

5. Be4, Resigns

CICL HAS STRONG SHOWING IN NATIONALOPEN


Even though the CICL was on break this summer, its members were not. Thirty-five CICL members participated in the 1991 National Open in Chicago last May.
