To All League Officers, Team Captains, and Players:

Welcome to the 1992-93 CICL season! The turnout at the Fall Business Meeting was very encouraging. Quite a few changes took place. While I encourage you to read the minutes of the meeting, I would like to highlight a couple of points that will affect many of us.

- 1) Probably the most notable change is that Alumni teams are now full status teams, eligible for the playoffs and regular trophies.
- 2) In the playoffs, if a board is forfeited, all boards below that board will also be forfeited.
- 3) To maximize league activity, a second-tier playoff has been added ("Reserve Section"); teams that finish 3rd and 4th in their division will qualify for this playoff, with a trophy awarded to the top team. Although we did not discuss it explicitly, I assume that all playoff rules and conventions will apply to this playoff as well. Any reasonable exceptions should be brought to my attention. A second playoff director would be a good idea. Volunteers?
- 4) The assembly's consensus was that the division chairmen should send a copy of their captain list to the bulletin editor for publication; they should also submit their local newsletters for publication as well. Elsewhere in this bulletin I have showcased a copy of the monthly status report that Reuben Reyes produced for the the East Division. I found his team and individual cross-tables interesting and valuable throughout the season. I would encourage the division chairmen to produce something of this nature, even though they may not have the means to create something as professional-looking. Volunteers interested in assisting their chairman in producing such a product should come forward, as Reuben did last season.
- 5) Welcome to our two new teams in the East Division, both from the Chicago Transit Authority!

#### A number of reminders:

- 1) In addition to sending a copy of the match result sheet to the Division Chairman, a copy must be sent to the Ratings Chairman. See the Officer List for addresses.
- 2) Last season's playoff games are eligible for this season's awards, provided they are published by the second bulletin. Publication of regular-season games improved last season, but where are all the playoff games?? Remember

that games may be submitted anonymously, but they are not eligible for awards.

- 3) Please use our annual Alumni File form for any players who have departed that would like to stay in touch.
- 4) Please send in your team dues and/or subscriptions promptly (a form is provided in this bulletin). Last year's subscribers will not receive any further bulletins until payment is received.
- 5) Start thinking about the U. S. Amateur Team Championsip, which will be held in the Chicago area next year, President's Day weekend. See my pre-season mailing for more information.
- 6) "Playoff Saturday" is scheduled for May 15. We should allow three weeks for the first round of the playoffs. Therefore, divison chairmen should set their schedules such that their regular season ends no later than April 23, and preferrably April 16 to allow for the unlikely event of a tie that cannot be broken by our extensive tie-breaking rules.

Well, that should be enough information to kick off the season. Gentlemen, start your pawns!

#### **Minutes**

- 1. President Tony Jasaitis called the meeting to order at 7:09 PM.
- 2. The minutes of the Spring business meeting were accepted without revision.
- 3. Wes Underwood gave the Treasurer's report and distributed an accompanying document. Wes noted a net gain for the 1991-92 season of \$278.87 and this was attributed to lower than expected bulletin and banquet costs. For the 1992-93 season he proposed a budget along similar lines as the previous season's. Fees will remain unchanged from last year.

Jim Brotsos questioned whether there would indeed be 26 teams in the League as was assumed in the proposed budget. Wes suggested that the budget could be amended at a later point if we end up with fewer than the projected 26 teams.

A question arose as to whether the \$6 charged for additional bulletin subscriptions was sufficient to cover costs. After input from bulletin editor Jim Hodina it was decided that the cost was reasonable.

The Treasurer's report was accepted without modification by unanimous vote.

4. The following League positions were appointed:

Bulletin Editor Jim Hodina
Ratings Chairman Charlie Ward
Banquet Chairman Satish Kale
Playoff TD Satish Kale
Trophy Chairman Bob Stoltz
Publicity Director Tony Jasaitis

Duane Satterlee will also help out in the publicity department.

The question of division chairmen was deferred pending a discussion of a possible merger of the Near West and Far West divisions.

- 5. There was no old business.
- 6. By way of new business it was noted that Sears is moving from the East division to the North division. This reflects the company move to the Hoffman Estates area.

Also, the Bell Labs Indians will not participate in the League this year as they have been adversely impacted by a force reduction.

- 7. Abe Wilson of the Chicago Transit Authority spoke about chess activity within the CTA and interest in participating in the CICL. Their home site would be at the Merchandise Mart. Based on a potential roster of 18 players, Abe was encouraged to enter two teams an "A" and "B" team in the East Division. Charlie Ward explained the rules governing multiple company teams. Some concern was expressed over the ability to contact CTA team captains. Abe indicated that he would be responsible for this. The admission of the CTA "A" and "B" teams was then unanimously approved.
- 8. The question of a possible merger of the Near West and Far West teams was raised. This had assumed importance with the loss of the Bell Labs Indians, which left the Far West Division with only three teams. Irwin Gaines and Bob Stoltz argued against the merger noting that it would be nice to preserve the identity of the Far West division and that geographic factors long travel distances militated against the move. One of the arguments in favor of merging the two divisions was that it would leave the unified division with a comparable number of teams relative to the North and East divisions. However, it was also pointed out that the North Division may end with as few as six team. In the end it was agreed that the two remaining Bell teams -

the Dragons and the Royals - would move to the Far West division. This would leave 5 teams in the Near West and 5 in the Far West and keep travel distances within both divisions to a minimum. Questions regarding a broader realignment of the League will be considered at a later date.

9. The question of a revised status for alumni teams was raised. Al Litvinas had proposed a rule change at the Spring business meeting which would have ended the distinction between alumni teams and regular teams with regards to the playoffs. At the time Tony had formed a committee consisting of J. Brotsos, I. Gaines, A. Litvinas, R. Stoltz, and F. Suerth to consider the general issue of alumni teams.

Irwin Gaines argued that alumni teams should be treated equally (with regards to the playoffs) on the grounds that an alumni team could unfairly affect the standings within a division by not turning out in force for a critical game. He also observed that some of the more complicated suggestions regarding handicapping of alumni teams would be difficult to implement and subject to counter strategies.

Bob Stoltz spoke in favor of full status for alumni teams noting that his primary interest in the League was "to play chess and to have fun" and he looked forward to playing very strong alumni teams, should they arise.

Jim Brotsos noted that the concern expressed in the early days of the alumni teams - that they may come to dominate the League - has probably been mitigated by the new rule which permits players to play for their former companies.

Finally, a proposal to treat the alumni teams exactly the same as regular teams with regards to the playoffs was accepted unanimously with one abstention. There is no time limit associated with revision.

10. In order to increase interest and participation in the finals, Irwin Gaines proposed a playoff competition which would consist of the 3rd and 4th place finishers in all four divisions. This competition would take place in parallel with the traditional (first and second place) format. Presumably the Playoff Director would oversee both tourneys and a common playoff site would be used for the concluding rounds.

This proposal was accepted unanimously.

11. Bob Stoltz and Tony Jasaitis entered the following proposal:

"In a playoff match, after the grace period [if any] has expired for an absent player, the opposing team captain may require that a team move its board assignments upward to fill the gap in the lineup, with forfeits recorded on the bottom boards(s). Alternately, the team captain of the absent player may elect to not shift board assignments, but if the absent player indeed forfeits the game, all boards below him will also be recorded as forfeits."

This proposal was also accepted unanimously. It was noted that the new rule applies only to playoff games, where an unintended forfeiture is extremely unlikely.

12. A proposal to create an award for the most improved team was submitted by Tony:

"An award will be given to the team in the league which shows the greatest increase in its percentage record, and had a negative record in the prior season, and does not make the playoffs in the current season. Alumni teams are eligible for this award."

After some discussion the proposal was withdrawn.

13. A proposal to continue, at cost to the Treasury, the tradition begun by Russ Rzeszutko in awarding the Outstanding Team Captains in each division was submitted by Tony. This proposal was accepted by the following vote:

11	In favor
2	Opposed
1	Abstaining

The proposal also specifies that the awards be in the form of certificates.

- 14. The general issue of recognition for people serving the League was thrashed out. Tony was concerned by the uncodified way in which the Banquet Chairman, Tournament Director, and Trophy Chairman have come to receive free admission to the end of season banquet. A clear majority expressed the opinion, through a plebiscite, that these practices were sound.
- 15. The issue of dealing with questionable players was raised. Apparently there had been a single incident in which a player's identity was questioned and the player was unable or unwilling to provide identification. Charlie Ward stressed that there is already a procedure for dealing with this and other problems to officially protest a match and he cautioned against raising questions well after the fact.
- 16. Tony noted that the U. S. Amateur Team Championship will take place in Chicago early next year!
- 17. The question of insurance, motivated by J. I. Case's initial stance last year, was revisited. Tony related advice from the USCF's legal counsel which suggested that our first choice in such matters should be to avoid paying for insurance. If pressed, we should make the case that playing chess is an inherently low risk activity and that the League does not have a history of any incidents. This still leaves the case in which the League may be forced to acquire single event insurance in order to use a particular match site. Based on his own research, Tony felt that the premium for such an activity may run around \$500, and that this was prohibitive.

18. Jim Hodina requested permission to revise one of the five "best" game prize categories - to drop the best all-around game and include a best annotated game award. He felt this would encourage the submission of annotated games; this would make his task easier. After some discussion the consensus was that the award categories should be up to the discretion of the Bulletin Editor (presently Jim) with the sole proviso that the rules be set for the season and published in the first bulletin. Jim was complimented on publishing running tallies on submissions to the various prize categories.

Jim also requested that the Division chairmen send him updates on a monthly or bimonthly basis throughout the regular season.

Charlie Ward also asked for the Division chairmen to send him a list of teams and team captains at the beginning of the season.

Charlie also stressed that the goal should be for each League team to participate in 10 regular season matches.

19. Tony then announced the following important dates:

April 7 Spring Business meeting May 15 Final playoff rounds June 11 Banquet

20. The meeting was adjourned at 9:49 PM.


White jettisons a pawn and opens a huge lead in development, sprinting to the finish line after Black drops the pace.

1.e4, c5 2.d4, cxd4 3.c3, dxc3 4.Nxc3, d6 5.Bc4, e6 6.Nf3, a6 7.O-O, b5 8.Bb3, Bb7 9.Qe2, Nc6 10.Rd1, Rc8?! Black is neglecting King-side development and his Queen feels heat from the enemy Rook. Side-stepping by 10...Qc7 (and preparing a direct Rd8) is better.

11.Bf4 More speculative is 11.e5, d5 (...Qc7? 12.Nd5!) 12.Bxd5, exd5 13.Nxd5, Qa5 14.Be3. At game time it seemed wiser to develop with initiative. The chosen move not only piles pressure on d6, but also vacates c1 for the other Rook.

11...Qc7 12.Rac1, Rd8 With a static King side and with the Queen in harm's way, Black does not have the luxury of moving the Rook a second time. 12...Be7 providing King shelter and a promise of castling is better.

13.Qe3!



After 13.Qe3!


A move that works overtime. The Queen now watches b6, mutually

guards the f4 Bishop, encourages Nd5 and prepares a King side commute. I thought long and hard about 13.Nd5, but the simple reply 13...Qb8 didn't seem to buy White much. If 13...exd5 instead, Black has plenty of problems after 14.exd5+, Qe7 15.Qd2, Ne5 16.Nxe5, dxe5 17.Bxe5.



## The 2 Squares Columns

"If two (or more) squares are attacked more time than they are defended they may fall."



My uncle having the black pieces in diagram 45 moved his bishop from e6 to g4. Did he really expect me to take the f7 pawn with my bishop and then he would win the exchange from me after moving his king to f8? My mama ain't raised no stupids, no how. But suppose I take the f7 pawn with my rook. He'll take my bishop on b3 with his rook so as to come out a bishop ahead after the rook wexchange. My rook is now sentenced to death (a renegade). But I can fox my uncle by having the renegade rook take the black knight with it to chess heaven. I would be a pawn ahead after the rook exchange. I'll get him this time!

1..., Bg4 2. Rxf7, Rxb3. Going as expected.

3.Rxd7, Rxg3+. What??
And I've lost a minor piece for the pawn I've gained. He did it to me again! I hadn't taken into account that his rook had also become a renegade and woulod take one of my pieces with it when it expired.



The idea of a renegade chess piece was expounded a long, long time age. In as much as it can be a tactical weapon I'll show a bare bones example in diagram 46. It is White's move. Black is attacking a bishop on f3. The square d2 is attacked once by Black and defended once by Black and defended once by Black and defended once by White. White can fork the rooks with his pawn.

1. e5. White expects to gain the exchange after Rxf3 and exd6. However, his move was faulty because the black rook on d6 is condemned to death. It is a renegade on the loose and will take whatever it can with it to the graveyard.

1.Rxd2+. The renegade strikes! 2.Kxd2, Rxf3. And white has lost two bishops for a rook.

Incidentally, this was an example of the Two-Squares thory. The two squares d2 and f3 were attacked twice and guarded only once, so might fall. A renegade piece is generally effective if at time it makes the capture it also does one of the follwoing: 1. Check or threaten mate; 2. Attack a valuable piece; 3. Threaten to help a pawn queen.
