#### Kumro's Korner by Dan Kumro, League Historian

After an extended vacation, Kumro's Korner is back.

Five seasons ago, Bruce Mc Neil of Motorola was President as the 1987-88 season got underway. A new proposal by Wes Underwood for "Best" games was introduced at the summer business meeting and adopted by a convincingly favorable margin. This proposal brought forward 5 new individual awards.

Fifteen years ago (1977-78 season), we find that the AT&T Chargers won the league championship convincingly by defeating the following teams:

Zenith-Rauland 6-0 in the round. First National Bank 4-2 in the second round; and finally, Motorola 4-2.

In the season that just finished (1991-92), UOP won the League title by beating the AT&T Chargers 6-0; Fermi Lab 4-2; and CRT 5-1. This super finish gave UOP 15 game points and broke the Chargers fine performance of 14 points which was a record that stood for 14 years. So I guess records are made to be broken!!

A unique situation back in 1977-78 was that the playoffs were decided by using the Knockout System or winners play winners. Your team is eliminated if you end up losing any round along the way to the final match when only 2 teams would remain! (3-3 drawn matches were decided by a tie-breaking system). This system was only used for 3 years and was replaced by the current system in use at the present time.

## King's Gambit Accepted, Modern Variation

White: A. Jasaitis, CRT (2190) Black: D. Levine, Argonne (2398)

CICL Playoffs
Round 1, Board 1, May 11, 1992


Notes by Tony Jasaitis

This is an unusual King's Gambit in that Black assumes White's stereotyped role: sacrificing pawns and King's position for superior control of the center, a lead in development, and a Kingside attack.

1.e4, e5 2.f4, exf4 3.Nf3, d5. These days the King's Gambit is played for positional reasons, as good defenses have been found to the swashbuckling attacks of old. With this defense, Black strives for the same goals as White: quick development and many open lines. In fact, in the main line of this variation, Black is the one ready to sacrifice a pawn for the attack!

4.exd5, Nf6! 5.Bb5+. This is the main line, trying to either trade the doomed d-pawn, or to hinder Black's capture of it. Trying to keep the pawn gives Black a strong attack: 5.c4, c6! 6.dxc6, Nxc6 7.d4, Bg4 8.d5, Bxf3 9.Qxf3, Ne5 10.Qxf4, Bd6 5...c6! 6.dxc6, Nxc6 7.d4, Bd6

8.O-O, O-O 9.Nbd2!?



After 9.Nbd2!?

This is White's latest attempt to deal with Black's pressure. Straightforward attempts at development have shown

White's center to be vulnerable, and Black's P/f4 to be a hindrance to White's development. The ironic point of the P is that it is a problem to White whether or not it is there; Black has won a number of nice games by sacrificing the pawn at the right time, activating his pieces on the b8-h2 diagonal. Master practice finds Black getting a good game after 9.Nc3, Qb6!, or 9.c3, Nd5!

Knowing that my oppponent has played the Modern Variation and beat Morris Giles (2500) with it, I studied it for three whole weeks prior to this game. The text move attempts to address White's problems by attacking Black's dangerous B, and/or to block some of its power by eventual Ne5. The game Glaskov-Simicyn, USSR 1972 continued 9...Bg4 10.Nc4. Bc7 11.Bxc6, bxc6 12.Qd3, Qd5 at which point Korchnoi claims that 13.Nfe5 would give White an advantage. However, White's position is somewhat loose, and it took me two weeks with the help of a computer to be convinced of the advantage.


Both of us played our moves quickly up to this point, but now my opponent thought about 20 minutes. I wondered if he would find the improvement for Black that I thought I had found during my study of this position?

9... Bc7!! Rats! I was impressed. This guy's not rated 2400 for nothing. He found in 20 minutes what took me several weeks! Now we're both on our own, since I had not figured out a good way to meet this move which i hoped wouldn't happen. Since Black will have to move the B anyway, he moves it immediately to increase the pressure on White's center, and White's hinderina development further. He also discourages 10.Nc4: Qd5! 11.Bxc6. Qxc4 12.Ne5, Bxe5 13.dxe5, Qc5+! 14.Kh1, Ng4 10.c3, Bg4 11.Qa4, Ne7!?

Black causes White's Q-side to bite on thin air; White's few developed pieces will be kicked back by pawns gaining Q-side space; the N will be strong at d5; and White will have to give up on developing the N at c4.

However, the plan does force White's pieces to the dangerous b1-h7 diagonal, which in the game helps White to reduce the bind. Another interesting idea is 11... Qd5!? 12.c4, Qh5! offering a pawn for an awesome lead in development.

12.Ne5!, a6 13.Bd3, b5 14.Qc2, Ned5 15.Ne4 Bh5!!??



After 15.Ne4, Bh5!!??


Black does not want to go on the defensive, and hatches a daring plan to keep the attack going.

16.Nxf6+ Taking the often-poisoned pawn at f4 was too complicated to figure out at the board, so I rejected it on principle: 16.Bxf4, Nxf4 (or even Ng4 immediately) 17.Rxf4, Ng4 or Nd5 all give Black a lot of play and plenty of room for White to go wrong.

16... gxf6 17.Bxh7+, Kg7 18.Nf3, Rh8. Black relies on his still-superior development to offset his shattered K-side and to actually attack with it. To this goal, Black should force White to mobilize Black's pawns with 18... Bg6. Black does this one move later, when White is not forced to trade.

19.Be4, Bg6 20.Re1, Rh5 21.a4, b4!? Black could simply move his R, ignoring the meager activity of White's, and maintaining the bind better. Instead, he chooses the most aggressive continuation, illustrating one of the ways that Black can sacrifice his P for a strong attack in this opening.

22.c4, Ne3l 23.Bxe3, fxe3 24.Rxe3 On 24.g3, the exchange sac f5! 25.Bxa8, Qxa8 followed by f4 breaks up White's position. I thought he sacced the pawn for 24... Bxh2+25.Nxh2, Qxd4 which fails to 26.Qd3. But he finds a refinement on the idea.



After 24...Bf4!

24...Bf4! 25.Re2, Qc7? At this point Black had only about 10 minutes left. 25...Bxh2+! works now: 26.Nxh2?, Qd4+ winning back at least his piece. White may still be better by not taking the B, but Black would have practical chances. Now he gets driven back fast.

26.g3, Bd6 27.c5, Bf8 28.Qc4, Rd8 29.Qxa6, Rxd4. A last ditch attempt in time pressure to try to make something of the pin potential in the position.

30.Nxd4, Bxc5 31.Qc4, Qa7 32.Rd1, Re5 33.Bf3, Rxe2 34.Bxe2, Be4 35.Kf1, Ba8 36.Nf5+,Kg6 37.Qg4+, resigns.

#### Ratings Chairman's Report

At the beginning of the new season, I would like to remind team captains of some procedures that will allow timely, accurate rating of your matches:

- (1) BOTH captains should mail me the match results; that way I'll be sure to get them. Please mail results rather than faxing them, except for the last week prior to a publication deadline. For the next issue of the Bulletin, fax results to me in the first week of December only; U.S. Mail will be sufficient prior to then.
- (2) Please include the first initial of each player as well as the last name on the results sheet. If a new player has a commonly occurring name (Jones, Smith, etc.) it would be helpful to given the full first name or middle initial as well, in order to clearly distinguish the player from others in the rating data base.
- (3) If matches are played out of the order given in the Division playing schedule, please indicate on the results sheet which earlier match or matches have not yet been played.
- (4) When a new player plays his/her first match, please indicate if that player has a USCF rating, either current or in the past. Please indicate the value of the rating, if it is known. If the player has never had a rating, please indicate UNR next to the player's name. If the new player was active in the past in the CICL but has not played in the last ten years, or if he/she last played for a different team, please indicate that also. These measures will help me locate the previous rating records for the player.

# The 2 Squares Columns

"If two (or more) squares are attacked more time than they are defended they may fall."




Diagram 50

A focal point in chess is the intersection of two lines, either attacking or defending. In diagram 50 a line runs from c7 to h2 to defend the rook. Another line runs from a5 to g5 to defend the knight. The focal point of these defending lines is e5. If e5 is blocked, Black has a choice of which line he will lose.

- 1. e5. Black's h2 rook and g5 knight are now attacked and undefended.
- 1...., Rxe5. Threatens a swish-en-zuq.
- 2. Kxh2, Rb5+ 3. Kh1, Rxb1. White has won a piece. Now let's go back to a different first move for Black.
- 1. e5, Bxe5. Again threatens a swish-en-zug.
- 2. Bxg5, Rh7 3. Bd2. Again White has won a minor piece for a pawn. There are other variations Black can follow but all give White a piece for a pawn. White must be quite careful because the very nature of blocking a focal point gives his opponent a free attacking move after he has grabbed the piece.



The intersection of two lines is a focal point. The white queen and the black king are on a diagonal line. The white bishop and the black queen are on another diagonal line. The focal point of the two diagonals is e5. Removal of the pawn from e5 is the aim of White's tactics.

1. Nxb6, axb6 2.Rxg6, hxg6 3.Bxe6+. Of course in an actual game Black could refuse to accept either sacrifice and so give up the b6 pawn in order to avoid the bishop fork on e5.



I had the white pieces in diagram 52 above and my uncle had black. I was a pawn up and my game seemed solid so I was quite willing to pursue any exchanges.

- 1...., Bxh4. Why did he want to trade bishops? That just put another quard on my center pawn.
- 2. Qxh4, Nxd3. What was he up to?
- 3. Rxd3, Rxc3. And this time the sacrifice of the exchange. Horrors! I couldn't capture his rook. If I did he would take my e4 pawn with his other rook and win my queen. He's won a piece from me! His first trade moved my queen so e4 became a focal point of the file which contained my king and the row which contained my queen. Then he removed my guards of the focal point.

Diagram 52 could also be looked at as a four-square problem. Squares c3, d3, e4 and h4 were attacked by five black pieces, namely the knight, two rooks and two bishops. White has only three guards, the queen, rook and b2 pawn. The white knight and two bishops are not counted as guards because they occupy some of the squares under attack. Five attackers, three defenders, the squares may fall.
